Police Matters

"Overnight Thefts" - the main area of concern - remain. Residential properties are often targeted for petrol type power tools, and farm buildings are always a favourite. Please ensure that "expensive" items are locked or chained when not in use. Colleagues in Shrewsbury have seen an increase in thefts from vehicles and garages on the housing estates within the town overnight and this includes expensive bicycles - which is another item that requires "bolting down" - even when in a garage.

Check that your security lights are still working and make sure you "lock up" in the evening to prevent unwanted visitors from helping themselves. If you would like me to visit and take a walk around your property, please give me a call on 07814 042410.

Following complaints from locals - there will be some Speed Enforcement Checks being conducted in both Westbury and Yockleton over the next few months.

Stay safe and please get in touch with any questions or concerns.

Please continue to lock up outbuildings and report any sightings via 101 and also via some of the excellent community Facebook pages to alert your neighbours that they are about.

I am still working as usual and if you would like me to have a walk around your property to give security advice, please get in touch. I can manage to shout over two metres but I am missing my usual cups of tea, which would be a pre-requisite for a visit!

As always, keep garages, sheds and outbuildings locked and - if possible - alarmed. Simple battery powered alarms have improved and noise is always a good deterrent if a thief has managed to get into your "Lock Up". Quad bikes and push bikes continue to be popular amongst thieves, so both need chaining up/bolting down.

Security marking can help recover stolen items and there are a number of options available. Please remain vigilant and ensure everything gets locked all the time - not just last thing at night. Keep in touch with your neighbours by telephone and - for those who use social media - post strange vehicles and unusual events. Neighbourhood Watch is nothing complicated or formal. It's just keeping an eye out, but also letting others know - including me - if you have the registration numbers of vehicles that don't look or feel right. It doesn't matter if it is via Facebook, WhatsApp or a text message. Email me and Joe Bradley via:

If you have outside lights and security lights, make sure they are working. Any garden ornaments of value or interest need to be well secured, as do power tools and garden equipment, as they remain a desirable item for opportunist night-time thieves.

Please be aware of any unusual callers to your house or area, even those who may make themselves look legitimate by offering gardening services or asking for directions. Always try and make a note of vehicle registration numbers or anything distinctive about the vehicle and callers.

The "What's on in Westbury" Facebook page is a great way to warn everyone quickly about anything suspicious and gives others the chance to be vigilant.

Census 2021

2021 Census in Shropshire

The Office of National Statistics (ONS) will carry out the 2021 Census on 21st March 2021.

The Census will provide a picture of England and Wales, revealing the size and characteristics of the population and providing valuable information that will be used to inform Policy Development, Funding Allocations and future Service Planning. The 2021 Census will be predominantly an online Census Questionnaire but with a Questionnaire in paper format made available to people who are unable to take part online.

Each household in Shropshire will receive a postcard during the period 22nd to 27th February 2021 raising awareness of the 2021 Census, followed by an initial Contact Pack (between the 3rd and 12th March 2021) requesting each household to complete the Census Questionnaire online or by requesting the Questionnaire in paper format.

Help will be available to Shropshire households via Support Centres located in the Libraries in Shropshire's largest six market towns (Shrewsbury, Oswestry, Bridgnorth, Market Drayton, Ludlow and Whitchurch), or via online guidance, a National Helpline and via trained Field Staff. The Questionnaire can also be completed using a mobile phone.

ONS 2021 Census plans will be responsive to the latest Guidelines from Central Government on Social Distancing during the Covid-19 pandemic and so may be subject to change.

Reflections from The Rectory

Our Churches may well have been locked down twice over the last year, for the first time since the five year closure in 1208 (thanks to a rift between King John - a King not renowned for his piety - and the then Pope, Innocent III); but it doesn't mean that the Church community have been inactive, nor have acts of worship been suspended. In fact, we have been busier than ever. In 1208 the lockdown was a punitive measure, rather than a matter of public health as it is today; but the same creativity and determination has led to Christians finding new and innovative ways to get together and worship.

Twelve months ago, few of us had heard of Zoom and yet today it is a household word, with almost every family using it to keep in touch, have Bingo games or a Quiz and - whilst an act of public worship is not ideal on a computer screen - it really has been a blessing, not least for all of our mental health. We just crave social interaction, we are all community beings; as the book of Genesis says "it is not good for man to be alone."

