ZONING

Zoning Inspector Paul Tucker is available by appointment for your zoning permits, exemptions, conditional use permits and variances. He may be reached by calling the township offices at 636-5486 ext. 3. Please leave a message and he will return your call.

Please be advised zoning permits are required for all your building projects

Even agricultural buildings need a permit. Some may be exempt from fees but still require you to submit an application. The township doesn't know what you are constructing if an application is not submitted.

CEMETERY

Maintenance will be cleaning the cemetery and preparing it for Memorial Day. If you have any items you wish to keep please remove them. All old wreaths and unsightly items left at the graveside will be discarded.

No plantings are permitted. Artificial flowers or ornaments are permitted on the graves until they become weather beaten. The Township is not responsible for damage or theft of such items and may remove them if they become unsightly.

ROAD WORKS

Crews will continue work on all township roads. Dust control will be applied where needed later this summer. We ask our Amish community to limit the use of horses and buggies while the application cures, as horses' shoes can damage the fresh surface. Please follow posted speed signs and slow down near rough areas. During dusty times, watch for pedestrians and slow-moving vehicles.

Last summer, major improvements were completed on East Pioneer Road to improve safety for road users. The Huntsburg Township section of Bundysburg Road was repaved. Dust control with added stone was applied to several roads.

Residents are responsible for keeping their drive pipes clean and free of debris. Please clear the pipes to keep ditches flowing. Dumping unwanted items on township roads is illegal.

FROM THE FIRE DEPARTMENT

Let's talk about preventing lawn mower and other outdoor equipment fires. Most equipment fires can be attributed to one of three causes: Fueling hot equipment, failure to clean the equipment after use, and failure to maintain the equipment properly. Let's talk about each cause.

Fueling hot equipment: Fueling equipment before it has had time to properly cool after use is a common fire cause, and brings with it significant risk for severe burn injuries as well. Fires can occur when fuel is spilled on hot surfaces during fueling, but the vapors themselves can reach an ignition source even without spilling. Some safe practices include always using approved containers for flammable liquids, fueling equipment outside and away from structures, and allowing hot equipment to cool before fueling.

Failure to clean the equipment after use: We all know that mowers accumulate leaves and grass clippings during use. Buildup of this material can come into contact with hot surfaces and ignite during use, or even after being parked after use. This can cause not only an equipment fire, but can threaten the building the equipment is stored in as well. After each use, we recommend parking away from buildings and using a leaf blower or garden hose to remove all built-up materials from the mower deck and engine areas. Store equipment in buildings only after allowing time to cool.

Lastly, failing to properly maintain the equipment can cause fires due to heating of pulleys, bearings, and other moving parts. As we talked about above, be sure to keep equipment clean and follow manufacturers recommendations for maintenance.

Be sure to always follow all manufacturers guidance for any equipment.

Things most people think they can recycle but CAN'T!

Take out food containers, Plastic Toys, Shelves, Plastic clamshell (fruit container) and tubs (butter and yogurt tubs), Milk, juice and ice cream cartons, plastic bags, electronics, furniture Pizza Boxes and Styrofoam. If it is made of plastic or glass that does not make it recyclable.
