Available roles and skills

- Race officer club/state/national RO qualification through Australian Sailing
 - **Results Scribe** legible handwriting, basic knowledge of Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS) for the start
 - Timekeeper basic knowledge of RRS for start, good concentration/situational awareness and clear voice
 - **Boat Spotter** basic knowledge of RRS for start, good concentration and loud clear voice
 - Flag Raisers basic knowledge of RRS for start, good concentration
 - **Boat Drivers** Marine license and powerboat handling certificate
- Land officer Marine radio certificate of proficiency (SROCP or higher)
- **Results Processing** Ability to process race results through software Top Yacht



Typical Start boat crew

- Race Officer (RO)
- Time, Sound, scribe (start)
- Flags scribe (finish)
- Boat driver (often also one of above)





Example of how to run a start

- Arrive at club 1.5 hours prior to start
- Start 30 minutes
 - Boat on station, recording starting boats prior to 10-minute mark
- Start 10 minutes
 - Final Preparations and have followed checklist procedure.
 - "On station" pennant flying (Orange)
- Start 5 minutes
 - Class or Division Flag raised with sound signal
- Start 4 minutes
 - P Flag raised with sound signal
- Start 1 minute
 - P Flag (Blue with white square) lowered with sound signal
- Start
 - Class or Division Flag lowered with sound signal




Common Issues

- Problems at the Start wind shift, timing error, incorrect signal etc.
- A small number of boats over the line before the start
- Large proportion of the fleet over the line before the start
- Missing Mark




Problem at the Start

Postponement Signals





AP Races not started are *postponed*. The warning signal will be made 1 minute after removal unless at that time the race is *postponed* again or *abandoned*.




AP over H Races not started are *postponed*. Further signals ashore. **AP over A** Races not started are *postponed*. No more racing today.


27.3 Before the starting signal, the race committee may for any reason *postpone* (display flag AP, AP over H, or AP over A, with two sounds) or *abandon* the race (display flag N over H, or N over A, with three sounds).



Boats Over the Line







First Substitute General recall. The warning signal will be made 1 minute after removal.

Individual Recall

When at a boat's starting signal any part of her hull is on the course side of the starting line or she must comply with <u>rule</u> <u>30.1</u>, the race committee shall promptly display flag X with one sound. The flag shall be displayed until the hull of each such boat has been completely on the pre-start side of the starting line or one of its extensions, and until all such boats have complied with <u>rule 30.1</u> if it applies, but no later than four minutes after the starting signal or one minute before any later

General Recall

When at the starting signal the race committee is unable to identify boats that are on the course side of the starting line or to which <u>rule 30</u> applies, or there has been an error in the starting procedure, the race committee may signal a general recall (display the First Substitute with two sounds). The warning signal for a new start for the recalled class shall be made one minute after the First Substitute is removed (one sound), and the starts for any succeeding classes shall follow the new start.




Practical
