Police Matters

I am pleased to say that everything appears to be "quiet" at the moment and I think everyone is starting to get out a little more and enjoying the weather and the outdoor lifestyle we have been craving. Please continue to keep an eye out for strange vehicles and either let me know or ring 101. I have had a few calls recently about unusual vehicles and thankfully they have checked out to local keepers with genuine reasons for being where they were..

Please ensure that "expensive" items are locked or chained when not in use. Colleagues in Shrewsbury have seen an increase in thefts from vehicles and garages on the housing estates within the town overnight and this includes expensive bicycles - which is another item that requires "bolting down" - even when in a garage.

Check that your security lights are still working and make sure you "lock up" in the evening to prevent unwanted visitors from helping themselves. If you would like me to visit and take a walk around your property, please give me a call on 07814 042410.

Following complaints from locals - there will be some Speed Enforcement Checks being conducted in both Westbury and Yockleton over the next few months.

Stay safe and please get in touch with any questions or concerns.

Please continue to lock up outbuildings and report any sightings via 101 and also via some of the excellent community Facebook pages to alert your neighbours that they are about.

I am still working as usual and if you would like me to have a walk around your property to give security advice, please get in touch. I can manage to shout over two metres, but I am missing my usual cups of tea, which would be a pre-requisite for a visit!

As always, keep garages, sheds and outbuildings locked and - if possible - alarmed. Simple battery powered alarms have improved and noise is always a good deterrent if a thief has managed to get into your "Lock Up". Quad bikes and push bikes continue to be popular amongst thieves, so both need chaining up/bolting down.

Security marking can help recover stolen items and there are a number of options available. Please remain vigilant and ensure everything gets locked all the time - not just last thing at night. Keep in touch with your neighbours by telephone and - for those who use social media - post strange vehicles and unusual events. Neighbourhood Watch is nothing complicated or formal. It's just keeping an eye out, but also letting others know - including me - if you have the registration numbers of vehicles that don't look or feel right. It doesn't matter if it is via Facebook, WhatsApp or a text message. Email me via:

If you have outside lights and security lights, make sure they are working. Any garden ornaments of value or interest need to be well secured, as do power tools and garden equipment, as they remain a desirable item for opportunist night-time thieves.

Please be aware of any unusual callers to your house or area, even those who may make themselves look legitimate by offering gardening services or asking for directions. Always try and make a note of vehicle registration numbers or anything distinctive about

Reflections

This time of year has to be the most precious, full of hope, new life and the weather of late has been stunning; the famous hymn "How great thou art" proclaims:

When through the woods and forest glades I wander, and hear the birds sing sweetly in the trees, when I look down from lofty mountain grandeur and hear the brook and feel the gentle breeze. Then sings my soul, my saviour God to thee, how great Thou art!

As a keen walker, I feel most alive when I am outside in the countryside or on the hilltops. Of late I have been taking any opportunity I can to walk along Offa's Dyke. I love that feeling of connectedness to the earth's natural order.

For many, these outdoor experiences are where they feel closest to God; services in Church don't necessarily appeal, but the outdoors just declares the greatness of God. As we absorb the outdoor air, it refreshes us and provides an opportunity for self-examination, dealing with frustrations, anger and guilt in our lives. It helps us dismiss those voices inside of us, that challenge our self-worth, and be reminded that we are special to God.

In the middle-ages, the monks used to walk and recite Psalms as they went. By repeatedly speaking the words of the Psalm, it provided them with spiritual food and brought a discipline into their lives. For instance, Psalm 119:

Blessed are those whose way is pure, who walk in the law of the Lord.
Blessed are those who keep his statutes and seek him with all their heart.
O how I love thy law, I will meditate on it all day long your word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path.

The law that the Psalmist refers to is not the law that you and I might think about, a law that says: "you must not do this" or "you must do that"; but it is the law that made the universe into a cosmos from what it previously was – chaos, darkness and matter. This is the law that provides a framework for life itself and brings order into nature, seasons in their time, rain and sunshine in perfect balance which, in turn, gives us the green beauty all about us.

Yet the poet A.E. Housman said that when nature is left to itself it can be cruel and heart-less, nature does not "know" him :

For nature, heartless, witless nature, Will neither care nor know (from Tell me not here, it needs not saying)

Whilst Housman was really referring to how man passes through un-noticed by nature, I find his argument sad because, as Christians, we would disagree. The true "law" of nature is fulfilled in Jesus Christ; he brings a reason and a purpose for life itself. Yes, the world is not as it should be, the TV news often appears full of sadness and decay, but Jesus brings hope for a better future, we pray "your kingdom come on earth as in heaven."

Remember however, (quote from Angela Tilby) "we can only learn to inhabit God's goodness if we remember to remember it."

SHROPSHIRE MOBILE LIBRARY SERVICE - UPDATE

Following on from my email in March, we have decided that the Mobile Libraries will continue with the Ready Reads (Click and Collect) Service until the end of June 2021. Borrowers pick up a bag of staff-selected books at their normal stop. They will be doing two weeks on the road, two weeks off. We will make a decision in June as to what will happen after that, but we are hoping to be back to a more normal service. On the road dates are as follows:

Please note that these dates may change if Government guidance changes.

