### Oktoberfest Blue Ridge Breweries Tour

Twenty-four beer lovers joined us for this Oktoberfest tour of breweries in the Blue Ridge area. We left the Lodge at 11:15 and headed down Rt. 340 through Berryville on our way to our first stop, Harpers Ferry Brewery. It is a huge establishment in Loudoun Heights overlooking the Rt. 340 bridge over the Potomac River. It has a wide selection of beers and food that can be enjoyed at many indoor

and outdoor seating areas. Some of us chose inside while others sat around a fire pit outside with a view of the Potomac. There was an area



for a bandstand in a covered area outside. There is ample parking for the large crowds that visit on weekends. We enjoyed our beer and food before boarding the bus for our next brewery in Loudoun County.





Our second stop, Old 690 Brewery, is on an old gravel road (Rt. 690) in the Hillsborough area. It is a more modest establishment with many flavored beers. We ordered glasses or flights of beer and some food and took them to an outdoor patio with metal tables and chairs shaded by umbrellas. There is an old 1940's era red pickup truck parked behind the brewery that draws a lot of attention from visitors. We were soon back on the gravel road headed for Rt. 9.

Harvest Gap Brewery, located on a family farm in operation for over 250 years, was our third stop. It is on Rt. 9 with beautiful

views of the Blue Ridge. It has ample seating inside and outside in a rustic farmers market setting. We had to change buses here because of a scheduling conflict with another party. The bus arrived later than expected, which gave us more time to enjoy our beer and socialize.







Our final stop was Twisted Oak Brewery in nearby White Post, not far from the remains of Lord Fairfax's estate. This is a recent startup boutique brewery with a limited selection of beers to try. We were impressed with their hospitality, especially the complimentary happy hour snack table. We selected our beers from the modest, but classy bar, and took seats around picnic tables outside. One of the owners joined us and thanked us for visiting. She said they frequently eat at Regions 117. We thanked her for her hospitality and were soon on our way back to Lake Frederick, where we arrived by 6:00 pm.



## Fall Colors Tour of Fort Valley & Edinburg with Winery Stops Oct 23, 2024

This trip sold out early and we only lost one member due to illness the day of the trip. Seventeen travellers boarded a Shenandoah Shuttle at the lodge and headed for Fort Valley. It was a perfect fall day and the colors on the trees, especially the yellows, were everywhere, including Rachel Carson. We entered Fort Valley Road off Rt. 55 between Front Royal and Strausberg. We drove along Passage Creek for a while, where there is a state park with camping and a swimming hole in the creek, great for grandchildren. John Osius noted that he likes to ride his motorcycle along this road.

We soon reached the old brick church that is now a museum, where we met our tour guides. Two of them, including my friend, Eileen Drinkwater, had retired there. The third one was a third generation local. They explained that when attendance at two churches could no longer sustain them, the community offered to use them as museums of Fort Valley life. One of our guides, John, said the difficulty in finding and entering the valley reminded him of Brigadoon. He confirmed that the valley had been surveyed by George Washington for Lord Fairfax and that he planned to use it as a last stand against the British in the Revolution. One of the residents, Jeanette Conner Rittenour, had

written a history of the area that was on sale in the museum. The brick church was small but had an open second story choir loft. It was packed with articles from the church and daily life in the Valley.

A short distance away was a second museum, a white frame church that could have come to life from a Christmas card. It is still used for community activities and to exhibit other articles of 19<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup> century life in the Valley. We took our time examining articles from the area from pre-Civil War to the present. Finally, we thanked our guides, gave them a donation to help with the museums, and walked back to our bus, and headed through Edinburg Gap, over the North Fork of the Shenandoah River to the town of Edinburg. (Massanutten Mountain and Fort Valley are bounded by the North and South Forks of the Shenandoah.)

Edinburg Museum, which is housed in a Civil War era flour mill, along with a wine shop and restaurant, was our next stop. The museum has three floors that are served by a small elevator and stairs. It contains a rabbit's warren of themed room filled with articles from pre-Civil War to the mid-20<sup>th</sup> century. The museum has a small theatre that shows a short film, "The Burning," that covers how the Civil War affected the area. After touring the museum, we gathered in the cellar restaurant for lunch. They were expecting us and had us seated at two long tables facing one another.



Lunch was good and reasonable, but unfortunately service was slow because they wanted to serve all of us at the same time. This put us about an hour behind on our schedule, but we had extra time to socialize around the table. Our first winery stop, called and we explained that we would arrive about an hour later than expected. Fortunately, this was not a problem.

Kindred Point is not far from Edinburg. When we arrived, they had us set up in two long tables facing each other. They offered us a group tasting, or glasses of wine of our choice, or flights of wine. We selected all three and they served us accordingly. During our

visit they revealed their plan to open another tasting room, closer to us, near Rappahannock Cellars. We thanked them for their hospitality and patience before moving on to our next stop.

Our driver, Steve, had been to all three wineries on our schedule and he soon had us at nearby Cave Ridge Winery. We had warned them that we would be about an hour late. They were expecting us and offered us flights or glasses of wine. I chose a glass of satisfying red and joined a group at a table on an outdoor patio. Dan and Cheryl Mortland, the former owners of Fox Meadow were at our table and when the owner of Cave Ridge stopped by, they struck up a conversation. They agreed that owning a vineyard and winery was expensive and hard work.





It was soon obvious that everyone was enjoying themselves at Cave Ridge and that a third winery stop was out of the question. We called Wolf Gap Vineyard and gave them our regrets, another winery for another day. As the sun began to cast long shadows, we finished our wine, boarded our bus, and were soon back on I-81 headed home. We arrived at the lodge, tipped and thanked our driver, Steve, said our goodbyes, and headed home. Many thanks to everyone who joined us!



### Old Town Alexandria Christmas Walking Tour Dec 16, 2024

Old Town Alexandria and Old Town Winchester share a rich Colonial Period history. The Potomac River Seaport of Alexandria was linked to Winchester by colonial roads through Appalachian Mountain gaps and fords across the Shenandoah River, for transportation of goods and people. Those roads, Route 7, and Route 50, still connect the cities, although much improved.



For this tour we will take a bus to Old Town. There, we will have an early dinner at The Wharf before meeting our guide and beginning our walking tour around the Cobblestone streets to historic sites

Alexandria is so close to D.C. that it used to be a part of the federal district, yet it manages to feel as it belongs to another world ... another era. Home to one of the oldest historic districts in America, Alexandria boasts a heavy dose of colonial charm. Wander the streets decorated for the holiday spirit to learn about Alexandria!

From its founding in 1749, you'll learn about this pre-Revolutionary home where George Washington worshiped and occasionally stayed, Robert E. Lee grew up, and other stories of this historic town.
