Philanthropy News

At the January luncheon, the Philanthropy Committee presented a slate of three major charities for Women of Nassau to support in 2025. The membership voted to accept the slate of Chandler's Hope, Ferst Readers, and Gracie's Kitchen as presented. The Philanthropy Committee prepared this slate of 501(c)3 charities based on our organization's mission statement to benefit women and children in Nassau County.

The Committee will be working with the following organizations in planning for fundraising events and donation drives:

Chandler's Hope is a nonprofit mobile ministry that distributes new and gently used clothing, travel size toiletries, snack items, bottled water and addiction resource information to those in need in Nassau County. Michele Holbrook founded this organization in December 2023 in memory of her son who passed away from an accidental overdose in 2020. Volunteers restock the hanging racks that have been installed in the dedicated utility trailer readying it for the drive to scheduled stops at distribution locations throughout the county. Chandler's Hope collects money and other donated items to provide comfort and encouragement for those who are in need in our county.

Ferst Readers is an organization that promotes literacy by providing books to enrolled preschoolers of Nassau County each month from birth until kindergarten. The following quote from *The Child* Mind Institute expands on how vital reading is to a child's development. "The benefits of reading to children include helping them build language skills, learn about the world, and develop empathy and emotion awareness. Reading together also provides an opportunity for parents and children to connect." Well over 70,000 books have been mailed to children in Nassau County since 2016. The organization also reaches out to groups such as Head Start, Nassau County Public Library System, and Micah's Place to identify children who might not otherwise take part in this program.

Gracie's Kitchen is a nonprofit organization which serves meals to single mothers, families, senior

citizens, military vets, the homeless, and the working poor. Founded in 2010, Gracie's Kitchen began in a facility in Yulee by serving only seven meals. Today, under the direction of co-founder Maryellen Crocker and with the help of 17 volunteer teams from churches and other organizations, Gracie's Kitchen is open four days a week and serves between 3,000 - 3,500 dinners per month at its site in a former middle school near the junction of SR 17 and A1A.

And finally, a word about how your membership dues are used. The Board of Directors has adopted a budget for 2025 that outlines the sources and uses of club funds. The Budget provides a plan for operating the Club for 2025 and how we plan to fund those operations. Sources of funds include annual membership dues, Ways and Means Committee efforts and some money remaining from prior years. For 2025, the Budget includes at least \$10 of each membership dues to be used for charitable purposes – a total of \$2500. This is in addition to any funds raised by the Philanthropy Committee through their fundraising activities. About \$4,000 of our total budget is used for basic club operating expenses such as website and cart, liability insurance, accounting software, state corporate license, post office box, etc. Another \$1,000 is used to provide complimentary lunch meals for our luncheon program speakers and maybe a few dollars for luncheon decorations. For special events, \$2,000 for four evening events have been allocated, and \$1,000 for the Activities Committee to use in planning new activities. Because of scammers, we will not be publishing the budget on the website, but if you would like to see the full budget document, just email me at lyndanamelia@gmail.com and I will be happy to send it to you and answer any questions you might have.

Amelia National has had to increase the cost of our luncheons to \$40 all inclusive. While the Board feels that this is still a reasonable price for the value received, we recognize that this could create a hardship for some members to attend the luncheon, so we will work with Amelia National to see if we can come up with a viable alternative meal that is less expensive.

The Board and your committees have planned some exciting events and activities for the coming year. If you have any suggestions on events, activities, or other things that you would like to see happening in our great little club, please let me or another Board member know.

I am excited to be your President for 2025 and I am looking forward to working with you all in the coming year!
