

Police Matters

Hopefully everyone will have noticed that the team from SmartWater have been out putting up the large blue signs notifying would-be thieves that Westbury and Yockleton is an area protected by Smart-Water, following the commitment by Westbury Parish Council to help fund the project last year. Hopefully everyone who received their pack in the post has used it and - more importantly - put the stickers in their windows to show that their home is protected. If anyone needs help in using their kit or wants advice, please get in touch with us at Pontesbury Police Office.

We are currently dealing with a high volume of incidents. Sadly we have seen quad bikes being stolen overnight and also another farm premises being targeted, so the night time thieves are still about, so make sure everything is locked up and bolted down overnight. Check that your security lights are still working and make sure you "lock up" in the evening to prevent unwanted visitors from helping themselves.

Following complaints from locals - there will be some Speed Enforcement Checks being conducted in both Westbury and Yockleton over the next few months.

Stay safe and please get in touch with any questions or concerns.

Please continue to lock up outbuildings and report any sightings via 101 and also via some of the excellent community Facebook pages to alert your neighbours that they are about.

If you would like PC Simon Lewis to have a walk around your property to give security advice, please get in touch. As always, keep garages, sheds and outbuildings locked and - if possible - alarmed. Simple battery powered alarms have improved and noise is always a good deterrent if a thief has managed to get into your "Lock Up". Quad bikes and push bikes continue to be popular amongst thieves, so both need chaining up/bolting down.

Security marking can help recover stolen items and there are a number of options available. Please remain vigilant and ensure everything gets locked all the time - not just last thing at night.

Keep in touch with your neighbours by telephone and - for those who use social media - post strange vehicles and unusual events. Neighbourhood Watch is nothing complicated or formal. It's just



keeping an eye out, but also letting others know - including the Police - if you have the registration numbers of vehicles that don't look or feel right. It doesn't matter if it is via Facebook, WhatsApp or a text message. Email the Police via:

If you have outside lights and security lights, make sure they are working. Any garden ornaments of value or interest need to be well secured, as do power tools and garden equipment, as they remain a desirable item for opportunist night-time thieves.

Please be aware of any unusual callers to your house or area, even those who may make themselves look legitimate by offering gardening services or asking for directions. Always try and make a note of vehicle registration numbers or anything distinctive about the vehicle and callers.

The "What's on in Westbury" Facebook page is a great way to warn everyone quickly about anything suspicious and gives others the chance to be vigilant.

Dear All

I hope you all had a lovely Christmas Break or managed to make the best of it for those who were working. Here is to a Healthy and Happy New Year and (fingers crossed) we can continue on the path to return to normality. Following on from my December update, I wanted to continue with a few points on the subject of Climate Change.

Waste and Recycling

Along with our partners (Veolia), the Council has continued to maintain a high level of Recycling. During the period 2020/21 the total waste processed was 172.186 tonnes. The percentage breakdown of that waste was 53.36% recycled/composted, 44.36% used for energy and 2.28% sent to landfill. The Battlefield Energy Recovery Facility (ERF) generates renewable heat and energy from the non-recyclable waste. Energy not used at the plant is then sold to the grid.

The 3rd Bin

Mixed recycling has proved to be popular with residents and hopefully will be approved at the full Council meeting this January. Once the proposal is passed, then a Request Procedure will be initiated. The Roll Out will begin in March/April 2022 and is likely to take up to three months to complete. It is anticipated that the **3rd bin** will result in a greater percentage of recycling. Shropshire is presently in the top 20% of Unitary Authorities for Recycling. The aim is to get up to the top 5%. Recycling has been the main contributor to our carbon reduction during the past year. It is anticipated that the **3rd Bin** for Mixed Recycling will further improve that rating.

Electric Vehicle Chargers

The installation of $50 \times public Electric Vehicle Chargers has started. The aim is to have all <math>50$ installed by the end of Spring 2022. The chargers are 7Kw. These can be load balanced down to 3.5Kw. Shropshire Council will contribute £30,000 and the remainder will be paid through Grant Funding. Phase 1 will see installations at the following locations:

Oswestry, Whitchurch, Shrewsbury, Bridgnorth, Ellesmere, Bishops Castle, Ludlow and Market Drayton.

Over the coming months, we are due to see resurfacing of some of the major roads locally which are in a poor condition. I will try and update through various social media, as and when roads are closed.

Reflections for January 2022

A while ago when I was preparing notes for a service or writing a sermon, I started using Arial 14 font on my computer, as the old 12 font was becoming quite blurred when read in the light of any of our three Church buildings. Now, even 14 font is a struggle and I need reading glasses – which I often forget and leave at home; sermons have to be ad-lib, as my notes often appear blurred. My wife and I joke sometimes that she has to read everything on food package labels or scripts in museums, but I come into my own on roads and motorways when the signs are about a hundred yards away and I can read them perfectly, whereas she can't.

