Twelve wine loving members joined us for this event. We arrived a little early and had time to admire the new furniture and awnings at Fox Meadow. Amanda had arranged a long table inside for us to enjoy this event. See the menu below. We thoroughly enjoyed ourselves and Amanda's hospitality as you can see from the photos. Amanda suggested we visit Capstone Vineyard, a partner vineyard closer to I-66 and called ahead to alert them of our visit. They specialize in sparkling white wine. They do not have a ground floor entrance, and we had to climb a balcony stairway to get in. It is a smaller tasting room than Fox Meadow.

Loudoun County Wine Tour By George Darnell



August 16 & 23, 2024

Due to the overwhelming interest in this tour, we did it twice and had good weather for both trips. Bill Johnson, our wine enthusiast, selected three excellent wineries in nearby Loudoun County. This is a combined report for both trips.

After checking in at the Lodge, we boarded a Shenandoah Shuttle about 10:30 a.m. and headed through Berryville to Rt. 7 and Snickers Gap into Loudoun County. Our First stop was Odium Cellars near Purcellville. They are perched on a hillside overlooking a silo. We stood at the wine bar for our selection of wine and ordered pizza before retiring to their stone patio to enjoy our selections. We exchanged stories of where we came from and how we selected Lake Frederick while sipping our wine and sharing our pizza. Bill soon had us back on the bus and headed for Breaux Vineyards.

Breaux, near Mechanicsville, is one of the largest and oldest vineyards in Loudoun County. It has an extensive wine bar and plenty of seating inside and outside. The vineyard faces Catoctin Mountain, with beautiful views year-round. One could imagine themselves being teleported to an Italian Villa. They serve food as well as wine and non-alcoholic drinks. A large pretzel with dipping sauce was a favorite of many. We gathered on the large covered porch with views of the vineyard and mountain to enjoy our wine and conversation before moving on.







Our last stop, 8 Chains North Winery, near Wheatland, a more rustic and homier winery. They even had an old read pickup truck to remind us of their farm roots. By this time some of us had our fill of wine and selected water to finish out the day. Others chose white or red wine. And one of us bought some wine to take home. It was 40% off. A couple near us had an Australian Shepherd who was very friendly but well behaved. We enjoyed petting him and talking to the owners.

At last, it was time to head back to Rt. 7 and home. We arrived at the lodge in time to close out happy hour or have dinner. But first, we took the group photo above, tipped and thanked our driver and thanked Bill for organizing and leading these trips.

Join us for an exciting trail ride at Royal Horseshoe Farm in the Shenandoah Valley followed by lunch at nearby Backroom Brewery.,

About Royal Horseshoe Farm in Front Royal

- Our trails pass through the Shenandoah Valley's history rich meadows, woods, and hills.
- You can ride across Manassas Run, pass the old cannon emplacements that used to guard Morgan's Ford, visit the old barns that used to hold US Cavalry ponies, and see the house where George Washington stayed when he was a young man surveying for Lord Fairfax.
- One or more trail guides lead each ride. Riding experiences range from gentle pastures, to wide sloping trails, crossing small or medium sized streams, and even some trails that are narrow, windy, wooded and steep.

About Backroom Brewery

- One of the oldest and closest breweries in the valley, they began as a herb farm, growing culinary and medicinal herbs for the garden center trade. In the fall of 2012, they built their hops field. After all, hops are the herbs that flavor beer. By 2013 they were brewing.
- Come visit and enjoy award-winning beer and delicious food in the Main Taproom and the Big Barn. At least one of them is always open and both on weekends.



Gettysburg Battlefield Bus Tour September 23, 2024

If you always wanted to know more about the largest battle ever fought in North America, Gettysburg, join two of our own Gettysburg enthusiasts (Sam Kerns and Rick Turner), for a day trip to the hollowed grounds of the Gettysburg National Battlefield Park. On our trip to the battlefield, they will share what happened during the Gettysburg Campaign, including events in our own backyard. The time on the battlefield will give you an overview of the events with a few interesting stories about some of the 165,000 participants.

We make several stops on the battlefield and walking is over paved walkways. Parking has been greatly improved at Little Round Top but there are some steps on newly created walkways with fantastic views of the battlefield.

8:00 a.m. Depart the lodge. Sam and Rick will present material on the way.

