- Office Depot/Max- Will honor one price match per guest if item in question is found in store or online at Staples, Target, Walmart, Best Buy, or Amazon.com
- <u>JCPenney</u>- Will tack on an extra 5% discount for a price match brought to the store's attention within 14 days of purchase.

### Use Your Phone

When in a store, check prices on Amazon's app to see if the store raised a product's price for the back-to-school season. If you find a price difference, order the item from the app on the spot or request a price match instore at their customer service table.