But I notice - when I am at a graveside or conducting an outdoor service - that then I don't need glasses; the writing is clear and easy to read. Natural light, the light that came into the world, created by God on day one, which he 'saw was good' is much clearer and healthier than any light that is man-made. Archbishop Stephen Cottrell suggests that we can liken this principle to our daily living too, if we look at the world through the eyes of God, then we suddenly notice more detail (more need, more people created in the image of God). Jesus Christ - the scripture tells us in John Chapter 1 - came into the world to teach love and inclusion and the world recognised him not.

When I was in my teens I was a great follower of Bob Dylan's protest music. In his famous song "Blowin' in the wind" he sings: "how many times can a man turn his head and pretend that he just doesn't see?"

Wouldn't it be great if this New Year we could all turn over a new leaf - and our Government too ? - and take a moment to allow God's natural light to clear our vision; then we would see the beauty of the earth and the beauty of each other. Over the last couple of years, Covid has taught us to watch out for each other in practical ways; we don't want to lose this learning but build on it; as a Nation we could do this materially and politically.

It is possible that the visit of the wise men (the Magi) is about this very issue. When they came to pay homage to Jesus, they were in a sense looking at the world in a new light – the Magi weren't even from Israel but probably Persia; they weren't even Jews, but Zoroastrian and – as wealthy men of high esteem – they had little in common with Galilean peasants and yet they brought all manner of spiritual insight and practical gifts to a young couple and a child starting out in life.

Verse 4 of William Dix's "As with gladness":

In the heavenly city bright

none shall need created light

you, its light, its joy, its crown,

you its sun which goes not down;

there for ever may we sing

alleluias to our king.





Introduction

Since the introduction of the Local Policing Community Charter, the rural west safer neighbourhood team have been working to address those priorities identified to Police by partner agencies and the public. There are 11 Parish Councils on the rural west area.



Priority Theft from Farms/ Outbuildings

There has been a slight increase in Thefts from farms in the area

A number of issues listed below were prioritised over the last three months, and we have worked to address those issues taking actions listed below. We are always keen to hear directly from members of the public so please feel free to contact the team.

What have we done?

The reported incidents have been attended by the SNT and/or the Rural and Business Crime Officer to identify potential links and crime prevention measures. Key locations have also formed part of targeted patrols by SNT and Patrol officers. Reassurance visits and foot patrols have been conducted due to reports of suspicious activity in Alberbury and Bicton

Additional support has been sought from the 'We Don't Buy Crime' team to consider other tactics to prevent further offences, in conjunction with dedicated operations to target those using the road network to travel to Shropshire to commit rural crime.

In addition to this the introduction of Neighbourhood Matters messaging platform will allow real time information to be shared about any recent crimes & suspicious activity to help with disruption and prevention.



Priority - Speeding

Speeding continues to be a major concern for a number of residents and parishes across the Policing area.

What have we done?

Officers have been carrying out speed monitoring and enforcement in various locations across the Policing area, this has been supported by the roads Policing team during the National Speed Awareness campaign. SNT will continue with speed enforcement and work with the safer roads team as well as the council to address these

concerns. All Parishes have been monitored and SNT have shown a visible presence during key times of the day.Please contact the SNT should there be any further locations that we may need to look at.

What have we done?

Increased high visibility foot patrols are being conducted by SNT and Patrol officers to provide increased visibility and reassurance whilst also deterring ASB and crime with the presence of officers and PCSO at the key locations. SNT have engaged with communities during Halloween weekend to provide reassurance after an increase in antisocial behaviour. Interventions have also been put in place to engage with local children causing problems in some areas. We have spoken to local businesses and are working with schools and housing authorities to alleviate the issues.

Key dates/campaigns/other news

The Safer Neighbourhood Team are a relatively new team finding our way around a vast a busy area. Whilst it is not always possible we are making every effort to do as much patrolling on foot in order to engage with the communities in each village. We hope, in the new year to establish regular surgeries in order to discuss any issues. We are always open to new ideas and suggestions.

Neighbourhood Matters! Community messaging system launches

People can now keep up to date with local policing news following the launch of a brand new community messaging service for residents living in the West Mercia Police area.

The new system, called Neighbourhood Matters, enables residents, businesses and community groups across Herefordshire, Worcestershire, Shropshire and Telford to find out more about what is happening in their local community. It also gives them the opportunity to contact police officers and local policing teams directly so they can raise any concerns and provide feedback.

It is a free service and those who sign up can choose to receive news and appeals, local crime information and crime prevention advice via a number of different channels.

Assistant Chief Constable Rachel Jones, said: "We are delighted to launch Neighbourhood Matters as a key part of our Local Policing and Community Charter. The new messaging service will help us to work more closely with the public, build strong community relationships and both reduce and prevent crime.

"Our Local Policing and Community Charter, launched in March this year, outlines how we will ensure we provide a visible policing presence within communities. Using local face-to-face engagement, social media and new digital channels, we will create further opportunities for dialogue so the public can raise concerns, provide feedback, be involved and help shape policing.