9:30 a.m. Rest Stop at the Sheetz in Thurmont, MD; then on to Gettysburg Battlefield

Stop 1: The Eternal Light (Day 1 of Battle)

Stop 2: Lee Monument (Days 2 and 3)

Stop 3: Lunch at the Appalachian Brewery located on the battlefield, Menu and beer selection can be found at <abcheve.com/battlefield>.

Stop 4: Little Round Top (newly renovated) (Day 2)

Stop 5: Short walk to Joshua Chamberlan's 20th Maine battle line (right down the hill from the summit of Little Round Top)

Stop 6: First Minnesota Regiment Monument (Final stop of Day 2)

Stop 7: Short walk to The Angle (Pickett's Charge Day 3) Highwater mark of the Confederacy

Return home with rest stop just south of Gettysburg at the Mason/Dixon Welcome Center (around 4:15)

6:15 p.m. Return to lodge.

Minimum for this trip is 30 and maximum is 50. Registration is \$65 for transportation and PDF handouts. Lunch and driver's tip are not included. Drop off a check to "Lake Fr9erick Travel Club" with contact info and date of trip with lodge concierge no later than September 10, 2024.

Oktoberfest Route 151 Breweries Tour, October 4, 2024

The Lake Frederick Travel Club has selected the popular "Spirits Alley" along Route 151 in Nelson County for our Oktoberfest Brews



tour. We will visit three popular breweries and perhaps a cidery if we have time. This will be a long day. We will visit:

- Blue Mountain Brewery at the top of Route 151 in Afton, VA, near the entrance to the Blue Ridge Parkway. Craft beer, other drinks, and food, with indoor and outdoor seating, are available. This is a favorite of the Charlottesville crowd with great pizza. <u>Blue Mountain</u> Brewery.
- Wild Wolf Brewing Company in Nellysford. Their biergarten, which is situated under a canopy
 of 60-year-old Siberian Elm trees, features a gazebo, waterfalls and a large koi pond. The
 restaurant is housed in a 105-year old building which has been renovated to include wrap
 around porches with views of the surrounding mountains. In addition to their craft beers they
 offer a full menu with Cajun specialties. Wild Wolf Brewing.
- Devils Backbone Base Camp, a favorite of Appalachian Trail hikers, where they can get a shower, wash clothes, and sleep indoors. Basecamp Brewpub & Meadows is tucked into a valley on 100 acres surrounded by the Blue Ridge Mountains. It gets its name from an overlooking mountain ridge named Devil's Backbone by an early explorer. The production brewery is in Lexington but the onsite pilot brewery is where they craft recipes on a traditional German designed 10 Hectoliter (8.5 barrel) brewing system. They pour fresh craft beer from 16 taps and their pub menu specializes in oak wood-fired smoked dishes and local fare. Try the fish and chips. Inside and outside seating is available. Their Vienna Lager is available on tap at our lodge bar. Devils Backbone Base Camp
- Bold Rock Hard Cidery is an optional visit. Tastings feature 6 ciders on draft: 2 draft ciders are
 free of charge, with a small additional charge for a tasting flight of the other 4 draft ciders. At
 their service bar you can get Bold Rock by the glass or longneck bottle. Six packs are
 available to take home or you can buy them in a local store. Bold Rock Hard Cidery

Fall Colors Tour of Fort Valley & Edinburg with Winery Stops October 23, 2024

Our Fall Colors trip this year will take us to Shenandoah County museums preserving Valley life in the 19th and early 20th centuries. Our first museum is in Fort Valley, hidden in the heart of Massanutten Mountain, just a short drive from Lake Frederick.



George Washington surveyed the area for Lord Fairfax and later considered it an ideal spot for a last stand against the British in the American Revolution. Today, it provides access to many recreational areas in the George Washington and Jefferson National Forests that surround it, and it is home to family farms and estates. The museum is a local grass roots effort to preserve the history of the area from pre-Civil War to the present.

Our second museum, wine shop, and restaurant is in the restored Edinburg Mill. We will visit the museum, browse the shop, and have lunch, perhaps with a glass of local wine, before heading to our first Shenandoah County winery/vineyard. If nature cooperates, we should see plenty of fall color along the way before returning to the lodge, perhaps for a late supper.
