### Introduction

Since the introduction of the Local Policing Community Charter, the rural west safer neighbourhood team have been working to address those priorities identified to Police by partner agencies and the public. There are 11 Parish Councils on the rural west area.



## Priority

Theft from Farms/ Outbuildings

There has been a slight increase in Thefts from farms in the area

A number of issues listed below were prioritised over the last three months, and we have worked to address those issues taking actions listed below. We are always keen to hear directly from members of the public so please feel free to contact the team.

#### What have we done?

The reported incidents have been attended by the SNT and/or the Rural and Business Crime Officer to identify potential links and crime prevention measures. Key locations have also formed part of targeted patrols by SNT and Patrol officers. Reassurance visits and foot patrols have been conducted due to reports of suspicious activity in Alberbury and Bicton

Additional support has been sought from the 'We Don't Buy Crime' team to consider other tactics to prevent further offences, in conjunction with dedicated operations to target those using the road network to travel to Shropshire to commit rural crime.

In addition to this the introduction of Neighbourhood Matters messaging platform will allow real time information to be shared about any recent crimes & suspicious activity to help with disruption and prevention.



#### **Priority - Speeding**

Speeding continues to be a major concern for a number of residents and parishes across the Policing area.

### What have we done?

Officers have been carrying out speed monitoring and enforcement in various locations across the Policing area, this has been supported by the roads Policing team during the National Speed Awareness campaign. SNT will continue with speed enforcement and work with the safer roads team as well as the council to address these

concerns. All Parishes have been monitored and SNT have shown a visible presence during key times of the day.Please contact the SNT should there be any further locations that we may need to look at.

#### What have we done?

Increased high visibility foot patrols are being conducted by SNT and Patrol officers to provide increased visibility and reassurance whilst also deterring ASB and crime with the presence of officers and PCSO at the key locations. SNT have engaged with communities during Halloween weekend to provide reassurance after an increase in antisocial behaviour. Interventions have also been put in place to engage with local children causing problems in some areas. We have spoken to local businesses and are working with schools and housing authorities to alleviate the issues.

### Key dates/campaigns/other news

The Safer Neighbourhood Team are a relatively new team finding our way around a vast a busy area. Whilst it is not always possible we are making every effort to do as much patrolling on foot in order to engage with the communities in each village. We hope, in the new year to establish regular surgeries in order to discuss any issues. We are always open to new ideas and suggestions.

## Neighbourhood Matters! Community messaging system launches

People can now keep up to date with local policing news following the launch of a brand new community messaging service for residents living in the West Mercia Police area.

The new system, called Neighbourhood Matters, enables residents, businesses and community groups across Herefordshire, Worcestershire, Shropshire and Telford to find out more about what is happening in their local community. It also gives them the opportunity to contact police officers and local policing teams directly so they can raise any concerns and provide feedback.

It is a free service and those who sign up can choose to receive news and appeals, local crime information and crime prevention advice via a number of different channels.

Assistant Chief Constable Rachel Jones, said: "We are delighted to launch Neighbourhood Matters as a key part of our Local Policing and Community Charter. The new messaging service will help us to work more closely with the public, build strong community relationships and both reduce and prevent crime.

"Our Local Policing and Community Charter, launched in March this year, outlines how we will ensure we provide a visible policing presence within communities. Using local face-to-face engagement, social media and new digital channels, we will create further opportunities for dialogue so the public can raise concerns, provide feedback, be involved and help shape policing.

"Intelligence received from our communities is vital in preventing and detecting crime and antisocial behaviour. Neighbourhood Matters will be another mechanism that people can use to pass on information and concerns, speak directly to local teams and keep up-to-date with policing in their area. By working together to share information we can make a real difference."

The messages people receive will be targeted and based on their location and preferences selected by each individual. The public can sign up for local updates from their neighbourhood policing team, or join a number of specialised community interest groups such as Business Watch, wildlife crime and crime prevention.

We would encourage as many people as possible to sign up for the free alerts where you can see real time messages, crime prevention advice and be aware of any recent crimes or suspicious activity in your area.