Our Church building may be closed for a few more weeks yet, but Worship Services take place every week on Zoom at 9:30am. We also have weekly Prayer Meetings, Coffee Mornings and a number of other events for which we would like to extend a warm welcome to all :

The Fifteen Stations of the Cross: which commenced on Monday 1st February at 7:30pm are running twice each week until Easter, when we are having half hour meditations and reflections on Zoom. These will focus on the traditional fifteen Stations of the Cross which are recorded in the gospels; beginning at the Garden of Gethsemane and ending at the resurrection of Christ.

The Stations of the Cross present us with an opportunity to encounter Christ, get a deeper understanding of his suffering and for us to deny ourselves (even just for half an hour) and journey with him. But, more than that, as we meditate and reflect, we encounter ourselves too; perhaps we find ourselves with Peter in denying Jesus three times or perhaps we find ourselves with Mary weeping at the sight of her son's pain. As we place ourselves in the crucifixion narrative, we do it in the light of Christ's victory, forgiveness and grace. Such is the power of the cross, even two thousand years on.

The island has black and white sandy beaches, coral reefs with coloured fishes, lovely birds, fruits and nuts in the forest. All make the islands a pristine environment, but they are vulnerable to frequent tropical storms, earthquakes, cyclones, tsunamis and active volcanoes. Women, men and children of all ages are called to "Build on a strong foundation" and live in unity, love and peace in the context of ethnic and cultural diversity like Vanuatu and so many other places around the world. National Covid Day of Remembrance – All Saints Church, Worthen. The month of March marks the anniversary of the first Covid lockdown; since then, we have all had a tough time and felt as though we have been in dark places. For many, it has been a year that has changed their lives forever; one of tragic loss or lasting pain and discomfort. Dear All

I know we are not out of the woods yet but, dare I say it, there looks to be some light at the end of the tunnel. Covid has been part of our lives for nearly a year now and it looks as though we will be living with it - one way or another - for some time to come; yet there are many reasons to be positive, not least that Spring appears to be just around the corner. After a slow start (and I know I was contacted by residents in Westbury and surrounding areas with concerns) the vaccination programme locally has really accelerated at a pace. It is great to hear reports of many local people receiving their vaccinations. All credit and thanks to the teams delivering this via the local GP surgeries, the centres in Shrewsbury and across the County. Shropshire is well up there now in terms of the numbers vaccinated and it is really great to hear of so many people locally receiving their JABs. At 32, it could be a little while before I get to what I am told is a very slick operation for me but, at the pace they are going, it might be sooner than I think.

This weekend we have just had a really successful "litter blitz" in and around Westbury where well over 20 bags of litter have been collected by volunteers. I know a lot of people collect litter regularly and I think there is still plenty more out there to collect, but a really big Thank You to everyone who contributed; it is fantastic to see such community spirit and people taking pride in their communities. If any communities outside Westbury locally would like to borrow the litter picking equipment, please let me know and I will be happy to arrange this.

Winter weather conditions continue to take their toll on the Highways network. I know we have had a number of road closures recently and I apologise for the inconvenience but - on the plus side - it is good to see potholes being addressed locally. We need to keep reporting them to make sure they are in the system as there are thousands of potholes appearing across the County. I appreciate that many of the minor roads are in desperate need of attention and I will keep lobbying Shropshire Council to address these surfaces and particularly those up on Long Mountain.

SmartWater Kits

Reminder: As per the item below which was posted on Westbury Parish Council's website on 11 November 2020, four hundred SmartWater Kits were sent out but, if you have not received your SmartWater Kit, please contact Sarah Smith, Clerk and RFO, Westbury Parish Council by email <clerkwypc@aol.co.uk>.

11 November 2020

Households in Westbury Parish will soon be receiving a free SmartWater kit purchased uniquely for their household by your local Parish Council working alongside the "We Don't Buy Crime" team and West Mercia Police to **protect your home from burglary.**

Due to the current restriction of Covid-19 and the need to self-isolate, this kit has been safely pre-registered to your address and **this solution is now unique to your home**. This procedure is in line with Royal Mail General Data Protection Regulations/Guidelines; however should you wish to opt out of this initiative, simply email:

WeDontBuyCrime@westmercia.pnn.police.uk

and we will remove the kit/your record from the initiative.

Why protect your items with SmartWater?

If your items were stolen, the Police could trace them back to you. By SmartWater protecting your items you deter a burglary.

The We Don't Buy Crime team works vigorously to encourage all organisations who buy items off the public: retailers, scrap metal merchants, auction houses, antique and jewellery dealers to check for SmartWater, therefore sabotaging the re-sale avenue of stolen goods. We have over 200 businesses that are actively doing this.

Whenever a suspect is arrested and brought into custody in West Mercia, they are checked for SmartWater. If a suspect is arrested for burglary, their premises are checked for other stolen goods/SmartWater.


