Financial Report:

- Year-to-date (YTD) operating expenses were higher than YTD income.
- Requests have been sent to several landscaping companies for estimates on the cost to water all the trees planted by the developer on the perimeter of our property.

- Approved proposals from High Sierra for pool repairs and maintenance

MANAGER'S CORNER

Attention Crestwood residents!

New Fiscal Year! New HOA Assessment Rates:

Don't forget to update your autopay if you pay your monthly HOA assessment online or through your bank. This time of year can be a bit confusing with the new rates, so for July, we will waive any late fees if you forgot to change your HOA assessment amount. However, please note that this waiver only applies to July. If you have not updated your information by August and still have the previous HOA assessment rate, you will be charged a late fee. If you would like a Coupon Book, please contact Shirley, and she can print one out for you. The cost is \$5.00 per book.

Registration/Consent Forms:

We kindly remind you to submit your Registration Forms and Disclosure of Personal Information Consent forms as soon as possible. We need to have up-to-date information for everyone in the community. If you haven't already done so, please pick up copies of the forms at the office. **Please note that if you did not turn in these forms, you will not be included in the Crestwood Phone Directory** as you did not opt-in by filling out the consent form.

Community Inspections:

During recent inspections, management has noticed several violations that need attention. These violations include overgrown weeds and shrubs in flowerbeds, dirty siding, unsightly gutters, excessive fake flowers and garden ornaments, and an excessive number of potted plants and hanging plants. (Each home is permitted to have 5 potted plants and 2 hanging plants visible from the front of the home.) Please address any violations promptly. We will be conducting more inspections this month and will send out more violation notices.

New Temporary Guest Pass:

Crestwood is introducing new temporary guest passes this year. When visiting the pool, please ensure that you stamp your temporary guest card for each guest you bring. Once you have stamped your card five times, please see the front desk personnel, and they will provide you with a new one. Remember, you must drop off your stamped card to receive a new one.

New Pool Rule Concerning Food and Beverages:

Attention all pool attendees! We would like to remind everyone about the new rule regarding food and beverages at the pool. This rule has been put in place as a privilege, and it can be revoked if not followed. We kindly ask for your cooperation and adherence to the following guidelines:

- Only bring non-alcoholic beverages to the pool area.
- When bringing food, please consider items such as sandwiches, veggies, cookies, granola bars, chips, and other snacks.
- Ensure that all beverages are in cans or plastic containers.
- Before leaving the pool area, please clean up any food or trash you have brought.

It is important to avoid any violations of these rules to ensure that all residents can continue to bring food to the pool. Thank you for your understanding and cooperation in maintaining an enjoyable pool experience for everyone.

ARC COMMITTEE

ARC hopes all residents are enjoying the warmer weather. Applications for exterior improvements are steadily coming in, and we look forward to working with everyone on their projects.

Important Reminder: If you plan a project that requires digging in your yard, MISS UTILITY must be called at 811 prior to digging to avoid damaging underground utilities, i.e., cable, telephone, electric, water/sewer. This is a free service. If a contractor will be performing the dig, it is his/her responsibility to contact Miss Utility to have a ticket opened in the company name; a contractor cannot perform any work on a homeowner's ticket number. Homeowners only need to open their own ticket if performing the work themselves. Please ensure this will be done.

ARC would like to thank homeowners for their cooperation in referring to the ARC Guidelines to determine if a project is a type that has been preapproved (Section III Guidelines) or if it will require completion of an ARC application to obtain approval (Section IV Guidelines) ... and for submitting an application when necessary. Applications can be found online on the Crestwood Village website (www.crestwoodvlg.net) or in the Clubhouse office.


FINANCE COMMITTEE


