

Police Matters

"Overnight Thefts" - the main area of concern - remain, with a number of incidents reported recently from the Cruckton/ Yockleton area. On this occasion they were residential properties which were targeted for petrol type power tools, but farm buildings are always a favourite. Please ensure that "expensive" items are locked or chained when not in use. Colleagues in Shrewsbury have seen an increase in thefts from vehicles and garages on the housing estates within the town overnight and this includes expensive bicycles - which is another item that requires "bolting down" - even when in a garage.

As the evenings begin to draw in, check that your security lights are still working and make sure you "lock up" earlier in the evening to prevent unwanted visitors from helping themselves, aided by the cover of more darkness. If you would like me to visit and take a walk around your property, please give me a call on 07814 042410.

Following complaints from locals - there will be some Speed Enforcement Checks being conducted in both Westbury and Yockleton over the next two months.

Stay safe and please get in touch with any questions or concerns.

Please continue to lock up outbuildings and report any sightings via 101 and also via some of the excellent community Facebook pages to alert your neighbours that they are about.

I am still working as usual and if you would like me to have a walk around your property to give security advice, please get in touch. I can manage to shout over two metres but I am missing my usual cups of tea, which would be a pre-requisite for a visit!

As always, keep garages, sheds and outbuildings locked and - if possible - alarmed. Simple battery powered alarms have improved and noise is always a good deterrent if a thief has managed to get into your "Lock Up". Quad bikes and push bikes continue to be popular amongst thieves, so both need chaining up/bolting down.

Security marking can help recover stolen items and there are a number of options available. Please remain vigilant and ensure everything gets locked all the time - not just last thing at night. Keep in touch with your neighbours by telephone and - for those who use social media - post strange vehicles and unusual events. Neighbourhood Watch is nothing complicated or formal. It's just keeping an eye out, but also letting others know - including me if you have the registration numbers of vehicles that don't look or feel right. It doesn't matter if it is via Facebook, WhatsApp or a text message. Email me and Joe Bradley via :

If you have outside lights and security lights, make sure they are working. Any garden ornaments of value or interest need to be well secured, as do power tools and garden equipment, as they remain a desirable item for opportunist night-time thieves.

Please be aware of any unusual callers to your house or area, even those who may make themselves look legitimate by offering gardening services or asking for directions. Always try and make a note of vehicle registration numbers or anything distinctive about the vehicle and callers.



Westbury Medical Centre 'Flu Season will start in Mid-September.

This year, the Clinics will have to be run differently due to the Covid-19 Virus Restrictions

Initially we will be targeting patients in Care Homes, shielding patients and our "at risk" patients who have a chronic disease such as : COPD, Chronic Kidney Disease, Chronic Heart Disease, Chronic Liver Disease, Diabetes, Splenic Dysfunction, a weakened immune system due to Cancer Treatment or a disease such as HIV/Aids. Our over 65's, pregnant women, carers and children under School Year 7 will also be targeted early. For those aged 50-64 we have to wait for further supplies from NHS England.

We will be running an appointment system, some of which will be conducted in cars in the car park, but we are hoping to be able to do some in the building. Each will be operated on a one way system.

PLEASE be PATIENT - this is all very new to us and we are trying to keep you and ourselves safe from the risk of infection.

Pneumonia Injections for the over 65's are available all year round; this is not an annual injection and you usually only need one.

Shingles Injections are also available for 70-79 year olds all year round and you only need it the once - not annually.

The vast majority of stops will be on the same day and time as before, and we hope this will continue to be the case. The situation around COVID-19 and Government Advice and Regulations - both locally and nationally - is likely to change, sometimes at short notice.

There are some changes to bear in mind when visiting the Mobile Library :

- Only one person (or household) is allowed on board at a time
- Queue outside the vehicle until allowed on board, maintain a 2 metre distance from others
- Face coverings are mandatory
- Use the hand sanitiser provided when you board
- Make your visit as brief as you can, to ensure the Mobile Library can leave to go to the next stop on time.

