Great Smoky Mountain Memories:

Dollywood, Titanic Museum & Hatfield & McCoy Dinner July 19-21, 2022

George & Michelle Darnell and Zoe Ann Brown from Lake Frederick joined about twenty other Virginia travelers on this Shenandoah Tours trip. Six of us boarded a Quick Motor Coach at the Red Roof Inn at I-81 & Rt 50 at 6 a.m. on Tuesday. We left our cars in the parking lot with special tour placards on the dashboard. Each of us was provided one tag for a checked bag and

allowed one carry-on for the trip. It was a luxury coach with luggage storage, a restroom, and "kneeling" entry steps with grab rails on both sides to make boarding and exiting easier.

We travelled down I-81 as the sun rose, picking up travelers in Woodstock, Mount Jackson, Harrisonburg, and Staunton, where a van brought travelers from Waynesboro and Charlottesville. Two ladies from the Fredericksburg area had spent the night in Charlottesville. Our tour guide, Joanne, joined us on the bus in Staunton and gave us our name tags and trip information. We continued on I-81, making rest stops at McDonalds for breakfast around 9 a.m. and lunch at Cracker Barrel in Bristol around noon. Then on to Pigeon Forge, TN.

We arrived at our hotel, The Inn on the River (Pigeon), around 3 p.m. Joanne had us all checked in and had our bags brought to our rooms. We had time to unpack and relax before we boarded the bus for the Hatfield and McCoy Dinner Theater. Joanne ushered us to our four-person balcony tables. Our table partners were Arnold and Phyllis from Blue Ridge Shadows in Warren County. They have been married 63 years and were long-time residents of Front Royal. They almost bought in Trilogy when they downsized, but no homes were available when their home sold and they had to move.



Our meal of fried chicken, barbeque, mashed potatoes, and cole slaw was served family style. Generous jars of tea or lemonade accompanied the meal, as well as soup and dessert. The show was a musical comedy modeled very loosely on the legendary feud. We attended the early show, so we had plenty of time to relax in the hotel or use the local trolley to explore the area afterwards.



Wednesday started with the hotel's included breakfast buffet at 7 a.m. We had time to sit in rocking chairs on a patio overlooking the river and feed the ducks and geese that wandered the grounds. Our bus took us to Dollywood Park to use our included tickets. We went through a scanner and bag check at the entrance. We were allowed one bottle of water to carry in and cups of water were available free in the park. The park is large with many rides and shows, enough to over two days. Michelle and I enjoyed two shows: the Kingdom Heirs gospel quartet; and a laser light bubble presentation that thrilled kids of all ages. The theaters are huge.

After a lunch of foot-long hot dogs, curly fries, and coke, we found the Dollywood Railroad and took a ride. The day was very hot. So, we made our way back to the entrance to meet our bus for early departure at 2 p.m. When we boarded the bus, we discovered that everyone had decided to leave early because of the heat. We were on own for dinner but had time to cool off in our room or in the indoor and outdoor pools at the hotel first. Our hotel only served breakfast. So, some folks took




the local trolley to specialty restaurants around Pigeon Forge. But Michelle and I walked to a casual family-style restaurant next door.



We had a heavy thunderstorm Wednesday night that tapered off in the morning. The shallow peaceful river by the hotel was a raging muddy torrent sweeping fallen trees and other debris past us. We packed our bags and left them in the hall for a 7:45 a.m. pick up. Our baggage handling reminded us of being on a cruise.

After breakfast, the bus took us to the Titanic Museum. We were greeted by a very knowledgeable guide who ushered us through the museums many rooms modeled after various rooms in the Titanic, including the grand staircase, captain's bridge, boiler room, first-class quarters, and music room. She told us the story of the building of the Titanic and many famous people who sailed on the maiden voyage. She also told us about some of the inaccuracies in the film version of the Titanic. This museum was worth the trip and I won't spoil it for anyone by telling you more.





Our last stop in Pigeon Forge was "The Island," a shopping and lodging area surrounded by water. It has a large pool in the middle with a waterfall and multiple dancing fountains that are timed to famous hit music of our era. Rocking chairs surround the pool. There is a huge Ferris Wheel, like the one in National Harbor, behind the shops. Michelle enjoyed a large ice cream cone while we watched the fountain display. They must be spectacular when lit up at night.

We had time for lunch on our own before boarding the bus for home. Michelle and I chose Margaritaville, a huge two-floor restaurant with indoor and outdoor seating. Finally, we boarded our bus and didn't stop until we reached the Virginia Welcome Center on I-81. We stopped again for food at a McDonald's near Roanoke before making the final push for home. We stopped along the way to let folks off where they got on. We changed drivers in Staunton as we had done on Tuesday morning. Construction on I-81 before the I-66 junction delayed or return to the Red Roof Inn in Winchester. The final six travelers loaded our bags into our cars, waited to make sure everyone's car was OK, and drove home about 10 p.m. The trip was well planned, organized, and executed. Gettysburg Battlefield Bus Tour

August 18, 2022

If you always wanted to know more about the largest battle ever fought in North America, Gettysburg, join two of our own Gettysburg enthusiasts (Sam Kerns

and Rick Turner), for a day trip to the hollowed grounds of the Gettysburg National Battlefield Park. On our trip to the battlefield, they will share what happened during the Gettysburg Campaign, including events in our own back yard. The time on the battlefield will give you an overview of the events with a few interesting stories about some of the 165,000 participants.

8:00 a.m. Depart the lodge in a 55-passenger deluxe motorcoach. Sam and Rick will present material on the way.

9:30 a.m. Rest Stop at the Sheetz in Thurmont, MD, then on to Gettysburg Battlefield

Stop 1: The Eternal Light (Day 1 of Battle)

Stop 2: Lee Monument (Days 2 and 3)

Stop 3: Lunch at the Appalachian Brewery located on the battlefield, Menu and beer selection can be found at <abcheve.com/battlefield>.

Stop 4: Peach Orchard (Day 2)

Stop 5: First Minnesota Regiment Monument (Final stop of Day 2)

Stop 6: The Angle (Pickett's Charge Day 3) Highwater mark of the Confederacy

Return home with rest stop just south of Gettysburg at the Mason/Dixon Welcome Center (around 4:15) 6:00 p.m. Return to lodge.

Minimum for this trip is 30 and maximum is 50. Registration is \$60 for transportation and printing of handouts. Lunch and driver tip are not included. A check had to be received to the "Lake Frederick Travel Club" with contact info and date of trip with lodge concierge no later than July 31, 2022.
