

Who is organizing and managing Chickamauga 160?

- Atlanta Campaign, Inc. is a 501(c3) non-profit that sponsors and manages Civil War Reenactments to support Historic Battlefield Preservation. Past events include Stones River 2021, Mill Springs 2019, Shiloh 2017 and Atlanta (2001 – 2014.) Planning is also currently underway for Franklin 160 in 2024.

When and where will Chickamauga 160 be held?

- Chickamauga 160 will be located at 222 Walker County Industrial Drive, LaFayette, GA 30728 (over 540 acres) on September 22 through 24, 2023.

How much is the Reenactor fee for Chickamauga 160?

- The Reenactor Fee has been set at \$20 until 9/1/2023; after this date the Fee will be \$35. Walk-ons will pay \$35 on-site in cash. There are no other fees. Hay and Ice will be offered for sale at cost.

How much will it cost Visitors and when can they attend Chickamauga 160?

- Adults will pay \$15 each; Children 6 to 17 pay \$5 each; Children 5 and under are free.
- There is a parking fee of \$5 for each vehicle.
- Visitors are welcome to tour the camps and visit Sutlers between 9am and 5pm on Saturday and Sunday, (September 23 & 24.)

What time are the battles on Saturday and Sunday for Visitors?

- A battle for Visitors will occur at 2pm on Saturday and Sunday at the designated battlefield.

What is the best way of registering me and/or my unit for Chickamauga 160?

- When you register on the website <https://chickamauga160.wufoo.com/forms/m6bq23o1a6jobd/>, please register your entire unit at one time rather than one offs.
- When registering one person only on the website, do not fill in the money box as it registers your fee automatically.
- When registering more than one person on the website, only put the amount for the extra people in the money box and do not include yourself as it will automatically total all registrants.
- The cut-off date for registration substitutions is **September 11th** ; contact us at info@chickamauga.com

Where can I get updated information on a regular basis or ask a question about Chickamauga 160?

Will Artillery bounties be available?

- All Artillery units must have a full 6 man crew in order to collect a bounty. No exceptions.
- The Artillery Commander will determine if a unit can take the field with less than a 6 man crew.
- Artillery will be limited to a maximum of 40 guns (20 Federal & 20 CSA); this excludes horse drawn artillery. At this time (June 2023), both CSA and Federal Artillery is full. However; there are still slots available for Full Horse-drawn Artillery.
- Please bring a full 6 man crew with you and avoid recruiting infantry to get your numbers up.

Will I be able to access my tent by car or pick-up after I have set-up camp?

- No car traffic will be allowed in or out of the camps; once you have set-up camp, you cannot move your vehicle in-or-out of the property to reach your campsite.
- You cannot keep your vehicle in the park all day; you will need to get in, unload and move out.
- There is a plan to have some type of shuttle service between Reenactor parking and the front gate.

How early will I be able to set-up camp before the weekend of the event?

- Staff will be on-site on Monday, September 18, 2023.
- Please come early and set-up to beat the rush; Commanders have been asked to be on-site no later than Wednesday, September 20, 2023.

How soon can I leave the site after the last battle on Sunday?

- Expect a longer delay leaving the site after the last battle due to the event layout; this is especially true for the CS Infantry camp.
- Vehicles must stay out of camp until 5pm on Sunday.
- Consider camping Sunday night and leaving Monday if that is possible.

How does a Sutler sign-up and how much will it cost for Chickamauga 160?

- We have reached the maximum number of Sutlers for Chickamauga 160.
- Sutlers may go ahead and mail in an application using the form on the website and we will place you on a waiting list.
- Sutlers will either pay \$75 or 15 cents a square foot whichever is higher.
- All Sutlers in camp must pay a fee unless they are selling only a few items, and then there is no charge.
- No unauthorized commercial activity will allowed.

Can I or a friend bring and use a drone at the event?

- **No drones** can be flown over the site without prior permission.

Are there any hotels or motels nearby?

- There are some motels near the event in LaFayette but even more opportunities in the vicinity North and East of the C160 location off Hwy 27 North.
- You might also want to investigate AirBnB type properties in the area.
- **There is an Ironman Competition this same weekend in Chattanooga; it may be better for you to reserve your room(s) now rather than waiting at the last minute.**

Is there a recommended route that a vehicle with a Trailer (ie. Cavalry, Artillery, Sutler, etc.) should use to reach the Chickamauga 160 site?

- When heading up I-75 North and your vehicle is pulling a trailer, then you should avoid GA Highway 136 between Calhoun/Resaca and Lafayette GA in order to avoid curvy roads along some mountainous terrain. It is recommended that you go further north to Ringgold and take the Battlefield Parkway West to GA Highway 27 and go south to the C160 site. GPS will want to route you via GA Highway 136 but it is recommended that you do not use this route to the site.
- For vehicles arriving from the North, you can pick-up GA Highway 27 in Chattanooga and head south.
