

January 23 *Light on the Meare*

A beautiful sky can really make a painting and it's easy when you know how. Tips and techniques for successful wet-into-wet painting. Step-by-step demonstration.



February 13 *House Portraits*

A great chance to paint your own house or one that you like (bring a photo if you wish). A step-by-step demonstration to show how to draw and paint this lovely cottage in watercolour and add detail with pen.



March 13 *Stone Arch*

This is one of the really beautiful aspects of the old Courtyard. Step-by-step demonstration to paint texture on old mellow stone and how to "fill" flowerpots with a profusion of colourful plants.



April 10 Wet-into-wet Anemones

Absolutely beautiful flowers and easy to paint in watercolour. Learn how to paint them with light and movement and the desired amount of drippiness.



May 22 Stable Yard in Pen & Wash

A step-by-step demonstration to paint this lovely old doorway in the Stable Yard at Burghley, using wet-into-wet colour washes then adding pen detail.



June 12 Queen Elizabeth's Bedroom (cover image)

A chance to view this exquisite room, then either paint from your own sketches or follow a step-by-step demonstration to paint a scene.

July 17 The Summerhouse in Pen & Wash

A step-by-step demonstration to paint this beautiful building, which is tucked away in the private gardens at Burghley.



August 14 *Misty Lavender*

Fragrant lavender and an old stone urn provide an exquisitely romantic subject – try out more techniques, including a soft wet-into-wet background.



September 25 *Antique Hydrangeas*

Hydrangeas are especially lovely as the colours melt into Autumnal shades. Begin with a simple wetinto-wet background suggesting misty flowers then add detail.



October 23

Stamford (pigment supplied)

Caput Mortuum is an exciting pigment to use as the colour splits and granulates when it is dropped onto wet paper. It produces a wonderful effect on old buildings.



November 13 The Great Hall

Visit the majestic Great Hall, for some wonderful inspiration. Either work from your own sketches or follow a demonstration - detail can be beautiful when just suggested in loose drippy watercolour.