"Intelligence received from our communities is vital in preventing and detecting crime and antisocial behaviour. Neighbourhood Matters will be another mechanism that people can use to pass on information and concerns, speak directly to local teams and keep up-to-date with policing in their area. By working together to share information we can make a real difference."

The messages people receive will be targeted and based on their location and preferences selected by each individual. The public can sign up for local updates from their neighbourhood policing team, or join a number of specialised community interest groups such as Business Watch, wildlife crime and crime prevention.

We would encourage as many people as possible to sign up for the free alerts where you can see real time messages, crime prevention advice and be aware of any recent crimes or suspicious activity in your area. STANDARD INFORMATION FOR ANY NEW BUSINESS WISHING TO ADVERTISE IN THE MONTHLY WESTBURY AND YOCKLETON NEWSLETTER

Standard (minimum) Size Adverts: These are all in boxes sized 7.90 cm x 5.43 cm (landscape layout only), about the size of a business card and cost £2.50 per month. Minimum booking is for 6 months @ £15.00. I will email you again asking if you wish to book for a further six months during the last month that your advertisement appears. You may of course book for 12 months @ £30.00*. If you book for a year in advance, you get a "secure placement" which will carry on for as long as you want it to, subject to your paying the renewal invoices on time. New adverts start on the back page and - month by month move forward column-by-column towards page two, after which they re-start at the back. This ensures that all businesses receive equal coverage throughout the year. As there is a small turnover in the adverts, they will also slowly move up and down the page. Printing will be in full web colours

Before sending me your advert PRINT this sheet out and make sure your advert fits the relevant box and is readable at that size.

7.90 cm

This is the minimum size advert allowed. 6 months is the minimum you can book.

5.43cm

6 months 6 x £2.50 - Total £15.00

12 months + secure placement $12 \times £2.50$ - Total £30.00*

79.0 x 54.3mm (2mm all round inner margin)

7.90 cm

We run double standard size adverts i.e. 7.9cm wide x 10.86cm deep

The minimum number of months you can book is six, so that would be:

6 months

6 x £5.00 - Total £30.00

12 months + secure placement $12 \times £5.00$ - Total £60.00*

Double size

79.0 x 108.6mm (2mm all round inner margin)

Other Size Adverts:

- A Full (A4) page advert, this is priced at £30 per month and is in portrait layout. There is no minimum number of months for which a full A4 size page advert may be booked in advance.
- A Half (A4) page advert, this is priced at £15 per month and needs to be in landscape layout. The minimum number of months for which a half A4 page size advert can be booked in advance is six.

All adverts submitted need to be no lower than 200dpi for print quality and sent to me as a JPG – but separately attached to your covering email, rather than being copied/pasted into the body of your email.

As a guide, I need to receive the graphic of any new business advert about halfway through the preceding month, so that I can email the business concerned with a pdf copy of their advert (as it will appear on the relevant page) for their approval. Once the business has confirmed they are happy with the advert and the number of months for which they wish to book, I will email an invoice and, as soon as payment has been received, the advert will be included in the next issue of the Newsletter.

For secure slots, I will email a single "invitation to renew" invoice once your last paid for advert is published. I will not publish an advert which is unpaid after the expiry date on the invoice. If you pay late, you are at risk of losing the secure slot.

PAYMENT

We cannot accept payment by BACCs or Credit or Debit cards - only Cheques which need to be drawn in favour of Westbury Village Hall (who provide us with banking facilities) but posted to me at the address given below so that I may photocopy each cheque for my Newsletter records before passing it on to our Village Hall Committee's Treasurer to be credited to our Sub-Account within their main account.

Please let me know which size advert you prefer and for how many months you wish to book, so that I can then invoice you – it would be good to get your advert into our next issue. However, we do require receipt of payment <u>before</u> we place an advert.

For our records, I need the name of your business, your postal address, your email address and your landline and mobile telephone numbers. We are no longer able to absorb postal charges within the above costings. If you cannot provide me with an e-mail address to send your invoices, I need to add a charge to each invoice to cover the cost of posting a paper copy. The initial invoice will carry a charge of £2 to cover itself and the first renewal invoice. Subsequent renewal invoices will carry a £1 charge to cover the next renewal invoice. If you need a receipt on paper, please enclose a stamped addressed envelope with your payment.

Several of the businesses have stated that they find our Newsletter is a very cost-effective advertising platform and we appreciate the financial support we gain from them as we are running the Newsletter on a voluntary basis with no grant from Westbury Parish Council or any other funding or any profit.

My deadline for News items is the last Monday in the previous month, unless that Monday happens to be a Bank Holiday - when it will be the last Tuesday in the previous month. If, however, the last Monday in the previous month is too close to the end of the month to give me time to produce the Newsletter, I will advise accordingly which month your advertisement will commence.
