The Power of God's Word *Revelation 10:1-11* Pastor Michael Lynn / West Hampden Baptist Church *May 26, 2024 a.m.*

Introduction: Chapter 10 is part of another parenthesis that extends to 11:14, separating the 6th & 7th trumpets. The 7th trumpet will bring to consummation redemptive history. But before the 7th trumpet is sounded, John's attention is drawn to a little book. Someone has suggested that this is to set Biblical prophecy in proper perspective & teach us several lessons about its nature: (1) Prophecy has divine origin (:1-2); (2) Prophecy is limited (:3-4); (3) Prophecy is certain (:5-7); & (4) Prophecy has human transmission (Terry Rude). Note here, the power of God's Word, seen in its presentation, its prophecy, & its proclamation.

- I. The **Presenting** of God's Book (:1-2) [Prophecy has Divine origin]
 - A. Its **author** from God in heaven
 - 1. Is it a mighty <u>angel</u>? (Michael, the archangel?).
 - a. "Another" "*allos*", 'another of the same kind' (this angel is not worshipped).
 - b. Same as "the *strong angel*" of Revelation 5:2 (cf. 7 & 8).
 - c. No evidence that Christ comes down from heaven midway in the tribulation.
 - d. A representative from the throne-room of God.
 - 2. Is it <u>Christ</u> or "The Angel of the Lord."?
 - a. Clothed with a cloud cf. Dan. 7:13; Ex. 13:21; Acts 1:9-11 & I Thess. 4:17.
 - b. Rainbow on His head as a crown (God as covenant-maker, Gen. 9:16-17).
 - c. His face as brilliant as the sun cf. Rev. 1:16.
 - d. His feet as pillars of fire cf. Rev. 1:15.
 - (1) His right foot upon the sea?
 - (2) His left foot upon the earth?

"Speaks of absolute dominion over the entire earth" (Rude) & a universal message.

- B. Its authority "a little book"
 - 1. Its character:
 - a. A little book (not *biblion* 'book', but *bibliaridion* 'little book' -- cf. our English words 'book' & 'booklet').
 - b. Different than the seven-sealed scroll.
 - 2. Its <u>contents</u>:
 - a. Written authority given to the angel to fulfill his mission??
 - b. Divine revelation, therefore representing all of God's Word.

"It is incontestably clear that in verses 1 & 2 the Lord is emphasizing to John that the prophecy he is receiving has divine origin & divine authority" (Rude).

- II. The **<u>Prophesying</u>** of God's Book (:3-7)
 - A. The **principles** of prophecy (:3-4). [Prophecy is limited]
 - 1. Its <u>lessons</u> (:3) >
 - a. Divine majesty- cry as of a lion's roar (cf. Rev. 5:5; Joel 3:16; & Amos 3:8).
 - b. Divine message 7 thunders (number of perfection or completion God's judgment is thorough, leaving nothing undone).
 - 2. Its <u>limitations</u> (:4) > (lesson of Divine mystery).
 - a. God doesn't want man to know everything (cf. date-setting)
 - b. "...while God has revealed much, there are secrets which .God has not seen fit to reveal to man at this time." (Walvoord) cf. Deuteronomy 29:29. [This is the only place in Revelation where John is told <u>not</u> to write; yet there is much speculation as to what they are though nobody knows!]

- B. The **purpose** of prophecy (:5-7) [Prophecy is certain]
 - 1. To <u>reveal</u> God's Sovereignty (:5-6) >
 - a. The angel swears by heaven, earth, & sea: God is Lord & Master over all creation.
 - b. Christ (this angel) is claiming ownership of earth & sea, having purchased it with His own blood (cf. Rev. 5:9).
 - 2. To <u>reassure</u> of God's plan & purpose (to the believer) (:6-7) >
 - a. "Time no longer" "there is nothing more to unfold; there will be no more delay."
 - (1) The events following the 7th trumpet will unfold quickly.
 - (2) The end of God's longsuffering, judgment is culminated & consummated.
 - b. "To His servants the prophets."
 - (1) Reminds them of His kingdom ("mystery of God" His millennial kingdom).
 - (2) "The prediction relates to the full manifestation of the divine power, majesty & holiness of God which will be evident in the glorious return of Christ, the establishments of His millennial kingdom, & the creation of the eternal state which will follow" (Walvoord).
 - 3. To <u>rebuke (reprove)</u> God's warning & invitation to the unsaved (:6-7) >
 - a. "Knowing the certainty & imminency of judgment, the ungodly ought to repent & turn to the Lord" (Rude).
 - b. God continually demonstrates His love & longsuffering (cf. Rom. 2:4 & II Pet. 3:9).
- III. The **Proclaiming** of God's Book (:8-11) [Prophecy has human transmission]
 - A. There is a **personal** <u>experience</u> (:8-10).
 - 1. Sweetness of the Word "sweet as honey" (Ezk.3:1-3; Ps. 19:9-10 & 119:103).
 - a. Partaking of the Word at salvation Rom. 10:17 & I Pet. 1:23.
 - b. Partaking of the Word for sanctification I Pet. 2:2 & Jer. 15:16.

One must first appropriate the Word for himself before being able to share it with others.

Is the Word of God considered 'sweet as honey' by you?

- 2. Bitterness of the Word (Ezk. 3:1-4 & :14).
 - a. "...its digestion (is) uncomfortable... reflection on the content often focuses on man's rebellion & doom or some other distressing concept" (Rude).
- b. The Word of God reveals divine judgment upon a wicked & Christ-rejecting world.
- B. There is a **public** <u>exhortation</u> (:11).
 - 1. "Thou must.."
 - a. John is commissioned to prophecy again writing what he has seen even though 'bitter.'
 - b. Every preacher must "faithfully proclaim the Word regardless of its content. The unpleasant declaration of wrath & condemnation is just as necessary as the Gospel & promises of blessing. (Rude).
 - 2. "Before many"
 - a. It is a universal message for all to hear.
 - b. The Book of Revelation & all of the Bible is not just for one people or nation, but all.

<u>Conclusion</u>: Have you had a personal experience with God's Book? Have you been born again by its power as Romans 1:16 & I Peter 1:23 declare? If so, the Word of God will be sweet to your taste. You will desire it, digest it, & then go out to declare it. As a Christian, when was the last time you shared your faith with an unsaved person? We are **commanded** to be witnesses (Acts 1:8); we are **constrained** to be witnesses (II Corinthians 5:14); & we are **compelled** as witnesses by the Spirit (II Corinthians 5:20). All the prophecies of this Book are true & certain & will come to pass. God used John as His instrument to transmit this Book of Revelation. God desires to use us to give forth His Gospel message today!
