- Governor Abbott called the special session which starts tomorrow July 8, 2021
- No Agenda or set of priorities has been announced
- Democrats walked out of the chamber in the last hours of the regular session preventing a vote on election reform
- Our Texas State Legislators are in the most difficult and historic precipice to lead the nation...Texas is the fulcrum for all other states

Meeting at the Texas Capital Tuesday July 20, 2021

BIZPAC Transmitted its priorities for special session to Governor Abbott:

- Election Integrity
- Property Tax elimination and move to retail tax
- Special Session immediately called under emergency declaration
- Full spectrum cannabis derived research and medicine without TCH limit
- STOP taxpayer funded lobbying
- Ban OZONE generating air machines in Texas schools & public buildings
- Texas must have total Energy independence from ERCOT
- Casino Gambling voter referendum
