### Donations

We appreciate all donations, but we would love **new shoes, socks, and underwear** to make available to our students at the Clothes Closet. Our grant does not cover these items and they can be very expensive to buy with donation funds. We would hold on to the new items until August when our families come in to shop for the first day of school.

The Clothes Closet has all sizes, but below are the most needed sizes. The sizes listed are for our middle and high school students for which we usually do not receive many donations.

### Shoes

Men's sizes 6 – 14, Woman's sizes 6-12

### Underwear

Men's boxer briefs -small, medium, large, and x-large  
Women's size 4 -size 10

Our students love hoodies, even in the summer, so those would be a hit as well. We serve all students and their younger siblings, so all sizes are useful. School appropriate clothing for children size 6 to adult large would fit our students from elementary through high school.

Share your creative talents and attend a Barnabas Paint Party at the Amelia Makery! We are taking a group to the Amelia Makery on June 29. We paint the bowls and leave them at the Makery. The paint party begins at 4 pm and we paint until around 6 pm. This is our second year participating in this event. It is part of our philanthropy mission, and it is fun too! The bowls are fired and given to Barnabas. Barnabas selects some of the bowls for auction. The remainder are used for the Barnabas Empty Bowl Luncheon Event held on November 27. Anyone who goes to the lunch event gets to choose a bowl for their lunch and keep it.

### Paint Party Information & Bowl Painting Tips

- Thank you for supporting the Barnabas Center at the Amelia Makery.
- You are welcome to bring drink/light snacks.
  - Please leave your creative station tidied up for the next painter.
  - Upon arrival, notice the "Barnabas Empty Bowls" station inside and feel free to browse the ideas book for inspiration.
  - Amelia Makery staff and Barnabas volunteers will guide you to seating and help you select your bowl and glaze. They will also be happy to answer questions.
  - You can "sketch" your design in pencil; please do not erase the pencil marks. They will burn off while firing in the kiln.
  - Please only use three coats of glaze. Each coat will dry quickly; you can also use the hair dryer at the back of the studio for speed drying.
  - Glaze colors will not stain your clothes or items. They wash out easily with soap and water.
  - Please do NOT glaze the very bottom (outside) of the bowl. We will apply an Empty Bowls/Amelia Makery stamp.
  - All unglazed (blank) parts of a bowl will be white. There is no need to paint the bowl white. A clear glaze will be applied to the entire bowl after you paint/glaze it.
  - A little glaze goes a long way. Please start out with a small amount and refill as needed.
  - Please do NOT include specific names, initials or dates on the bowls. Team names or group names are fine (ex. Cats, FSU, etc.).
  - Please do not mix glaze colors. Rinse your brush in water when switching colors and dry it after rinsing.
  - When you finish painting your bowl, place jars and trays at the sink or the table near the sink; do NOT rinse excess glaze down the drain.

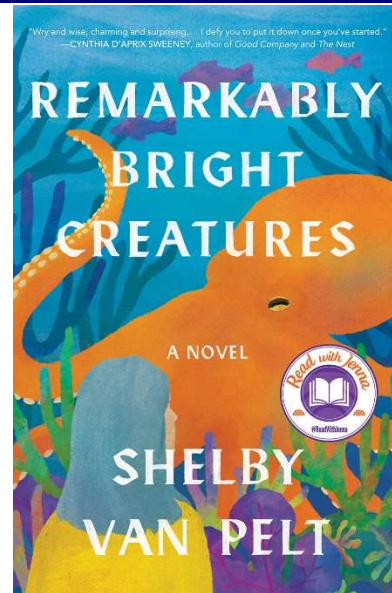

## **Luncheon Program:**

"Families in Transition" (FIT) Program with Mollie Cressey, Nassau County School District's Homeless Liaison.

Mollie Cressey enlightened us about the services offered to school children who are entitled to receive help under the McKinney-Vento Act. This far-reaching program includes providing free clothes, school supplies, food service, academic fee payments, extra-curricular activities, school or sports physicals and shots, and Christmas gifts to eligible children. At this time she has 396 children enrolled in the program.

Volunteering opportunities are numerous for anyone interested, on Monday's at their clothes closet and at various times putting weekend meal packs together as well as other occasions. (If you decide to volunteer, please remember to report your hours to the Philanthropy committee).
