# **Antietam Battlefield Trip**

**September 16, 2021** 

On September 16, 1862, the Armies of the Union and the Confederacy converged on the small farming community of Sharpsburg, Maryland between Antietam Creek, and the Potomac River. The ensuing battle, which started at first light on September 17th, lasting 12 hours and is known as the bloodiest day in American history. This battle result in over 23,000 American casualties (killed, wounded, and missing).

Twenty-two members of the Lake Frederick Travel Club pulled away from the Shenandoah Club at 8 o'clock on that foggy morning, which very much resembled the day of the battle at Antietam National Battlefield, 159 years earlier according to tour leader John Toliver. The one-hour bus ride took them through the beautiful Virginia, West Virginia, & Maryland countryside, arriving at the Antietam Visitors Center. The group watched the park service movie about the battle and then met their tour guide, Mr. Jim Rosebrock.



From the New York monument and the initial Confederate line on the west, the members overlooked the entire battlefield and the distant, but prominent South Mountain to the East, where McClellan's Union army of 87.000 troops would have come. Antietam Creek lay below dividing the two armies, totaling 132,000 men. Guide

Rosebrock laid out the events that preceded the battle, why Lee's Army of the South, 45,000 strong, was invading the North, the military and political significance of the battle, and the Generals who engaged in the battle. He briefly described where the main events



occurred, which became the four stops the group would experience, starting with Dunker Church. The Cornfield to the north, the Bloody Lane in the center, and Burnside's Bridge to the south would complete the group's tour.



By 11:00 a.m. at the Cornfield where the Union line emerged from the fog in the

cornstalk rows at first light. Mr. Rosebrock described how the northern army under General Joseph Hooker and the southern army under General Stonewall Jackson fought back and forth through the standing corn for over three hours. Men died at



a rate of one per second, but in the end, the southern forces held their position with thousands of casualties laying before them among the flattened stalks.

At noon at Bloody Lane, which was a sunken lane at the center of the north-south battle line. At this site, the southern troops held off several union charges, inflicting horrible casualties on mostly untried Union soldiers, until the Irish

Brigade from New York breached the southern end of the Lane. From their enfilade position the Union soldiers inflicted such




massive casualties on the southern troops that the lane they had been fighting from ran red with blood and the Confederates fell back several-hundred yards.

At 12:40 p.m. the hungry group arrived at their final stop, Burnside Bridge at the southern end of the battlefield. If the North had been able to quickly cross over this little Antietam Creek bridge (12 ft. wide and 125 ft. long), they might have turned General Lee's right flank, taken the battle, and possibly ended



Civil War. But 400 men from Georgia held off 8,000 troops in several Union charges across the bridge until they ran out of ammunition late in the day and were forced to fall back toward



crossed the Potomac and retreated into Virginia. Nine months later they would return to Sharpsburg on their way to Gettysburg.

Guide Rosebrock summarized what we had seen, and our battlefield tour was over at 1:30 p.m. We cannot

say enough about our Guide, who was the best tour guide ever. He was very well-versed, left the group in suspense at each stop, and totally held their attention during the entire tour. After a quick pit stop at the Battlefield Center, the group was off to Shepherdstown and the Bavarian Inn for lunch where the setting was beautiful and



the food and drink very good. After lunch George Darnell took us for a leisurely stroll through the town established in 1762, and then we headed home, arriving back at the clubhouse eight minutes ahead of schedule.
