The AKC is committed to creating a safe and respectful sport environment for all. If you need to talk to someone, or need help, please call 800. 656.HOPE (National Sexual Assault Hotline) or text HOME to 741-741 for free, 24/7, confidential services from trained crisis counselors.

It is expressly understood that exhibitors alone are responsible for the behavior of their dogs and/or children. Any exhibitor whose dogs and/or children create an unnecessary disturbance or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior may, at the discretion of the trial committee, be asked to leave the show site. In such case, no refund of any fees paid will be made. Monterey Bay Area Scent Work Club, Inc. and its agents, employees, etc., will assume no responsibilities for any loss, damage or injury sustained by exhibitors or handlers, or to any of their dogs or property and further assumes no responsibility for injury to children.

Monterey Bay Area Scent Work Club, Inc. reserves the right to decline entries for cause and may remove any dog on account of aggression. No one shall have any recourse or claim against Monterey Bay Area Scent Work Club, Inc. or any official thereof.

Due to some damage of property and equipment AKC's policy is that participants reimburse clubs for any damage their dog does, in and out of a search area. This includes damage to the buried boxes. Judges will now inform the club of any dog that damages a buried box or any other items, excluding cardboard boxes only, at this time. Exhibitors will reimburse the club for damages.

This venue is very spread out. Competitors will be required to walk long distances and navigate steps. The venue is compliant with ADD requirements.

Collars, Leashes and Harnesses. During searches, dogs must wear a properly fitted collar or harness approved by the judge. Pinch collar, Electric collar, and any other collar not allowed by AKC regulations are not allowed on the grounds. Leashes may be of any length and/or retractable. The leash should be made of plain, pliable material. A wearable camera such as a Go Pro may be mounted to the dog's harness, if desired. Videoring of any search area may not be posted to Social Media without permission. Video is for personal use only.

All dogs must be on leash at all times, and retractable leashes may not be used when on trial grounds (except during judged searches). Dogs must enter and exit the search area with the leash attached to the collar or harness, including when waiting in the search area before and after the search. An off-leash option may be offered at the discretion of the judge.

Judges are not required to wait for dogs. The Owner of each dog is solely responsible for having it ready at the search area when it is to be judged. The Club has no responsibility to provide service through a public address system or stewards or runners for the purpose of calling or locating dogs that are not brought into the ring when required.

Exhibitors are responsible for cleaning up after their dog(s). Any exhibitor failing to do so may be excused without benefit of refund if the Event Committee deems the exhibitor to be in violation of this requirement.

Dogs must not be allowed to urinate on any manmade item or landscaping at this venue. Any exhibitor failing this requirement will be excused without benefit of refund if the Event Committee deems the exhibitor to be in violation of this requirement.

Dogs Eligible to Enter

This trial is open to all dogs six (6) months of age or older that are registered with the American Kennel Club or that have AKC Limited Registration, Purebred Alternative Listing/Indefinite Listing Privileges (PAL/ILP), an AKC Canine Partners listing number or approved Foundation Stock Service (FSS) breeds are eligible to participate. Dogs with a Purebred Alternative Listing/Indefinite Listing Privileges (PAL/ILP) or an AKC Canine Partners listing number must be spayed or neutered in order to compete. Wherever the word "dog" is used in these regulations it includes both sexes.

Condition of the Dog

Dogs with physical challenges (including amputees) are eligible to participate provided that, in the opinion of the judge, they display no signs of physical discomfort and can safely complete the search. Dogs with bandages, sutures, or visible wounds are not eligible. Deaf dogs and blind dogs are allowed to enter. Dogs that are both deaf and blind are able to participate so long as the handler is in control of the dog at all times, the dog can complete the requirements of the class, and the dog does not appear to be under undue stress in the opinion of the judge.

Exhibitors should follow their veterinarian's recommendation to assure their dogs are free of internal and external parasites, any communicable diseases, and have appropriate vaccinations.

Entry Fees Per Dog Includes a \$4.50 AKC Recording Fee

ENTRIES RECEIVED BEFORE OPENING DATE WILL BE RETURNED!

No entries will be accepted by phone, or fax. Express mail entries must include the signature waiver allowing them to be left at the secretary's address. Inquiries may be directed to Teresa Locatelli, at mbaswctrtrial@gmail.com. No entry shall be made, and no entry shall be accepted which specifies any conditions as to its acceptance.

Illegible entries will not be processed and will be returned to the exhibitor. Returned checks do not constitute a valid entry. The Trial Secretary will add a \$35.00 collection fee to the amount of each returned check.

