

Police Matters

Hopefully everyone will have noticed that the team from SmartWater have been out putting up the large blue signs notifying would-be thieves that Westbury and Yockleton is an area protected by Smart-Water, following the commitment by Westbury Parish Council to help fund the project last year. Hopefully everyone who received their pack in the post has used it and - more importantly - put the stickers in their windows to show that their home is protected. If anyone needs help in using their kit or wants advice, please get in touch with us at Pontesbury Police Office.

We are currently dealing with a high volume of incidents. Sadly we have seen quad bikes being stolen overnight and also another farm premises being targeted, so the night time thieves are still about, so make sure everything is locked up and bolted down overnight. Check that your security lights are still working and make sure you "lock up" in the evening to prevent unwanted visitors from helping themselves.

Following complaints from locals - there will be some Speed Enforcement Checks being conducted in both Westbury and Yockleton over the next few months.

Stay safe and please get in touch with any questions or concerns.

Please continue to lock up outbuildings and report any sightings via 101 and also via some of the excellent community Facebook pages to alert your neighbours that they are about.

If you would like PC Simon Lewis to have a walk around your property to give security advice, please get in touch. As always, keep garages, sheds and outbuildings locked and - if possible - alarmed. Simple battery powered alarms have improved and noise is always a good deterrent if a thief has managed to get into your "Lock Up". Quad bikes and push bikes continue to be popular amongst thieves, so both need chaining up/bolting down.

Security marking can help recover stolen items and there are a number of options available. Please remain vigilant and ensure everything gets locked all the time - not just last thing at night.

Keep in touch with your neighbours by telephone and - for those who use social media - post strange vehicles and unusual events. Neighbourhood Watch is nothing complicated or formal. It's just

If you have outside lights and security lights, make sure they are working. Any garden ornaments of value or interest need to be well secured, as do power tools and garden equipment, as they remain a desirable item for opportunist night-time thieves.

Please be aware of any unusual callers to your house or area, even those who may make themselves look legitimate by offering gardening services or asking for directions. Always try and make a note of vehicle registration numbers or anything distinctive about the vehicle and callers.

The "What's on in Westbury" Facebook page is a great way to warn everyone quickly about anything suspicious and gives others the chance to be vigilant.

That's worth getting excited about, so "No, it's not too early !"



RHS Chelsea Flower Show medal winner Julie Pearson from Bolton presented her Christmas Demonstration entitled "It's a little Festive Crafty" at our November meeting - Crafty being a play on words for making staging or items, or obtaining them from reasonably priced sources!

Julie started off the meeting with a traditional two-piece design. Seasonal foliage was dressed with white Gladiolus, Roses and Ammi, followed by some stunning pink Roselily-type Oriental Lilies, so called for their fully double blooms which boast so many petals that they resemble Roses and are pollen free - so good for people with cats! Things then went very contemporary with a twig door hanging, supporting upside down Amaryllis and a fabulous Orchid. Another hanging arrangement had a multitude of small hand-tied bunches of Orchids, Anthuriums, Beargrass and Roses held in finger-crocheted nests. Then a horizontal timber beam supporting a line of Aspidistra leaves manipulated as test tube holders, housing Sunflowers over which drifted yellow Oncidium Orchids.

Craft really came into its own with a melted wax stand made to anchor tubes and canes, providing a framework of support for baubles of bold coloured Gerberas, Eryngium, Clematis and Dendrobium Orchids. Julie's final showstopper pulled out all the tropical tricks with a bold assortment of Palm and Monstera leaves and then wowed the audience with masses of bright Heliconias, the ultimate exotic flowers.





Dear All,

Firstly I would like to take this opportunity to wish all the residents of Loton Division a very Merry Christmas and a Happy New year.

This month, following several enquiries, I thought it might be useful to update on some of the Climate Change Initiatives ongoing at Shropshire Council. This is the first of two updates.

Shropshire Council has committed to achieving Carbon Net Zero by 2030. A lot of good work has started and more is planned, but there is a lot more to do.

Power Down

The Council continues to reduce through projects and measures including:

- Switching all corporate power consumption to identifiable renewable sources.
- An on-going programme of improvements to its buildings to install additional insulation, together with low carbon heating, lighting and solar power generation, currently valued at around £1.1m (60% grant funding) and saving around 210 tonnes of carbon per year.
- Delivering the first carbon neutral road surfacing programme by any UK local authority (project won the National Highways Awards 2021), saving over 280 tonnes of carbon.
- Supporting Shropshire residents to make the transition to electric vehicles as one
 of just four UK areas to trial world-leading 'Agile Streets' on-street smart EV
 charging and installing an initial 50 new charge points in market towns across
 Shropshire using around £200,000 of Government grants.
- Working with local Housing Associations, taking steps to help residents suffering from fuel poverty and helping social housing tenants by installing £5.8m of insulation and heating improvements in Shropshire to date.
- Supporting wider community efforts to decarbonise as a founder member of Zero Carbon Shropshire and grant funding projects such as county-wide energy mapping.

The above highlights the wide range of Carbon Reduction Projects which the Council is supporting, both to reduce its own carbon footprint and to help Shropshire businesses and communities to do the same. Early indications are that our carbon usage was reduced by a further 8 to 10% over the past 12 months. That figure will be confirmed in a report in January 2022.

