Part 1

Building Numbers

§4-101. Building Defined.

The word "building," as used in this Part, shall mean any structure, used or intended to be used as a dwelling or a place for business or industry, but shall not include any public building or any structure built as a place of worship, or any accessory building located on a lot where there is also a main building.

§4-102. Assignment of Numbers for Buildings.

Council, or a person assigned by Council for the purpose, shall prepare an official building numbering plan for the Borough. It shall be the duty of every owner of a building in the Borough to obtain from the Borough Secretary information as to the official number for his building.

§4-103. Property Owners to Number Buildings Correctly.

Every owner of a building in the Borough shall number his building with the correct and complete official number. The correct and complete number shall be affixed to or painted upon or carved upon the front of the building or affixed to, painted upon or carved upon a permanent standard, base or support located between the building and the street upon which the building fronts. Each digit of the number shall be at least 3 inches high, and shall be of a color and material to render the number visible from the street. The number shall be constantly maintained by the owner of the building in complete and legible form. The owner of the building shall reaffix or renew all numbers that do not continue to conform to the requirements of this Section.

§4-104. Penalty for Violation.

Any person, firm or corporation who shall violate any provision of this Part, upon conviction thereof, shall be sentenced to pay a fine of not more than \$1,000 plus costs and, in default of payment of said fine and costs, to a term of imprisonment not to exceed 30 days. Each day that a violation of this Part continues shall constitute a separate offense.