No entry fee will be refunded if the trial cannot open or be completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, an act of God, public emergency, act of a public enemy, or any other cause beyond the control of the organizing committee. No entry fee will be refunded in the event a dog is absent, disqualified, excused, or barred from competition by the action of the Trial Committee.

Dogs pulled after closing because of injury or other medical condition are eligible for a 50% refund. Owner must provide a note from their veterinarian no later than 24 hours before each trial starts.

Bitches in season will be refunded the full entry fee. Notification in writing must be given to the trial secretary no later than one half hour prior to the start of the first class of the day.

All entry fee refunds will be issued via Zelle, an electronic banking system. The credit must be completed with 14 days of Zelle notification to recipient or refund will be void. No further refund will be granted.

STAGING AREA, HANDLER'S BRIEFING, AND WARM UP AREA

Level order will be determined after closing.

A preliminary confirmation will be sent once your entry is received. A final confirmation with trial details will be sent after entries close. Please add info@mbasw.org so communications will not go to your spam or promotions email folder.

Exhibitors must check-in prior to their briefing. No dogs are allowed at Information and Secretary Tables. Set-up and check-in times will be determined after closing.

Crating: You will be crating from your car. Monterey Bay Charter School and MBASWC, Inc. will not be responsible, for any lost or damaged items left at the show site. No set ups to be left overnight. There will be no overnight security. Staging Area will be out of view of search area(s). Staging area will include warm-up and waiting area, as well as the secretary table.

Check in times will be sent via email. Run order will be communicated via Agility Gate, subject to change, the day before the trial. Results will be made available at trial, posted electronically on MBASWC.org and emailed on the trial date, to each participant.

The handler briefing may be done collectively or individually just prior to search.

During the Handler's Briefing the judge will explain if there's an off-leash option, number of hides, maximum height of hides and maximum time for the search.

One labelled container per target odor being used in the trial on that day will be placed in the warm-up area. This will allow handler-dog teams to prepare themselves for the search prior to their run. Each team should limit their warm-up to two minutes or less so that others may be able to use the warm-up area as well. Clubs may also place blank containers in the warm-up area if they choose.

Possession of Odors and Training. Chapter 5, Section 35 of the Scent Work Regulations state "No person other than those engaged in the administration of a trial shall be in possession of any target odor when on the trial grounds. There shall be no training on the grounds of the AKC Scent Work trial, other than the designated warm-up area"

It is not appropriate to scout the trial location prior to the trial date. Many search locations are real-life environments, and such visits may risk the host losing the opportunity to use the location in the future.

WAIT LIST

The Monterey Bay Area Scent Work Club, Inc. is offering a wait list to fill openings created by withdrawn entries after the trial's closing date/time. A maximum of 5 entries will be placed on the wait list for each level and kept until February 10, 2025. After that date canceled entries will not be filled from the wait list.

All entries, including wait listed entries, must be received by the Trial Secretary prior to the closing date. No entries may be withdrawn with a refund after the closing date unless it is replaced by a wait listed entry. Only then, will a full refund be issued for the withdrawn entry. Any wait listed entry that does not move off the wait list into the trial will receive a full refund.

New Title Ribbons will be available to teams finishing a title at these trials.

High in Trial

High in Trial Ribbons will be offered at these trials.

Only teams who participate and qualify, in the same difficulty level of all elements offered for that level (Container, Interior, Exterior, and Buried) are eligible for High in Trial. Handler Discrimination is NOT included in HIT. There is no separate High in Trial for the Novice A and Novice B sections; they are combined.

The High in Trial is determined by adding the team's faults across the elements.

If there is a tie based on faults, then the team's times will be summed, and the faster finishing team will win.

High Combined Division

High Combined Division Ribbons will be offered at these trials.

Only teams who participate in the same difficulty level, in all elements plus Handler Discrimination, and qualify in each, are eligible to win High Combined Division.

The High Combined Division award is determined by adding a team's faults across all classes.

The team with the fewest faults will be declared the winner of the High Combined Division.

If there is a tie based on faults, then the teams' times across the classes will be summed, and the faster-finishing team will win.

If there is a tie after considering both faults and time, a coin-flip will determine the High Combined Division winner.

There shall be one High Combined Division winner for each difficulty level offered.

The High Combined Division award is not recorded by the AKC.

The Novice B class is for dogs who have earned a title in that element (in AKC or in another organization), for Scent Work Judges and handlers who have worked as professional detection dog handlers. The exhibitor is responsible for entering the dog in the correct class(es). Failure to do so will result in the cancellation of qualifying scores.

NOTE: Dogs may enter up to two different difficulty levels of each element at the same trial, if they are eligible to enter each level. Examples: Dogs may enter Novice B Container and Advanced Container – they must have earned the Novice Container Title.