Power Up

- Shropshire Council has adopted an objective of becoming 'energy self-sufficient' by 2030. To help deliver this and to improve access to renewable energy for other public sector organisations and local businesses, Shropshire Council:
- Will develop a new 1MW solar farm on the former Maesbury Road landfill site in Oswestry to supply power to local businesses. There is potential for this project to expand up to 2MW.
- Is working with local electricity companies to screen its own property portfolio to identify other opportunities to generate power, either for its own use or to supply other public sector organisations and local businesses.
- Is using £70,000 Government grant funding to work with a range of local project partners, including Zero Carbon Shropshire to develop the potential for local heat networks in north Shrewsbury and Shrewsbury town centre to decarbonise heating in these areas.
- Actively examining the opportunity to attract the development of one (but possibly two) Hydrogen facilities in the County.

Healthwatch Shropshire

Report outlines the problems described by those facing food insecurity

A Healthwatch Shropshire report highlights the experiences of people in South West Shropshire who are living with food insecurity. As part of a pilot project, funded by Shaping Places for Healthier Lives programme, they worked with Shropshire Council Public Health, Citizens Advice Shropshire and the Shropshire Food Poverty Alliance members to hear from individuals and families with lived experience of food insecurity and those who work to support them.

Following the pilot project, a detailed plan was submitted to the Shaping Places for Healthier Lives programme, supported by the Health Foundation in partnership with the Local Government Association. Following a rigorous process, Shropshire Council have been awarded £300,000, over three years, to tackle food insecurity in South-west Shropshire.

The key recommendations in the report include:

- The public and voluntary sector need to work in partnership to create services which are accessible and easy to navigate.
- Improved communication to support more joined-up working across the community and public sector,
- Referral pathways to be streamlined to make sure people are able to access the right support at the right time.
- Develop 'wrap around' support for people who are in financial need to prevent them from reaching crisis.

Lynn Cawley, Healthwatch Shropshire Chief Officer, said: "We are delighted to have played a part in the project, ensuring that the voices of those experiencing food insecurity are at the heart of this work and we are really looking forward to seeing how this funding makes a difference to the health and wellbeing of those living with food poverty."

Rachel Robinson, Director of Public Health Shropshire, said: "The findings from those with a lived experience of food insecurity are especially stark and highlight this growing problem and its impact on people's health and wellbeing. I endorse the recommendations highlighted in the report and the need to work together with communities, the voluntary sector and with partners to tackle the stigma and issues raised through the research."

Healthwatch Shropshire is the independent health and social care champion in Shropshire. It gathers the views and experiences of patients, service users, carers, and the general public about services including hospitals, GPs, mental health services, community health services, pharmacists, opticians, residential care and children's services. It also has statutory powers that it can use to influence service provision by encouraging improvements.

Standard (minimum) Size Adverts: These are all in boxes sized 7.90 cm x 5.43 cm (landscape layout only), about the size of a business card and cost £2.50 per month. Minimum booking is for 6 months @ £15.00. I will email you again asking if you wish to book for a further six months during the last month that your advertisement appears. You may of course book for 12 months @ £30.00*. If you book for a year in advance, you get a "secure placement" which will carry on for as long as you want it to, subject to your paying the renewal invoices on time. New adverts start on the back page and - month by month move forward column-by-column towards page two, after which they re-start at the back. This ensures that all businesses receive equal coverage throughout the year. As there is a small turnover in the adverts, they will also slowly move up and down the page. Printing will be in full web colours

Before sending me your advert PRINT this sheet out and make sure your advert fits the relevant box and is readable at that size.

As a guide, I need to receive the graphic of any new business advert about halfway through the preceding month, so that I can email the business concerned with a pdf copy of their advert (as it will appear on the relevant page) for their approval. Once the business has confirmed they are happy with the advert and the number of months for which they wish to book, I will email an invoice and, as soon as payment has been received, the advert will be included in the next issue of the Newsletter.

For secure slots, I will email a single "invitation to renew" invoice once your last paid for advert is published. I will not publish an advert which is unpaid after the expiry date on the invoice. If you pay late, you are at risk of losing the secure slot.

PAYMENT

We cannot accept payment by BACCs or Credit or Debit cards - only Cheques which need to be drawn in favour of Westbury Village Hall (who provide us with banking facilities) but posted to me at the address given below so that I may photocopy each cheque for my Newsletter records before passing it on to our Village Hall Committee's Treasurer to be credited to our Sub-Account within their main account.

Please let me know which size advert you prefer and for how many months you wish to book, so that I can then invoice you – it would be good to get your advert into our next issue. However, we do require receipt of payment <u>before</u> we place an advert.

For our records, I need the name of your business, your postal address, your email address and your landline and mobile telephone numbers. We are no longer able to absorb postal charges within the above costings. If you cannot provide me with an e-mail address to send your invoices, I need to add a charge to each invoice to cover the cost of posting a paper copy. The initial invoice will carry a charge of £2 to cover itself and the first renewal invoice. Subsequent renewal invoices will carry a £1 charge to cover the next renewal invoice. If you need a receipt on paper, please enclose a stamped addressed envelope with your payment.

Several of the businesses have stated that they find our Newsletter is a very cost-effective advertising platform and we appreciate the financial support we gain from them as we are running the Newsletter on a voluntary basis with no grant from Westbury Parish Council or any other funding or any profit.

My deadline for News items is the last Monday in the previous month, unless that Monday happens to be a Bank Holiday - when it will be the last Tuesday in the previous month. If, however, the last Monday in the previous month is too close to the end of the month to give me time to produce the Newsletter, I will advise accordingly which month your advertisement will commence.
