How to Grow

When to Plant: Direct sow after last frost when soil is warm.

Location: Full sun with trellis or fence for support.

Spacing: Thin seedlings to 12 inches apart.

Watering: Moderate; allow soil to dry slightly between waterings.

Fertilizer: Minimal; too much fertilizer results in lush leaves with fewer flowers.

Tips for Success

Nick or soak seeds overnight to improve germination.

Provide a sturdy trellis or support.

Encourages hummingbirds and butterflies.

Deadhead to extend blooming season.

Cardinal Climber is a hybrid between cypress vine and morning glory, combining feathery foliage with vibrant red blooms.

Companion Planting

Pairs well with morning glories for a mix of colors. Avoid planting near delicate crops as it may overshadow them.

Harvesting and Use

Primarily ornamental; collect seeds in fall when pods are dry for next year's planting.

Quick Planting Checklist

- Soak or nick seeds before planting
- Sow after last frost
- Provide trellis or support
- Thin seedlings to 12 inches apart
- Attracts hummingbirds and butterflies
