HHSAA launches "The Hurricane Fund"

We are pleased to announce **the Hurricane Fund**, which is the first ever formal effort to annually support the Hartford High School Alumni Association.

Annual expenses, including the Newsletter, Scholarships and Alumni events can exceed \$12,000 but resources come from the efforts of a loyal group of local Alums who keep this going with monthly meetings, organizing a parade and picnic, publishing a newsletter and raising "just enough money" by selling ads for the newsletter, sponsoring a raffle and receiving membership dues.

This winter a group of Hartford Alums from the classes of 63,64,65,66,67, and 68 met via Zoom to discuss how the HHSAA could stay viable in perpetuity. Out of these meetings came the concept for a capital campaign by reaching out to all HHS Alumni and supporters on an annual basis. The belief is that much more than yearly needs could be met and, additionally, scholarship awards could grow significantly.

Some of our Hartford grads have gone on to lead impressive lives. HHS Alumni are invited to look back, come back and give back to their origin. Even modest levels of support can have amazing results. So, beyond basic HHSAA membership dues we are asking for multi-year pledges and even estate planning considerations to move beyond a subsistence budget and build an endowment for Hartford scholars and Alumni events

We are delighted to announce that, even before this launch, we have raised \$13,000 from early supporters and an additional \$5000 from the town of Hartford for this year's parade. The expected 2026 goals of the Hurricane Fund will be at least \$25,000 and perhaps as much as \$50,000. The operating goal is to reach a level where it functions as an endowment, using only the interest from managed wealth, and continues to grow.

Currently, we are considering splitting awards to support both institution bound students and those planning to go into the trades or technical schools. The Hurricane Fund will be set up legally as a federally approved 501c3 corporation as the place for pledges to be received and donations to flow.

Please consider donating to the Hurricane Fund to help reach our 2026 goal of \$25,000. No amount is too small. The Directors will be open to broader ways to contribute. Combining this new fund with personal wealth management and estate planning is encouraged.

The Hurricane Fund, Inc. is now ready to receive funds and pledges. Actual funds will be tax-deductible and can be sent to **HHSAA / PO Box 891 / White River Jct., VT 05001** and made **payable to the "Hurricane Fund"**.

Indeed we hope that this example will accrue to each reunion class as they make plans for milepost reunions. With the technology of Zoom we can increase volunteer ranks both in terms of expertise and resources.

HHS Reunion Golf Outing

This year the HHSAA is offering a HHS golf outing on Friday June 26, the day before the reunion parade. The plan is to generate a little competition between class years (or decades), raise funds for the new Hurricane Fund and have a little fun— announcing the winners on Saturday at the post-parade picnic. It is intended to be a social outing with a hint of competition. This is a pilot to see if it could become an annual reunion event.

On this inaugural year it will be held at Eastman in Grantham, NH., with tee times starting at 1PM. Cost for a foursome will be \$450.00 to include greens fees, cart, a sleeve of balls and a couple of beverage cart drinks per player.

The format will be a Scramble limited to five teams. Groups can be mixed male and female. Since it is a Scramble, skill level makes it fun for all skill levels.

Alumni Parade Grand Marshal—David Briggs



David Briggs HHS '64 and graduate of Norwich University (soixante-huit et demi) received a BS in Civil Engineering and a commission in the US Army Corps of Engineering which led to the rank of Captain during his service from 1969-1972.

David was raised in WRJct., grew up on the streets of downtown where he shined shoes and ran errands out of his family store, Briggs and Phillips, which later became Briggs, Ltd.

During his formative years at HHS, he was supported by excellent teachers and coaches at Hartford High. His love of running thrived under Coach George Ratcliffe. His 'think pieces', assigned by English teacher Delevan Whaley, inspired David's written communication skills to this day. Math courses offered by Bob Taylor and Floyd McPhetres, helped prepare him to become acknowledged by the Vermont Chapter of the American Society of Civil Engineers as engineer of the year in 2025. His experience as a student leader in the HHS student council under mentor Thomas Jurras was also important in rounding out David's ability to lead others.

David returned from St. Paul, Minnesota, for his 20th class reunion (Class of 64 in 84) and learned that the Hotel Coolidge was up for sale. With support of 30 local investors, David took over the reins in January of 1985.

Over the 40 years, he has reclaimed space for the Briggs Opera House, was enlisted by the Preservation Trust of Vermont to redevelop the new Windsor Courthouse and later the railroad grade crossing was reopened to provide access to Railroad Row, the new courthouse and the Amtrak station.

David joined the Rotarians in 1973, has been a board member of the Montshire Museum, founder of River City Arts, board member of the Green Mountain Economic Development Corporation, founder of River City Christian and hands-on supporter of Project Graduation. He was also the

Chair of the Hartford Bicentennial Celebration in 1976 which resulted in the Lyman Point Park.

