



# ALAMANCE ACADEMY DAY

## STUDENT PROFILES & CATEGORIES FOR ENROLLMENT

Alamance Academy Day, we create a nurturing and structured environment where middle school boys in grades 5-8, can grow academically, socially, and emotionally. Our small class sizes and counseling supports are designed to help each student reach his full potential. Our mission is to provide a safe, compassionate, and engaging environment where our students are empowered to learn, grow, and thrive — academically and emotionally.

### Categories for Enrollment

We accept students year-round who fall into one of the following categories:

**Educational Needs:** Student would benefit from a structured, nurturing environment to support social, emotional, and academic growth.

**Family/Guardian Initiative:** Student has a parent or guardian seeking a nurturing alternative to traditional schooling.

**Individualized Education Plan (IEP):** Student has an active IEP that includes therapeutic behavioral and academic interventions or seeking to establish the supports of an IEP.

**School Intervention:** Student has been suspended, expelled, or placed on extended leave from their home school and requires short-term intervention to successfully return.

### How Our Program Supports Students

Our program combines academic instruction with counseling services to meet the needs of the whole child:

- Individual Counseling – Weekly for all students to address individual needs.
- Group Counseling – Builds social skills, strengthens peer relationships, and promotes positive conflict resolution.
- Family Counseling – Monthly for all families; enhances attachment, communication, and caregiver consistency.
- Academic Instruction – Supports learning differences, attention needs, and study skills.
- Vocational & Life Skills Training – Develops independence, awareness and confidence.
- Interest Clubs & Outdoor Play – Encourages collaboration, sensory regulation, and provides healthy physical outlets through artistic expression and recreation.

## **Enrollment Exclusions**

The list below is not exhaustive. Each student will be evaluated individually to determine whether Alamance Academy Day is the most appropriate and supportive placement for their academic, social, and emotional needs. Our goal is to maintain a safe and effective learning environment; therefore, Alamance Academy Day is not equipped to serve students who:

- Require high-level 1:1 supports (e.g., severe ASD, Level 3)
- Have a severe intellectual disability (IQ below 60)
- Experience active psychosis or severe, uncontrolled bipolar disorder
- Have a history of extreme violence or sexually aggressive behavior that could compromise group safety
