Winter Wine Trail Tour Was Cold but Fun!

With the weather clear but very cold, a group of ten Lake Frederick Travelers set out from the Lodge for our first stop, Apple House, in Linden. It has been around since 1963 and was the unofficial gateway watering hole for folks using Route 55, John Marshall Highway, to visit nearby orchards and Blue Ridge Mountains before I-66 was finished. We had a bite to eat in the diner-style restaurant with a wood-burning fireplace roaring and then did a little souvenir shopping. The inviting bar-lounge area with overstuffed couches and chairs had another cozy fireplace going.



We left Linden for our first winery, Aspen Dale, in Markham. This winery is in a converted barn on a family farm. Unfortunately, they had no heat that day; so we kept our coats on. The owners' son is the vintner and was our host. He paired each wine serving with a food nibble to suggest what types of food would complement their wines. He told us he was self-taught via Internet and coaching from our Virginia vintners. Aspen Dale does not have a vineyard. They buy their grapes from a vineyard in Rappahannock County that does not

have a winery. After paying individually for our tasting and purchases, we boarded or Classy Cowboy Van for the next stop, Philip Carter Winery and Vineyard.

The van followed winding Rt. 688 from Rt. 55 toward Hume, Va., in the Blue Ridge foothills of the Piedmont. Philip Carter is on a high plateau with a great view of the Blue Ridge. Our hosts were expecting us and set us up in a large room with a fireplace for our tasting. Unfortunately, they had run out of propane the night before and the room was chilly. The Carter family has a long history of winemaking in Virginia. In 1759, a committee of the Virginia assembly was formed and charged with the question of economic diversification. Its chairman, Charles Carter, fifth son of Colonel Robert "King" Carter, entered into correspondence with London, that discussed vine growing and winemaking in Virginia. Carter's correspondence reveals that the prospects and methods for the cultivation of the grape in Virginia were an important subject. More recently, between 2005 and 2007, Philip Carter Strother, a direct descendant of the pioneering Carter family, was instrumental in the passage of The Virginia Farm Winery Zoning Act, a law intended to promote the economic vitality of the Virginia Wine Industry by restricting the ability of localities to regulate activities at farm wineries. In 2008, the Carter family returned to the production of wine in Virginia, when Philip Carter Strother founded Philip Carter Winery. They were celebrating their 10th anniversary when we

arrived. After sampling their wines and viewing handmade crafts made from wood from a nearby barn, we paid our bills and moved on to our next stop, Desert Rose Ranch and Winery.

Desert Rose was a horse and cattle farm before owners Bob and Linda decided to convert it to a vineyard and winery. The tasting room is filled with cowboy memorabilia, and the tasting bar features cash and coins they collected from around the world during Bob's Federal career. From the outside, the tasting room looks like a Western bunkhouse overlooking a pond. Bob and Linda were gracious hosts, and after sampling their wines in heated comfort, it was time to move on.



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Since we were ahead of schedule, we decided to add one more winery on our way home. We stopped unannounced at Rappahannock Cellars near Rt. 522. The staff was gracious enough to set us up at a separate tasting bar and help us explore their fine wines. Rappahannock Cellars is owned and operated by a family that sold their California vineyard and winery to start a new one at the base of the Blue Ridge Mountains. It is one of the most respected wine operations in Virginia and is expanding into a distillery. The picture shown here was taken in their tasting room.

We finished the day by taking Rt. 522 through Chester Gap and Front Royal back to Lake Frederick. We enjoyed the company and stories of Fred and Nancy Grondhuis, Sandy and Cindy Sanders, Robert Paysour and his daughters, Devon and Abby, Thomas and Linda Carroll, and George Darnell. We are already thinking about where to go next. Many thanks to Lynda and Gary of Classy Cowboy Chauffeurs for transportation and guiding us through the wineries.