In 2026 David worked to develop a vision for economic support to ensure a quality Alumni Day parade and to build an Alumni Scholarship Endowment Fund. This would provide substantial scholarships for Hartford graduating seniors

by inviting successful HHS alumni to give back (pay it forward) to their alma mater upon which that success is based. David is a loving father to three sons and a devoted husband to his Peggy Adams. We at Hartford are fortunate to call him ours.

This year Hartford lost several long time employees who meant a lot to Hartford High for many years.

Pat Horvath Taylor –Science and Math Teacher

On December 29, 2025, we lost our beloved teacher known to some students as Miss Horvath and later Mrs. Taylor. Pat was a UVM graduate who began her career as coach and teacher in McIndoe Falls and later came to Hartford to teach science and math. Pat married Bob Taylor, another outstanding math teacher, and together they had a daughter, Dawn.

Pat was a collector of Antiques, a prolific reader, a capable cook, and a wonderful hostess for her ladies during Bourbon Manhattan night. She travelled with her husband to her family's origins in Hungary, to vacations in Europe, Kiawah Island, South Carolina, Cape Cod, Maine and most of the Northeastern States.

For many years Pat was on the board of the Bugbee Senior Center and volunteered often to transport seniors to doctor's appointments or to the hospital. She was a devout Catholic and member of St. Anthony's Parish and a daily listener to masses on TV, but Pat loved Math so much she retired three times until finally retiring in 2000. We will all miss our Pat Taylor.

Butch Lovering –English teacher, hockey and football coach and Vice-Principal of Hartford High

On November 14, 2025, we lost a sincere friend of the Hartford community, Howard Douglas Lovering, known as Butch to many. He was a loving husband, father, coach, a devoted teacher of English, Vice-Principal of Hartford High and loyal friend to many.

After graduating from Norwich University, where he was captain of the football team, Butch was assigned to Vietnam, receiving two bronze stars with valor while serving his country. Upon returning to the states, he taught and coached at Northfield High School and in 1978 he came to Hartford where he taught English, coached hockey and football, and earned loyalty and respect from his players and students. His excellence in coaching boys hockey resulted in a 23-0 season and a Vermont state championship. Later Butch was charged with keeping the peace and tranquility at HHS as Vice-Principal and was honored as Vermont VP of the year. He was loved and respected as a pillar of strength who worked his magic with students by being hard nosed in discipline, but a softy when certain students needed his special warmth to guide them through a crisis. Upon retiring in 2001, he and his wife Judy established a home in The Villages in Florida living there for 22 years until his death. HDL is remembered fondly by students, players, coaches, parents, his fishing buddies, and friends. Long live his memory in the hearts and minds of Hartford.

Alvin Ricker –For 52 years, Alvin served the Hartford School District as a custodian and school bus driver. Generations of Hartford students remember his reliable wave, his unflappable calm in all weather and the way he made the start to and end of each school day feel safe.

There was not a student who passed through the halls of Hartford High during those years who did not know Alvin, but few were aware that he had received the Purple Heart for his service in Germany during WWII.

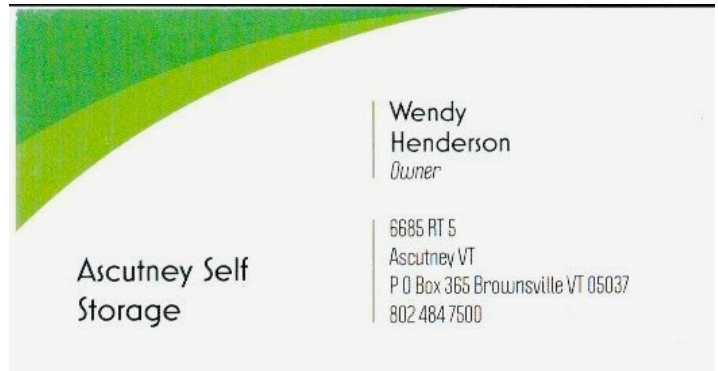
Alvin devoted countless hours of service to the community, including for many years organizing the Alumni Day parade. Alvin passed away on October 17, 2025, at the age of 99.

Alumni Celebration- Nelson Fogg

Nelson Fogg's story is truly a Hartford story. A proud graduate of Hartford High School's Class of 1979, Nelson returned home with a clear goal in mind after attending the University of Vermont, to become a teacher in the very school that helped shape him. That vision became reality in the spring of 1988 when he stepped into the science department as a long, term substitute in preparation for his future as a social studies teacher that awaited him in the fall.

