Letter from Our President

Hello Wonderful Women of Massau:

As we have concluded the first half of 2024, I would like to mention the status of our club budget. At the beginning of the year, the Board of Directors adopted a budget to provide guidance on how the club's funding would be collected and how those funds would be used. I am delighted to find that at the half-year mark, we are right on target for 50% of budget items. The only item that has gone significantly over budget is the amount raised by the Philanthropy Committee for charitable donations. A goal of \$2,500 was budgeted, the Committee's Spring Tea raised \$4,450 which was donated to Micha's Place, and collections also completely covered the cost of the Tea event.

At an earlier luncheon, it was asked, "What is the \$30 membership fee used for?" The Board of Directors has directed that at least \$10 of each membership be donated directly to one of the club's designated charities. This year more than \$15 per membership has been budgeted to be donated to one of the four charities that were chosen from a survey to membership at the beginning of the year. This is in addition to any funds raised through a Philanthropy Committee fundraiser event (i.e., in addition to the \$4,450 from the Spring Tea). Budgeted for this year are the following donations for a total of \$3,125, which is \$16.19 for each of our 193 members:
