Join us on Thursday, February 20th at 2 PM to learn how to save money on your taxes! Mandy Mansell, Tax Credit Specialist, and Diane Fox, CPA, Director, Frederick County Treasury Office, will give an overview of the various tax credits available to Frederick County senior homeowners and renters.

Find out about two important credits that can save you money – the Homeowner Property Tax Credit and the Homestead Credit. Some of the tax credit applications must be filled out each year, others only require a one-time application.

If you have not filled out paperwork in the past, you may be able to receive credit for the current year and, in some cases, retroactively for some past years. Application forms will be available at the meeting.

Be sure to attend if you are uncertain about your filing status or have other questions about senior tax credits. Please sign up for planning purposes, but it is not required.

Senior Assistance Programs

One of the ways that the Neighbors-Helping-Neighbors (NHN) committee helps the community is by providing information and making referrals to services that help support older Crestwood Village residents. We also work with Service Navigators like Elly Williams and other staff at the Division of Aging and Independence (DAI) of Frederick County.

We regularly research and update information on programs available to seniors at the county, state, and federal levels. Some assistance programs that are available to seniors include:



Elly Williams, our usual consultant from DAI, will not be coming to the Clubhouse for a couple of months. In her place, Teresa Luhn will meet with residents on February 11th to address any questions or concerns regarding non-Medicare issues. Energy Assistance, Food Bank, Groceries 4 Seniors, Habitat for Humanity Home Repairs, Senior Housing Loans & Grants, Meals on Wheels, Medicare Assistance, Energy Rebates, Power Savers Retrofit Program, and Senior Tax Credits.

NHN has compiled a one-page handout (see yellow insert in this month's *Village Voice*) that is a handy reference to these programs. The front side of the handout lists the individual programs and the contact person for each program. The back side of the handout tells a little about the program and provides a web address for more information.


Greekwood Veterans

The Last of the Pioneers