Over the next 24 years, Nelson became a cornerstone of the Social Studies Department, bringing energy, curiosity and a deep commitment to helping students understand the world around them. At the same time, his impact extended beyond the classroom. Whether on the ice, sidelines, or in the dugout, Nelson coached with passion and purpose, supporting student-athletes in JV Football, Boys Ice Hockey, JV Baseball, JV and Varsity Softball, and Varsity Girls Ice Hockey. He also gave his time and leadership as Yearbook Advisor, Student Council Advisor and for 18 years as Social Studies Department Chair.

In 2012 Nelson transitioned into administration as Assistant Principal, and in 2016, he stepped into the role of Principal, a position he held with pride and dedication until his retirement this spring. Across every role, one belief guided his work: "Partner with all learners." It wasn't just a phrase, it was a mindset that shaped his relationships with students, staff and the broader community.

Nelson's love for learning was always visible. A passionate reader, he often found joy wandering the Asles of Barnes and Noble, searching for the next idea or inspiration to bring back to Hartford. That curiosity translated into a career defined by innovation and opportunity. His leadership helped expand what learning could look like, Encouraging staff to think creatively, take risks and most importantly, find ways to say "yes" for students.

That spirit is perhaps best captured during Hartford's Exhibition Night, a celebration of student voices and independent learning. Walking through the displays of student work, it's easy to see Nelson's lasting influence, a school culture where students are empowered to explore their interests and take ownership of their learning.

More than anything, Nelson Fogg has been a steady presence, a relationship builder and a champion for students. His journey, from Hartford student to teacher, coach and ultimately Principal, reflects a deep love for this community and a lifelong commitment to both personal growth and the success of others.

The Hartford School District is incredibly fortunate to have had Nelson's leadership, passion and unwavering belief in what schools can be at their best. His impact will continue to be felt for years to come.

Hartford High Sports in Review 6 Varsity Sports Offered at HHS in 2025-2026 (584 participants)

- Spring 2025
 - Unified basketball participated in the state tournament for only the 5th time in school history, earning the #5 seed in the South.
 - Girls lacrosse (15-1) and boys lacrosse (15-3) both advanced to the state championship game and finished as state runners-up.
 - Baseball and girls lacrosse won their respective league championships
 - Track & Field claimed state titles in the 800m (Bennett Moreno), 1500m (Moreno), High Jump (Ayodele Lowe), Long Jump (Lowe), and Triple Jump (Jayden Forbes) and finished as state runner-up as a team
 - Bennett Moreno was the 2025 New England Champion in the 800m, the first Hartford boy to win a New England title and only the 2nd athlete in school history to accomplish the feat. (Beth Perkins won the New England titles in the discus in 1994 and 1996)
 - Madison Barwood finished with 314 points for girls lacrosse and became the all-time leading scorer in school history. She is also the all-time leading scorer in field hockey and girls ice hockey.
 - Cavan Benjamin and Austin St. Peter reached 100 points for boys lacrosse
- Fall 2025
 - Football, golf, girls cross-country, and boys cross country won their respective league championships
 - The Unified Soccer team won the Division I gold medal at the state championship event held at Norwich University.
 - Boys cross country finished in 4th place as a team at the state championship. This is the best finish for the boys program in school history
- Winter 2026
 - Girls & Boys basketball won their respective league titles
 - Boys basketball completed an undefeated regular season (20-0) for the first time in school history and advanced to the state championship game finishing as state runner-up
 - Girls basketball advanced to the state championship game and defeated Lamoille to become the 2026 Division II state champions!
 - Girls ice hockey advanced to the state championship game and defeated U-32 to become the 2026 Division II state champions! This is the 3rd state title in a row for the girls hockey program.
 - Charlotte Jasmin eclipsed 2000 points in her career becoming only the 5th Vermonter to accomplish this incredible feat.

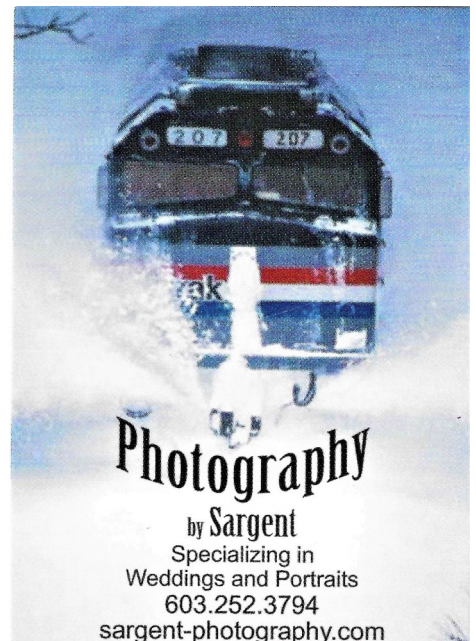
