Bayview History Committee

Many activities planned for this summer at the Houghton Depot

This summer the Houghton Depot, located in Bayview Town Park, will host five public open houses on Saturdays from 10 am to noon. Dates for public open houses are June 28, July 12, July 19, August 2, and August 30. BHC volunteers will be available to answer questions and operate the model train. The Bayview History Committee will also be offering three 2-hour programs for adults about Bayview history at the Houghton Depot. The programs are offered on three Thursdays, from 1 - 3 pm. Each program has a \$5 entry fee and is limited to 15 people per program.

Dates and program information follows:

June 26: Rock. Discover the geological history of Lake Superior and its impact on the development of the Town of Bayview. Learn about brownstone rock: how it was harvested and used in building construction.

July 17: People. Meet the people who lived in Bayview, both before and after the railroad arrived. Learn why the Town of Houghton was established.

August 17: Rails. Understand the impact of the railroad on Bayview's development and how it transformed the area. Learn about the railroad workers and the essential roles they played.
