### Christmas in Union Station & DC Holiday Lights

It is hard to find a more wonderful city for Christmas than nearby Washington, DC. We left the lodge in a VA Rides bus around 2:00 p.m. and took I-66 all the way into

DC. Our driver missed the turn into the fourth-level parking garage behind Union Station and drove around to the front to let us off. That gave us a chance to see the decorated front of the station and enter into the main

hall with holiday travelers. It is a cavernous room with nothing but a large Christmas Tree from Norway on one side. It was once the main waiting room with large wooden benches.

We took a quick walk around the station, stopping for a comfort break at the restrooms, before making our way to the mezzanine level for dinner in one of the restaurants. Union Station has not recovered from Covid and many of the shops and table-service restaurants are still closed. We were disappointed to find that the only one open was Uno's and they couldn't seat us because they were short-staffed and expecting two large parties with reservations. So, we split up to visit the food courts on the main and lower levels for our evening meals.

Afterwards, we met our tour guide, Becca, at the Christmas tree. She took a group picture for us and then led us to our bus on the fourth level. Becca directed our driver to the Capitol Christmas Tree while she gave us some history of George Washington's and Pierre L'Enfant's plans for our nation's capital. We were able to park the bus a short distance from the tree and walk to it for pictures.





While most of the embassies in DC are on "Embassy Row," (Massachusetts Avenue), Becca told us that the Canadian Embassy is on Pennsylvania Ave between the Capitol and the White House. We stopped there to see their Christmas Tree in the large Parthenon style gazebo in front of the embassy.

Our next stop was "City Center" on New York Ave to view the tallest

Christmas Tree in Washington. Becca told us this was part of an effort by the city to bring shoppers back into the city as part of its renovation.

The National Christmas Tree on

the Ellipse behind the White House was our next destination. We passed the Executive Office Building near the White House and found a parking spot on the street nearby. It was a short walk to the site, between the White House and the Washington Monument.





The National Tree is surrounded by smaller trees representing the 50 states, US Territories, and major US installations around the world. They are in alphabetical order, making it easy to find Virginia and other trees of interest to our group. A highlight of the evening was a young man proposing to his girlfriend by the tree. Romance still lives.



We couldn't get a good view of the White House because of the 12foot iron security fence around the grounds. It wasn't there 40 years

ago when Michelle and I took our children to see the tree. Times change.

Our last stop was the Reflecting Pool and Lincoln Memorial. Becca knew we would need a restroom break before

starting our drive back to Lake Frederick. There are restrooms and museum displays in the basement of the memorial with a ground level

entrance and an elevator to the main level. Who knew?

I shared with some of the group that my first job after high school was in WWII temporary buildings on the south side of the Reflecting Pool. They were used by "The Agency" until they built their headquarters in Langley. I joined many other



college students and some housewives working parttime in the evening doing clerical work during the height of the Cold War.



We were blessed with a calm winter evening with clear views down the Mall to the Washington Monument and the Capitol beyond. Washington, DC is truly a beautiful city, especially lighted for Christmas. But it was not always that way, as Becca reminded us at the beginning of our tour. And recent renovations and new memorials are making it even more attractive. We lingered a while, remembering all the historic events that had taken place around us. Then we boarded our bus to head for home after thanking Becca and giving her an envelope of tips. How she got home we will never know, but I suspect a friend was waiting nearby to help her.

Our ride home took us past the colorfully lighted Kennedy

Center on the Potomac. Some us would return there a week later to attend the musical, "Wicked." We arrive back at the lodge about 10:00 p.m., tipped our driver, Kevin, and returned to our homes. It was a pleasant trip.





Right now, Greg is planning to depart LF 5AM on 5/27 and will be carpooling with Christine/Frank. Gary will follow and may continue up to Lake George after cruise returns or possibly come back home depending on his carpool situation. Please tell others about this inexpensive cruise. The more the merrier. I've attached the trip info George Darnell asked me to put together and he said he was going to mention it at the LF travel club.

Once we get onboard, we can link our reservations and then we would be able to all sit at the same table for dinner. If you prefer to dine separately on any particular night, no problem, just let the dining reservationist know when you show up for dinner. There will probably be two formal nights so plan accordingly. Each stateroom can bring two bottles of wine in luggage. If you don't plan to use your allowance, let others know so a bottle can be added to your bag for exchange once on board. Frank and Greg purchased a soda beverage package (was promo at 50% off so if you are interested watch for that. Now I see only 35% discount. Alcohol packages are not worth it IMO -- please contact me for more info!)

Do create Royal Caribbean account and join their Crown and Anchor Society frequent cruiser program and call Royal with this number to add to your reservation. And download Royal app as you will use it extensively on-board to communicate with each other and check your daily itinerary and make reservations.

On May 29, I'm planning to take public bus transportation (available at the pier) to Horseshoe Bay and spend most of the day on the beach. I'm not a beach person, but this beach is world renown and spectacular. You will need some sort of sun protection. I have a pop-up beach tent I'm bringing that folds flat. Amazon link below. May 30, AM will take a ferry from Royal Dockyards (at pier terminal) to St. Georges and then probably take a bus back to cruise terminal. May stop off in Hamilton (shopping district) depending on time. This way you will cover the entire island and get to see the scenery and locale. Public transportation is very inexpensive and a great way to do an island tour. There are ship-based tours as well you might consider as well (book in advance if you like as there will be no discounts once on-board).

### Hello Iceland Travelers - Update

We have all booked the Iceland airfare and RT local transfers through Globus.

After many emails with the Viator tour operator for the Reykjavik City tour, you will need to consider the following information whether or not to keep or cancel the Viator reservation:

- We arrive 6:30AM and have to deplane and collect luggage
- Then exit through customs/immigration (I was told this is zero time by another LF Iceland traveler)
- Find the Globus transfer vehicle 45min ride to downtown hotel

Assuming flight arrives on time (could be earlier too?), and baggage is expedient and transfers to downtown hotel are smooth (I contacted Globus rep about this and she reached out to transfer agent and was told once we load into van, it would depart immediately and direct to hotel), we should arrive before 8:30AM which is the latest hotel-pickup time the tour operator would agree to.

So the risk is we pay \$54 for the tour and lose this money because we are late and tour will not wait for us.

Viator cancellations are 24hrs prior full refund but we wouldn't know our timing till morning of the tour.

All this said, I'm going to keep my reservation and risk it because the alternative is we arrive very early in Reykjavic and have nothing to do all day and no other day available to see the city. However, I just wanted all my fellow travelers to understand the issues and make their own decision.

I also contacted a private tour operator but they did not write back (several weeks now). I asked Globus if they offer a city tour and they said they use Viator. If anyone has other ideas please circulate to the group.


