SOLATION

Who is to condemn? It is Christ Jesus, who died, yes, who was raised, who is at the right hand of God, who indeed intercedes for us. Who will separate us from the love of Christ? Will hardship, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril, or sword? As it is written, "For your sake we are being killed all day long; we are accounted as sheep to be slaughtered." No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor rulers, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord. (Romans 8: 34 - 39).

As the pandemic continues, there are instances where some are isolated from others out of the abundance of caution as well as fear. There is some loneliness for some, a sense of security for others, and a hope that, at some point, something new will happen that will enable all to live life in a more relaxed, and safe environment. Paul wrote these words to encourage the Roman church to feel God's love, that there wasn't anything that could separate us, or isolate us, from God's love. Yet, we challenge that love as we let anger, self-desires, fear and hatred enter into us and then out of us upon others. However, God still loves us, even when we mess up, even when we isolate ourselves from God. God is present for all who call, who call from their hearts. Let us feel the presence of God and we will not feel so isolated in these times and in the times to come.

On Sunday, October 3rd we will celebrate World Communion Sunday. Christians from all over the world will celebrate at the table of Christ, invited to come, wherever we are, and whoever we are. May we, even if in isolation, come to the table together in body, soul and mind and feel, not only God's love, as Paul wrote, one another's love as well. We covenant to love, support, and care for one another and we have been very deeply challenged to do that in this pandemic. God, however, is always in our presence and we are not alone. The Savior of the world is welcoming us to the table of love again this month along with our brothers and sisters in faith. Celebrate that we are not in isolation from God, and all that God has to offer us.

Looking forward to coming to the table together, no matter where we are gathered, and together with our ever-present God.

Noisy Offering for October is: Turning Point of the Lehigh Valley

It's not always easy to tell at the beginning of a relationship if it will become abusive. Abuse can be verbal, physical, emotional, sexual, or financial. Domestic and intimate partner abuse does not discriminate against age, gender, sexual orientation, religion, or economic status.

If you have any questions or need our services, please call our 24/7 Helpline at 610-437-3369. If you have general questions about our agency, its mission and work, please call our administrative offices at 610-797-0530.

How You Can Get Help

Domestic and intimate partner abuse is a pattern of abusive and coercive behaviors including physical, sexual, and psychological attacks, as well as economic coercion that adults or adolescents use against their intimate partners.

Domestic and intimate partner abuse can take many forms, including physical abuse, psychological, emotional, verbal and financial abuse, sexual violence and isolation.

Turning Point staff and volunteers are trained to help victims of all types of domestic and intimate partner abuse.

Does your partner:

Embarrass you with bad names and put downs? Look at you or act in ways that scare you?

Control what you do, who you see or talk to, or where you go?

Stop you from seeing or talking to friends or family?

Take your money or Social Security, make you ask for money, or refuse to give you money?

Make all the decisions? Tell you you're a bad parent, or threaten to take away or hurt your children?

Act like the abuse is no big deal, it's your fault, or even deny doing it?

Destroy your property or threaten to kill your pets? Intimidate you with guns, knives or other weapons?

Shove you, slap you or hit you? Force you to drop charges? Threaten to commit suicide?

Threaten to kill you?

If you answered "yes" to any of the above questions, you may be in an abusive relationship.

October Mission: Neighbors in Need

In 2021, Neighbors in Need "Unfailing Love" offering is focused on supporting organizations and projects that are serving homeless and immigrant neighbors or communities. One-third of NIN funds support the Council for American Indian Ministry (CAIM). Two-thirds of this offering is used by the UCC's Justice and Witness Ministries (JWM) to provide funding grants to UCC churches and organizations leading justice initiatives, advocacy efforts, and direct service projects in their communities.

Most churches collect the offering on October 3, 2021 as part of World Communion Sunday, but contributions can be made at any time. We will be collecting for this offering in the month of October and November.

How is the offering used?

Through this offering we express our deep commitment to reaching out and touching our neighbors with justice and compassion. This allows us to speak prophetically to those in power and to advocate for a society where all people have a voice in decisions that affect their lives. In the spirit of Christ, we will seek to confront evil in the world and to alleviate suffering. We will do this through direct service as well as advocacy.

Where and how are the funds dispersed?

Not only are NIN funds shared with CAIM, they are utilized by staff to develop curated and created social justice resources, i.e. webinars, bible studies, curriculums, advocacy tools, etc. within the program areas of environmental justice, racial justice, LGBTQ justice, economic justice, women's justice, immigration justice, and more. Additionally, a portion of the monies collected are used to fund grants at the following levels and needs:

Direct Service (\$1,000 - \$3,000) – provides funding to meet the immediate needs of an individual or group (i.e. food, clothing, utilities).

Advocacy (\$3,001 - \$5,000) – offers funding to assist communities who wish to change policy on a state or federal level via an advocacy campaign.

Grass Top (\$5,001 - \$10,000) – is a highly competitive tier which seeks to award uniquely innovative programs which can be replicated in other settings.


