## The Abilities of the Church under Orders

Ephesians 4:7-11

<u>Introduction</u>: Previously in this 4th chapter of Ephesians we have considered the aim of the church under orders, the appearance (or attributes) of the church under orders, & the anchor (or articles of faith) of the church under orders. We noted in the past that the unity of the Spirit centers around 7 truths: one body, one Spirit, one hope, one Lord, one faith, one baptism, & one God. Without these truths, there can be no true unity. Notice with me over the next 2 weeks the abilities of the church under orders. Consider the giving of the gifts, the Giver of the gifts, & the gifts of the Giver.

# I. The Giving of the Gifts (:7)

- A. The definition of grace (literally, "the grace")
  - 1. "<u>Charis</u>" (grace) unmerited favor; the privilege of a special calling in the service of God
  - 2. The spiritual gifts are the result of God's grace & mercy bestowed upon man.
- B. The distribution of grace:
  - 1. "To all"
    - a. No one has all the gifts (I Corinthians 12:7-11).
    - b. No one is without some gift (Romans 12:3; I Corinthians 12:7; I Peter 4:10).
  - 2. "By Christ"
    - a. This excludes boasting; it is unmerited favor (I Cor. 4:7), according to His sovereign will.
    - b. This excludes berating; each gift, whether great or small, is needed (I Cor. 12:18-25).
- C. The demonstration of grace
  - 1. Our gifts discerned > see Romans 12:3-9 & I Corinthians 12:4-11
  - 2. Our gifts developed > see II Timothy 2:15 & II Peter 3:18 (cf. I Corinthians 13:1-13)
  - 3. Our gifts demonstrated > see Ephesians 4:12 & I Peter 4:10-11

#### II. The Giver of the Gifts (:8-10)

- A. His celebration (:8)
  - 1. The prophecy (in Psalm 68:18):
    - a. David's victorious, triumphant return to Jerusalem after a battle??
    - b. David is a type of Christ; this is a Messianic Psalm
  - 2. The procedure (in Ephesians 4:8):
    - a. "Led captivity captive" He captured prisoners & led them in a triumphant procession; Christ has defeated Satan, sin, & death.
    - b. "Gave gifts" The gifts are the offices of Christian ministry (both the man & the office were a gift).
- B. His humiliation (:9-10) [A descension]
  - 1. The incarnation
    - a. "Lower parts" in contrast to heaven above (cf. John 3:13)
    - b. Christ's lowly entrance into this world at birth (cf. "Ivory Palaces")
  - 2. The crucifixion
    - a. Philippians 2:5-8 > He humbled Himself unto the death of the cross.
    - b. Isaiah 53:5-12 > He became sin for us, that we might be saved.

### C. His exaltation (:9-10) [An ascension]

- 1. "Far above all heavens"
  - a. Exalted to the right hand of God (Heb. 1:3); highest possible honor & glory.
  - b. "As His humiliation was so low, His exaltation is proportionally high" (Eadie).
- 2. "That He might fill all things"
  - a. He fills all things with His presence.
  - b. "He is supreme over all the powers both of heaven & earth; there is nothing that is not subject to Him, no place or order of existence where His presence may not be known or felt." (Foulkes)

#### III. The Gifts of the Giver (:11)

#### A. Gifts of the **past**

- 1. "Apostles" Ephesians 2:20 & Mark 6:7
  - a. "The point is not that He gave to some men the gift of apostleship (or to be prophets, etc.) but that the church as a whole received apostles as a gift from Christ" (Kent).
  - b. Qualifications: 1) saw the Lord, 2) sent by the Lord, & 3) signs from the Lord.
- 2. "Prophets" Acts 11:27, 13:1, 21:1-11
  - a. Received direct revelation from God (before the completion of the Bible) & reported communication for God to the people.
  - b. Foretelling (prediction) as well as forth-telling (prophecy in the N.T. sense).

#### B. Gifts of the **present**

- 1. "Evangelists" Acts 21:8 & II Timothy 4:5
  - a. Itinerant preachers (no permanent flock to shepherd).
  - b. Present-day missionaries as well as evangelists like Mike Shrock.
- 2. "Pastors & teachers" I Timothy 3:1-7 (one office with 2 characteristics)
  - a. The shepherd of a flock; to guide, rule, & protect the sheep (I Pet. 5:2).

    "It implies careful, tender, vigilant superintendence & government, being the function of an overseer or elder. (Eadie)
  - b. I Timothy 3:2, "...apt to teach" & Titus 1:9, "...by sound doctrine both to exhort & convince the gainsayers."

#### C. Gifts for a purpose

- 1. To <u>precede</u> with spiritual example (faith) > consider his testimony (I Tim. 3:1-7), his training (Titus 1:5-9) & his trial (Hebrews 13:7).
- 2. To provide with spiritual food (food) > Acts 20:28, John 21:15-17 & I Peter 5:2.
- 3. To <u>protect</u> from spiritual danger (fear) > warn of false teachers (Acts 20:29-30), fiery darts (Ephesians 6:16), & of fierce teeth (I Peter 5:8).

Conclusion: Are you part of the body of Christ, His church? Have you discerned the gift(s) Christ has bestowed upon you? Are you developing & demonstrating that gift? Christ has won the victory over Satan, sin, & death. He is now able to fill all things, by manifesting His presence. He ministers to us through His Church & through its gifted members. Although the gifts of apostle & prophet have ceased with the completion of God's Word, there are still the gifts of evangelist & pastor-teacher. These gifted men have the purpose of edifying the members of the body, that the work of the ministry might be fulfilled by all. My prayer is that I & other pastor-teachers or evangelists who minister in this place might precede with a spiritual example, provide you with spiritual food & protect you from spiritual danger. Will you allow the Spirit of God to use such men to edify, encourage, & exhort you unto the work of the ministry?

If you are not saved, not sure that you are a part of Christ's body, why not make sure & accept Him today? Then you, too, can belong to the Church, under the orders of our Lord & Savior Jesus Christ!
