

January 29 Beautiful Burghley

Make the most of the beautiful properties of watercolour. Paint a soft sunset, allowing colours to blend on the wet paper, then add a simple silhouette of Burghley. A lovely technique which and can be used for many other subjects.



February 12 *Entrance to the Park*

Try out lots of different watercolour techniques to capture sunlight through the majestic trees in the Burghley Park.



March 11 Pen & Wash Buildings

Using a fineliner and a brush. A really useful technique perfect for depicting buildings. Learn how to capture this lovely old thatched cottage or choose your own subject from the grounds at Burghley or bring a photo.

Wet-into-wet Magnolias

Such graceful shapes and soft markings work so well dropped on to wet paper. Absorb yourself in magnolia doodles without any drawing - very relaxing.



May 13 *Lamplight*

Use watercolour washes to capture the glow from a lamp and make interesting shadows. Lots of useful tips and techniques for successful wet-into-wet watercolour.



June 3 Summer Flowers

Lots of wet-into-wet demonstration painting to show how to paint loose and lovely fresh summer flowers from the gardens at Burghley.



July 8 *The Boathouse*

Paint this lovely building set in the grounds of Burghley and it's beautiful reflection in the water. Use loose watercolour, then add details with pen and try using gum Arabic for easy reflections.



August 12

Princess Victoria's Bed (cover image)

Visit The House to look at this beautiful little bed, that was used by Princess Victoria when she visited as a child. Then learn how to capture this special scene.



A step-by-step demonstration showing how to paint the stately Bottle-neck Lodges at the entrance to Burghley park, in loose watercolour and pen.



October 14 Stained Glass Window

Begining with a walk through The House to look at the Chapel and then a demonstration to show how you can achieve beautiful effects with drippy paint and cling film.



November 18 Northern Lights

Snowscenes with a difference! Tip colours on to wet paper and swirl them to produce dramatic skies. Really fun effects that you can only achieve with wet-into-wet watercolour.
