ONE YEAR ANNIVERSARY!

What a milestone! It's been one year since Girls Set Apart (GSA) was born, and our team cannot be more proud of the great work accomplished over the past 12 months. We give all thanks and glory to the Almighty God.

At this time last year, Leah Chikumbindi and other bold women joined together on a journey with nothing but faith. GSA had no money and no office, but with faith and courage, they trusted God and His purpose for GSA. Among others, Leah Chikumbindi, Polly Haley, Sandy Nalley, Dale Bey, Jamie Freeman, Lisa Smith, Edith Mvududu and Ginny Teguns, pressed forward and laid the foundation for this beautiful ministry. The first business meeting took place at Union Coffee in Dallas on April 30, 2014.

The first GSA event was "The Princess In Me Royal Retreat" at Springhill Retreat Center in Richardson, Texas. At this Princess in Me, GSA focused on teaching young girls 9 -11 years of age the following: (1) Who is Christ? TRUTH, (2) Who are these girls in Christ? IDENTITY, and (3) What do these answers mean to the girls?VALUE

Twenty-three young girls attended this event. As leaders for the retreat, GSA was blessed with nine teen mentors and six adult volunteers. The keynote speakers for the event were Sarah Luginbill, a youth director at Lovers Lane UMC in Dallas, and Wadzani Thembani, the current Miss Zimbabwe USA and member of Harvest International Church in Dallas. Both

messages included the following truth for the girls, "God created you in a unique fashion because He has great things planned for you. Never stop believing that you are amazing, beautiful, strong and loved."

Also, last summer we launched our first in-home Bible Study for high school students, and it was a great success.

The study focused on how to follow of Christ as a teenager today. We discussed the girls' struggles such as what it takes to be different and still be "normal". We covered basics like, "Who is Jesus? How Jesus came to live among man? Why is Jesus' presence important?" *Luke 2:8-12* We discussed the reasons why having a personal relationship with Him is important, and the impact such a relationship has on them as teen girls today.

Last fall, GSA hosted our first teen girls retreat at the Southfork Hotel in Plano Texas. Our theme was Unbelievably Free. *Proverbs 3:15.* The curriculum focused on defining Patience, Purity and Purpose in Christ for the girls, and we discussed why all these cannot exist if God is not the center of our lives. We were blessed with adult leader/mentors and different guest to present on different topics.

Alison Lumbatis founder/owner of "Get Your Pretty On" www.getyourprettyon.com, discussed Modesty. Mari Thomas, Owner of "Beyond Appearance" www.beyondappearance.com gave a presentation on Hygiene and Living Well. Dale Bey taught the girls about Boundaries.

Main guest were Raegan Gilliland, Young Adult Pastor at Lovers Lane United Methodist Church, Tafadzwa Charuma, a psychology student and former football player at ETBU.