No stops have changed the Route Number or Day over the last year, so any information I have sent in the past will be correct. Appointments are now being offered to the over 40s for Covid vaccinations and no doubt by the end of May will have moved on again to the next younger cohort.

Finally, it has been my privilege to serve you as the Shropshire Councillor for the Loton Division for the past four years and I thank you all for your support in what has been a very interesting and - at times - challenging period. I hope to continue to represent you after the Elections on 6 May 2021 and look forward to contributing to the June 2021 edition of the Westbury and Yockleton Newsletter.

I'm Donna Smith and I am newly in post as the First Call Service Co-ordinator for the British Red Cross, Home from Hospital Service in Shropshire. Were you aware that the Red Cross has a Home from Hospital Service? Since the pandemic, we've found that our referrals have been low, and we also have low volunteer numbers.

The main focus of my role is on Volunteer Recruitment and Service Development and I would hope to improve the take up of the service. It is for this reason that I have asked if we could put an advert in the Westbury and Yockleton Newsletter to advertise the service and recruit new volunteers? This would hopefully benefit the local community.

We offer short term (up to six weeks) support for people who have recently been discharged from hospital. The support provided could include the following:

- Keeping someone company or providing befriending support over the telephone or at a home visit.
- Helping the person to regain independence by supporting them with practical tasks such as shopping and collecting prescriptions.

We can also offer free installation and a trial with a Pendant Alarm if the service user is at risk of falling.

We would normally also offer transport support but - due to the pandemic - this service is on hold for the time being.

Protecting our communities from county lines

27 people were arrested during a crackdown on county lines across the counties covered by West Mercia Police.

A two week period during February saw regional intensification with heightened work. Criminal activity was targeted as part of the Force's overarching Protect campaign. This campaign seeks to tackle organised crime and disrupt those causing the most harm in our communities.

During the intensification period heroin, crack cocaine, cocaine and cannabis were seized by Police across Herefordshire, Worcestershire and Shropshire.

Over £35,000 in cash was seized, along with 20 mobile phones and weapons; these included knives and an imitation hand gun.

Officers visited 'cuckooed' homes believed to be being exploited by drug dealers. They identified and safeguarded vulnerable people at risk of being exploited. Officers also engaged in education activity with fast food outlets, care homes, schools, local authorities, petrol stations and travel hubs across the counties.

Chief Superintendent Damian Barratt said: "West Mercia Police is no different to any other Police Force across the country where county lines drug dealers are exploiting vulnerable children, young people and adults.

"Organised crime groups are targeting our local communities and exploiting vulnerable people to transport drugs into our counties. In a practice known as cuckoo-ing, offenders often seek to take over the homes of vulnerable people to further facilitate drug dealing.

"These groups are often involved in serious violence and do not think twice about putting young and vulnerable people in frightening

situations, causing them to make decisions that can ultimately change their lives and the lives of others forever. We are determined to do all we can to stop this from happening.

"We're committed to tackling serious and organised crime as part of our 'Protect' campaign. Despite the Covid19 lockdown restrictions this criminality continues and no matter what the circumstances, our officers are here 24/7 365 days a year to protect people from harm."

West Mercia Police celebrates uplift in officer numbers as part of national programme

Despite the challenges that COVID-19 has presented police forces, the government is still ahead of schedule to bring in the promised 20,000 more officers by 2023.

With an aim of attracting 6,000 new recruits in England and Wales by April 2021, figures released recently show that the total uplift nationally is already 6,620. The programme has increased the number of police officers nationwide by 5%, bringing a total of 135,248.

Out of this figure, West Mercia Police has recruited 93 officers in year one, which means that the force has met its target for 2020/21. West Mercia Police now has 2298 officers, the highest level in a decade.

The force's latest intake of 20 Police Constable Degree Apprenticeship (PCDA) student

officers joined on 25 January, with the next intake of 40 Degree Holder Entry Programme (DHEP) student officers – 16 of these on the brand new Detective Constable DHEP route joining on 15 March.

Meanwhile, representation of officers from ethnic minority backgrounds has risen to over 2.7%, the highest level the force has ever seen. Similarly, the proportion of female officers now stands at an all-time high of 32.6%. This is a significant increase of 11.56% of women police officers across all ranks over the past year.

The allocation of new officers for the next financial year is 91, with 40 of these to be student officers joining through the PCDA or DHEP routes, posted on Patrol and deployed to Shrewsbury, Telford, Hereford, Worcester, Kidderminster and Redditch.

Meanwhile, 13 officers will join Safer Neighbourhood Teams and 17 detectives will be posted to Herefordshire, Shropshire, Telford & Wrekin and Worcestershire, as well as the force's headquarters at Hindlip Hall.

Rachel Hartland Lane, Director of Business Services at West Mercia Police, said: "The national uplift campaign has given us a once in a generation opportunity to improve diversity in policing, as well as contributing to our highest number of officers since 2010.

