# **Luray and Shenandoah Caverns**

Sixteen travellers left the Lodge at 8 a.m. in a Shenandoah Shuttle, driven by Julie, and headed for Luray Caverns. As we crossed the bridges over the North and South Forks of the Shenandoah River on Routes 522 & 340 into Front Royal we talked about the town's history, name, places to eat, and sites to see. These routes split in Front Royal, with 522 going east of town over Chester Gap, and 340 going west along the South Branch of the Shenandoah, passing the entrances to Shenandoah National Park and Shenandoah State Park. Front Royal may have derived its name from the fact it was on the Indian Frontier of the Royal British Colony of Virginia. They have free summer concerts at the pavilion on Main Street.

We arrived at Luray Caverns about 9 a.m., just as they opened. They are America's largest and most popular caverns. From well-lighted, paved walkways, we explored cathedral-sized rooms with ceilings 10 stories high, filled with towering stone columns and crystal-clear pools, and heard the haunting sounds of the world's only Stalactite Organ creating music of

symphonic quality from stone formations. When we finished our tour, we noticed a busload of students arriving; glad we were ahead of them.



After the caverns we explored the grounds, which includes a café and souvenir shop, an antique car museum, a huge evergreen maze, and a small frontier village with a museum of early American artifacts. One of the large buildings, which may have been a schoolhouse, had a café on the lower level,

with a covered outdoor seating area. This is where we had lunch. I ordered a generous brisket sandwich with Route 11 chips and a Devils Backbone Vienna Lager served in a souvenir mason jar, Others in our group had similar sandwiches and sides. The cafe had a limited selection of wine and soft drinks. We gathered at tables on the patio to enjoy our lunch and conversations.











Julie picked us up at the entrance to the village and headed our bus to our next stop, Shenandoah Caverns. We drove through Page Valley and over Massanutten Mountain on Route 211 to the town of New Market, where we headed north on I-81. When we arrived at Shenandoah Caverns, a more modest site, they were expecting us and soon took us on a group tour of the caverns, which took about one hour. The tour ended on an upper level, named Main Street USA, with animated storefront displays from a bygone era, and a huge display of goldilocks and the Three Bears. Wow! The main floor of the caverns has an old-fashioned soda fountain, complete with bar stools and tables. I had a vanilla milkshake that took me back to my teens while I waited for the tour to end.



Wolf Gap Vineyard was our last stop. This is not a place you find by accident. After making several turns on country roads west of I-81 and passing two country churches, we found the vineyard. It is a modest winery with indoor and outdoor seating and a broad selection of wines. The two attendants welcomed us and explained our options. We soon made our selections and gathered around tables inside and outside to enjoy wine and conversation. All too soon, Bill Johnson (pictured here) reminded us it was time to leave if were to remain on schedule. We returned our trays and glasses, thanked our attendants, boarded the bus and headed home.

Julie's GPS surprised me by taking us to the Lord Fairfax exit rather than I-66. It was a better choice, and we were soon back at the Lodge. We tipped Julie, said our goodbyes, and headed home. Another successful trip!

Located on the same latitude as Napa and southern Italy, a large variety of grapes can be grown providing the wine enthusiast with world class flavors and bouquets. All the wineries being visited today have cheese and charcuterie plates for purchase, and Naked Mountain also has a selection of sandwiches, or you are welcome to bring your own food to enjoy outside. Barrel Oak also has a brewery for those who might be interested in that.

# **Summer Brewery Tour - August 8, 2025**



Some of these breweries were closed for our St. Patrick's Day Tour because it was a Monday. We will attempt again on Friday. Our area is home to many popular breweries. For this trip we have selected three not far from Lake Frederick. Our first stop will be Chilley Hollow Brewing Company Lake Frederick Travel Club a new craft brewery located on the rolling hills of an operating cattle farm near Berryville, Virginia. It offers beer crafted on site by an award-winning brewmaster as well as local wine, cider, bar food, and grass-fed beef raised right in the brewhouse's backyard.



Our second stop, Bluemont Station Brewery & Winery, offers craft beer, local wine, and a variety of food in a colonial mansion setting near Bluemont, Virginia, on the east side of the Blue Ridge. Visit their Facebook page for more information.



Lost Barrel Brewing, a favorite of the Middleburg crowd is our third stop. It is a large facility with a variety of food and drink with indoor and outdoor seating Lake Frederick Travel Club.
