Mosby Heritage Wine Tour, May 10



Anyone who prefers not to walk can reboard the bus for a ride to Maine Ave parking. You should have a good view of the Cherry Blossoms and the Jefferson Memorial from the van.

Next, we will walk to the Japanese Lantern and around the west side of the Tidal Basin to the Jefferson Memorial (pictured above) for a guided tour. Then our guide will walk us to Maine Ave for lunch. After lunch, our van will take us back to the lodge. Dress for the weather and wear walking shoes. Don't forget ca.m.eras and hiking poles. Antietam National Battlefield Tour April 5, 2024

If you ever wanted to spend a day learning more about the history of the area and the role that the Battle of Antietam (Sharpsburg) had in shaping the outcome of the Civil War, this is your chance. Our neighbors and Civil War enthusiasts, Sam Kerns and Rick Turner, will

lead you on the journey to help you understand what happened on the deadliest day in US military history, which may have been the turning point of the Civil War, and what led to President Lincoln's decision to announce the Emancipation Proclamation.

Widely considered to be one of the most beautiful, pristine, and well-preserved Civil War battlefields, Antietam is a must-see for any Civil War enthusiast. The Antietam National Battlefield has an excellent Visitor Center which is a good place to start our visit. Itinerary:

8:05 a.m. Bus leaves lodge for Antietam National Battlefield Park Visitor's Center, where we will watch an excellent film before proceeding upstairs (there is an elevator) to the battlefield observation room, where a park ranger/historian will give an overview of the battle.

Please note: Bring your National Parks Pass to avoid the \$10.00 Visitor's Center fee. One pass will cover up to four people.

Schedule:

- 9:30 to 10 Film at the Visitor's Center.
- 10 to 10:45 Park Ranger talks about the battle.
- 10:45 to 11:15 After a very short walk to Dunkard Church (optional) where the bus will pick us up to tour the northern end of the battlefield.
- 11:30 to 12:30 Lunch at Bonnie's at The Red Byrd 19409 Shepherdstown Road.
- 1:00 to 1:40 Sunken Road stop and discussion (out of bus) Some may want to take an
 optional short walk on the Bloody Lane Trail to get a perspective from the advancing
 Union soldiers.
- 1:50 to 2:45 Burnside Bridge stop (brief walk to bridge)
- 2:45 to 3:30 Tour the southern end of the battlefield and see where battle ended.
- Our final stop will be at the Bavarian Inn Resort and Brewery in Shepherdstown, on the south side of the Potomac River (8 miles from the battlefield) for an hour or so of relaxation, before returning to the lodge about 6:00 p.m.

The minimum for this trip is 15 and maximum is 20. Registration is \$60 for transportation. Park fee, Lunch, Bavarian Inn, and driver's tip are not included.