"We are now a more representative force than ever before, but we still have a way to go to be truly reflective of the people we serve. We have an aspiration to see approximately 5% ethnic minority representation among our officers by 2025, and of course, in order to truly be representative of our communities, the proportion of female officers needs to nudge upwards to 50%.

"Whilst we are currently closed for recruitment for student officers, this will change as we head towards the spring, giving us the perfect opportunity to further increase our representation via our new officers through our different entry routes." Police and Crime Commissioner John Campion said: "The communities of West Mercia have made it clear that visible policing is one of their top priorities, and I am delighted that the force has achieved its target for the recruitment of new officers in 2020/21. I have also promised an additional 91 officers through my 2021/22 budget to fight crime and further improve police visibility and accessibility. This uplift of 91 officers, through my budget, equates to 399 additional officers since May 2016.

"Importantly, the figures also indicate that the recruitment programme has increased the number of female and ethnic minority officers, which will have the positive effect of ensuring that the force more accurately reflects the communities it serves. This, in turn, will further improve the trust our communities have in its police force."

"If the crime is still in progress, because for example, you have recently provided bank details or handed over cards or cash or are going to visit your bank or the caller has arranged for someone to visit your address to collect items, you should call the police to report this on 999."

Fraudsters target people in Shropshire

We're aware that criminals pretending to be police officers are again attempting to defraud people in Shropshire.

Police will never ask you to handover or transfer money or purchase vouchers.

Chief Inspector Mark Reilly said: "Fraudsters traditionally target older, more vulnerable people however anyone can be a target. They can often be incredibly convincing giving you no reason to think they aren't genuine. However, I want people to be aware that police will never ask you to handover or transfer money, for whatever reason. If you receive a call from someone claiming to be a police officer you should hang up immediately.

"Fraudsters scams can be very elaborate, very convincing and very cruel. If you think someone is trying to scam you, don't be pressured and give yourself time to stop and think.

Standard (minimum) Size Adverts: These are all in boxes sized 7.90 cm x 5.43 cm (landscape layout only), about the size of a business card and cost £2.50 per month. Minimum booking is for 6 months @ £15.00. I will email you again asking if you wish to book for a further six months during the last month that your advertisement appears. You may of course book for 12 months @ £30.00*. If you book for a year in advance, you get a "secure placement" which will carry on for as long as you want it to, subject to your paying the renewal invoices on time. New adverts start on the back page and - month by month move forward column-by-column towards page two, after which they re-start at the back. This ensures that all businesses receive equal coverage throughout the year. As there is a small turnover in the adverts, they will also slowly move up and down the page. Printing will be in full web colours

Before sending me your advert PRINT this sheet out and make sure your advert fits the relevant box and is readable at that size.

- A Half (A4) page advert, this is priced at £15 per month and needs to be in landscape layout. The minimum number of months for which a half A4 page size advert can be booked in advance is six.

All adverts submitted need to be no lower than 200dpi for print quality and sent to me as a JPG – but separately attached to your covering email, rather than being copied/pasted into the body of your email.

As a guide, I need to receive the graphic of any new business advert about halfway through the preceding month, so that I can email the business concerned with a pdf copy of their advert (as it will appear on the relevant page) for their approval. Once the business has confirmed they are happy with the advert and the number of months for which they wish to book, I will email an invoice and, as soon as payment has been received, the advert will be included in the next issue of the Newsletter.

For secure slots, I will email a single "invitation to renew" invoice once your last paid for advert is published. I will not publish an advert which is unpaid after the expiry date on the invoice. If you pay late, you are at risk of losing the secure slot.

PAYMENT

We cannot accept payment by BACCs or Credit or Debit cards - only Cheques which need to be drawn in favour of Westbury Village Hall (who provide us with banking facilities) but posted to me at the address given below so that I may photocopy each cheque for my Newsletter records before passing it on to our Village Hall Committee's Treasurer to be credited to our Sub-Account within their main account.

Please let me know which size advert you prefer and for how many months you wish to book, so that I can then invoice you – it would be good to get your advert into our next issue. However, we do require receipt of payment <u>before</u> we place an advert.

For our records, I need the name of your business, your postal address, your email address and your landline and mobile telephone numbers. We are no longer able to absorb postal charges within the above costings. If you cannot provide me with an e-mail address to send your invoices, I need to add a charge to each invoice to cover the cost of posting a paper copy. The initial invoice will carry a charge of £2 to cover itself and the first renewal invoice. Subsequent renewal invoices will carry a £1 charge to cover the next renewal invoice. If you need a receipt on paper, please enclose a stamped addressed envelope with your payment.

Several of the businesses have stated that they find our Newsletter is a very cost-effective advertising platform and we appreciate the financial support we gain from them as we are running the Newsletter on a voluntary basis with no grant from Westbury Parish Council or any other funding or any profit.

My deadline for News items is the last Monday in the previous month, unless that Monday happens to be a Bank Holiday - when it will be the last Tuesday in the previous month. If, however, the last Monday in the previous month is too close to the end of the month to give me time to produce the Newsletter, I will advise accordingly which month your advertisement will commence.
