Letter from Our President

Women of Massau:

Since the beginning of the year, your Board of Directors, Committee Chairs, and Activity Leaders have been working diligently to plan an exciting year for WON members! We have been taking care of business and planning fun events and charitable efforts for 2024. I would like to share some of these accomplishments with you. This letter is longer than usual, but please read about what your officers are doing for you!

Audit Committee – Lynda Watson, Nancy Gallimore, Lorraine Clapper, QB consultant Karen Boyce)

- Audit Committee found no evidence of instances of fraud or material error and the Balance Sheet and Profit and Loss reports represent fairly the financial position and operations for 2023. (Auditor speak for all is good!)
- Revised Accounts in Quickbooks to facilitate more meaningful financial reports
- Recommended written accounting procedures
- WON is in Compliance with requirements to maintain our 501c(7) Not-for-Profit tax exempt status – Audit Committee researched the federal 501c(7) regulations, Florida Statutes re 501c(7) social clubs, contacted the Florida Division of Corporations, consulted with an independent CPA, and carefully reviewed the IRS Publication Guidance for "501c(7) Social Clubs – What social clubs need to know to qualify for and maintain tax-

Board of Directors and to members that the
Women of Nassau, Inc. social club has in the past,
is currently, and is for future plans, in compliance
with requirements to maintain our 501c(7) notfor-profit tax exempt status.

Website/Registration Improvements

- Webmaster Donna Williams and Treasurer Nancy Gallimore have developed an improved process for payments online.
- Register for luncheons or renew your membership online using your credit or debit card. Due to issues with PayPal, this option has been cancelled and this payment option is no longer available. The new process is easier and has lower transactions fees.

Budget

All monies collected in the past three years for charitable purposes have been donated to the designated charity, therefore all cash currently in our bank account- \$9,672.53 at January 1, 2024 is from membership dues or Ways and Means Committee. The Ways and Means Committee was created last year with the specific purpose of raising funds for WON business operations and member benefits. Charlene Kingsnorth headed up this effort and did an outstanding job in creating events that not only raised significant funds but were very much fun in the process. At the February Board meeting, the Board adopted a budget with the majority of these funds budgeted for WON business operations (more about this in next month's President's Letter) and member benefits. Funds for charitable donations will be raised separately though the Philanthropy Committee fundraising events.

 The 2024 Board of Directors is dedicated to enhancing the value of your membership in WON.
 The Board has created a new officer position, Vice-President for Special Events and Education, to spearhead this initiative. - Recommending written procedures to be added as an addendum to bylaws.

Compliance with tax exempt requirements

 Researched thoroughly by Audit Committeereviewed federal IRS 501c(7) regulations, FL Statutes, FL Div of Corporations, independent CPA, and IRS Guidance Publication "501c(7)

- Social Clubs, What social clubs need to know to qualify for and maintain tax-exempt status
- WON (past, currently, future) is in Compliance with requirements to maintain our 501c(7) Not-for-Profit tax exempt status

Budget for Member Benefits

Cash in bank reported in Jan was \$11,000, but realized that this did not reflect December expenses, so actual beginning cash for January 1, 2024, is \$9,672.

- At the February Board meeting, the Board adopted a budget with the majority of these funds budgeted for WON business operations and member benefits. Funds for charitable donations will be raised separately through Philanthropy Committee fundraising events.
- Four evening social events, planning already in the works by Joy and her Special Events committee.
- Continue Monthly Welcome Coffees current members as well as potential new members are encouraged to attend.
- Other member benefits Soliciting ideas and suggestions – what would you like to see the club do that would add value to your WON membership?