All Souls' Day – Monday 2nd November 2020

The end of October and beginning of November offer us some strange festivals with which some people feel uncomfortable and many misunderstand.

> All Hallows (Saints) Eve : 30th October All Saints Day 1st November All Souls' Day 2nd November

It is commonly believed - in ancient Celtic mythology - that winter and the New Year began on 1st November and, on the evening preceding it, the departed souls would return to their homes; so - to avoid the ghosts - people would wear masks and light bonfires. Whether any of this is true or not, I have no idea. It is also believed that the Roman Church in the Middle Ages put their stamp on it by changing it to a religious festival, as with many other dates.

All Souls' Day is also known as the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed and the Day of the Dead; it is a day of prayer and remembrance for the souls of those who have died. There is a variety of folklore which explains All Saints and All Souls' Days but, without getting into hot water and a debate on Church and Pagan history, we can summarise it as : All Saints Day remembering those who have died / been martyred in the cause of the Christian faith; and All Souls commemorating all of those who have died and gone before us.

One of the blessings about being a Parish Church is that, when someone dies, people often turn to the Church to take the funeral and assist the mourners to walk through their time of need, to re-assure them of the Christian hope and bring the strength they need to face tomorrow.

This year, All Souls' Day will be particularly poignant and great sensitivity is needed. At the outset of the Covid pandemic, there was a tough and immediate Lock Down which resulted in Church services being halted and funerals being reduced to a short grave-side or crematorium service with only the immediate next of kin present. We promised everyone that, once the Lock Down was over, we could have Services of Thanksgiving and Remembrance; and yet here we are - six months later - in the closing months of the year and there still appears to be no end in sight and no return to normal.

Whilst there has been some easing of the arrangements to allow thirty mourners at a funeral (although the Crematorium still only allows thirteen due to its size) we are still a long way from being able to mark the loss of our loved ones as we would like. We can't have a Wake, we can't even invite more than six people back home for a cup of tea. The loss of a loved one is hard to bear, whether your faith is strong or not and - when life is cut short in an untimely way - it makes it all the more devastating. What we all crave and what our human souls need is company..... we need one another, we need to be loved and we need people around us to share and support us in our difficult times. I believe that God made us this way, he created within us an interdependence so that the stronger can support the weak in their hour of need. Despite the difficulties of the Covid restrictions, I have heard many stories of neighbourly care - love, flowers, meals prepared and left on doorsteps - just practical ways of saying "you matter to us" !

Westbury and Worthen Food Banks and Hubs are another great example of how people want to support each other in times of need.

As we approach this season of festivals, we will need to remember those who have suffered loss and so to be very sensitive at this time, especially if your household is planning any "Halloween activities".

On Sunday 1st November, we are hoping to have a special Service of Remembrance and Thanksgiving for the lives of all those souls who have departed over the last year. Numbers are - at the time of writing - not restricted, as this type of service is exempt; but we will need to observe social distancing which will reduce the capacity of the Church buildings.

Connecting Shropshire : Programme Update : September 2020

<u>Top-up Voucher Scheme</u> – http://connectingshropshire.co.uk/gigabit-broadband-voucher-scheme

Shropshire Council has made up to £1 million of additional funding available to 'top-up' the Gigabit Broadband Voucher Scheme in partnership with the Department for Digital, Culture, Media & Sport (DCMS).

The purpose of this strategic investment is to support those premises currently not included in any Connecting Shropshire contract.

For homes, the maximum funding per voucher will be £4,000, thanks to an extra £2,500 per voucher from Shropshire Council. Eligible businesses can receive an additional £3,500 bringing the maximum funding per voucher to £7,000. To qualify for the Scheme, groups of two or more residents/businesses must be located in a rural area and be unable to get broadband speeds of 100Mbps.

How does the Voucher Scheme work ?

The chart overleaf shows the step-by-step process that each voucher recipient will go through to activate their voucher:

3	Your supplier installs the infrastructure required to deliver your new broadband connection;						
4	Once you are connected, your supplier lets DCMS know the work is done;

6	DCMS may make further checks, including a site visit, before they pay your supplier.
