Gettysburg Battlefield Bus Tour by George Darnell


June 7, 2021

Forty-six travelers left the lodge on a comfortable Richards Bus at 8:30 a.m. and traveled Route 340 through Harpers Ferry to Frederick, MD. We turned onto Route 15 and headed for Gettysburg, PA. Along the way, Sam Kerns, dressed in both blue and gray, and Rick Turner, dressed in a Confederate gray uniform, told us about how they became interested in the Gettysburg Campaign and other visits they had made.

They told us how General Lee was able to move 70,000 Confederate troops from Chancellorsville, VA, as far north as Harrisburg, PA, without alerting Federal troops. In brief, they entered the Shenandoah Valley at Chester Gap near Front Royal and used the Blue Ridge Mountains to shield their movement as they crossed the Potomac River into Maryland and then into Pennsylvania. Along their way, they cleared the Valley of Federal troops and captured 40 canons at the Second Battle of Winchester north of the city.

Sam provided us with ten pages of color and black and white handouts before we stopped on the battlefield. They contained troop strengths, pictures of major generals and maps of the three-day battle. Our first stop was near the Eternal

Light Monument overlooking Day One of the battle. We stood under a large oak, which still had marks of the battle, while Sam (on the right) described the battle.





We stopped at the Peach Orchard to view the site of part of Day Two as Sam (on the left) described it to us.

For lunch, we stopped in Gettysburg, at the Appalachian Brewery, located on what was part of the battlefield. Sam called ahead to alert them to our arrival and it was large enough that we did not have to wait long to be seated and served in groups of four or six. We enjoyed our lunch and conversations before rejoining the bus for a drive to Little Round Top, another site of Day Two of the battle.

After parking near the top of Little Round Top, we got off the bus and walked to the boulder strewn area known as Devils Den. Sam described how Federal canon and sharpshooters defended the position from Confederate troops attacking from below. Then we walked to the other side of the hill where the Chamberlain's 20th Maine monument commemorating their famous bayonet charge defending the flank of Little Round Top.





Our last stop was the "high water mark" of "Pickett's Charge" on Day Three of the battle. As we stood on the high ground that was attacked by the Confederate Army, Rick described to us in detail the pincer movement that almost won the day. The day was clear and hot as we looked out on the fence the Confederates had to climb through or over to charge across open ground. But Rick told us that the canons and the muskets the Confederates thought they had silenced were still operational and the Federals were still defending the hill—the smoke simply covered the operations. They won the day for the Federal troops.

We were glad to reboard the bus and enjoy its air conditioning for the ride home to Lake Frederick. As we exited the bus, everyone thanked our neighbors, Sam and Rick, as well as our driver, Ed, for making it an informative and enjoyable trip.
