Police Matters

"Overnight Thefts" - the main area of concern - remain. Residential properties are often targeted for petrol type power tools, and farm buildings are always a favourite. Please ensure that "expensive" items are locked or chained when not in use. Colleagues in Shrewsbury have seen an increase in thefts from vehicles and garages on the housing estates within the town overnight and this includes expensive bicycles - which is another item that requires "bolting down" - even when in a garage.

Now evenings have drawn in, check that your security lights are still working and make sure you "lock up" earlier in the evening to prevent unwanted visitors from helping themselves, aided by the cover of more darkness. If you would like me to visit and take a walk around your property, please give me a call on 07814 042410.

Following complaints from locals - there will be some Speed Enforcement Checks being conducted in both Westbury and Yockleton over the next few months.

Stay safe and please get in touch with any questions or concerns.

Please continue to lock up outbuildings and report any sightings via 101 and also via some of the excellent community Facebook pages to alert your neighbours that they are about.

I am still working as usual and if you would like me to have a walk around your property to give security advice, please get in touch. I can manage to shout over two metres but I am missing my usual cups of tea, which would be a pre-requisite for a visit!

As always, keep garages, sheds and outbuildings locked and - if possible - alarmed. Simple battery powered alarms have improved and noise is always a good deterrent if a thief has managed to get into your "Lock Up". Quad bikes and push bikes continue to be popular amongst thieves, so both need chaining up/bolting down.

Security marking can help recover stolen items and there are a number of options available. Please remain vigilant and ensure everything gets locked all the time - not just last thing at night. Keep in touch with your neighbours by telephone and - for those who use social media - post strange vehicles and unusual events. Neighbourhood Watch is nothing complicated or formal. It's just keeping an eye out, but also letting others know - including me - if you have the registration numbers of vehicles that don't look or feel right. It doesn't matter if it is via Facebook, WhatsApp or a text message. Email me and Joe Bradley via:

If you have outside lights and security lights, make sure they are working. Any garden ornaments of value or interest need to be well secured, as do power tools and garden equipment, as they remain a desirable item for opportunist night-time thieves.

Please be aware of any unusual callers to your house or area, even those who may make themselves look legitimate by offering gardening services or asking for directions. Always try and make a note of vehicle registration numbers or anything distinctive about the vehicle and callers.



January 2021 : A New Year's Message From the Rector of St Mary's Church, Westbury Holy Trinity Church, Yockleton and All Saints Church, Worthen

Traditionally the Church would have celebrated Sunday, 10 January 2021 as Plough Sunday, historically held on the first Sunday after Epiphany (the visit of the Magi or wise-men) and therefore the Sunday falling between 7 January and 13 January.

In the past the Church played a more prominent role in society and accordingly no work on the land would begin until the day after Plough Sunday. A small horse-drawn plough would be displayed in the Church and it and the land blessed accordingly.

A local farmer would be invited to present seed to be blessed by the Priest in a format like:

Blessed are you, Lord of creation, soil and seed are the gift of your hand. Signs of your generous love and the miracle of new life and growth. Bless all soil and all seed, the potential they hold that all may have plenty and be filled. God bless the soil and the seed. God bless our soil and our seed.

In times gone by, there wasn't as much confidence in man's ability to farm and bring forth a harvest as there is today, a lot more seemed to be left to providence and so God's blessing was sought.

Plough Sunday formed part of the Church-Agricultural calendar:

- Plough Sunday in January where we prayed for a blessing on the land and the labourers who prepared the ground.
- Rogationtide in May where parishioners would 'beat the bounds' or walk around the parish boundaries and pray against mildew or any other crop disease.
- At the beginning of the Harvest season, the first fruits of the harvest were presented in the Church, on 1 August Lammas-tide meaning 'loaf Mass' was celebrated. Bread loaves were made from the fresh wheat crop. These were used as the Communion bread during a service to thank God for the harvest.
- Then Harvest Festival where thanks were given for the ingathering of the crops.
 Originally an Autumn 'moon' festival harvest is from the Anglo-Saxon word hærfest,
 "Autumn". The first full moon nearest the Autumnal Equinox is called the Harvest Moon.

The structure of our calendar mirrors that of the command of God to the Israelites as they entered the Promised Land; a kind of reminder that man is not as powerful as he thinks. He is at the mercy of nature; we can plant and water, but only God we are told can bring about the growth. Deuteronomy 26:

When you have entered the land the Lord your God is giving you as an inheritance and have taken possession of it and settled in it, take some of the first fruits of all that you produce from the soil of the land the Lord your God is giving you and put them in a basket. Then go to the place the Lord your God will choose as a dwelling for his

Name and say to the Priest in Office at the time: "I declare today to the Lord your God that I have come to the land the Lord swore to our ancestors to give us". The Priest shall take the basket from your hands and set it down in front of the altar of the Lord your God.

Hebrews 13:16

And do not forget to do good and to share with others, for with such sacrifices God is pleased.

If 2020 has told us little else, it has reminded us that it is good to stop and take stock of man's short passage on earth; to recognise man's limitations and to face our own mortality. The laws of nature are finely balanced and we should remember to care for the land and not to exploit it.

Whilst ploughs are not used much anymore, technology has advanced into new more efficient methods of farming, but the Plough remains the symbol of all our labour in the countryside, the foundation of the farmer's work and even the image of our relationship with the land. It is an amazing design, both simple and effective. When I was at Agricultural College we had to study how it cut and turned the earth, burying any trash and allowing the frost to get at it.

So at the beginning of another year, we salute this symbol of the Plough and through it we pray that the Lord would give his blessing to it and to us, and to all the work and workers on the farms of our parish.
