

WHA Launches New Book

The Washburn Heritage Association is happy

to announce publication of "*The Spirit of Washburn*," a 200+ page book telling stories of the culture and history of our town. The Washburn Community Educational Foundation and the Washburn Heritage Association supported the project financially.

Authors Lynn Adams, Patra Holter, Ginny Pedersen, and Sharon Stewart met twice a week for two years adapting for publication their previous work on panels for the WHA Kiosk in Wikdal Park. Some topics of the twenty-eight chapters include logging, Dupont, the library, city parks, churches, and city bands.

came before us to make the City what it is today. Now that the book is published, work on new kiosk panels continues.




