# STRENGTH

Then Moses and the Israelites sang this song to the Lord: "I will sing to the Lord, for he has triumphed gloriously; horse and rider he has thrown into the sea. 2**The Lord is my strength and my might**, and he has become my salvation; this is my God, and I will praise him, my father's God, and I will exalt him. (Exodus 15: 1—2, NRSV)

It is better to take refuge in the Lord than to put confidence in princes. 10All nations surrounded me; in the name of the Lord I cut them off! 11They surrounded me, surrounded me on every side; in the name of the Lord I cut them off! 12They surrounded me like bees; they blazed like a fire of thorns; in the name of the Lord I cut them off! 13I was pushed hard, so that I was falling, but the Lord helped me. **14The Lord is my strength and my might**; he has become my salvation. 15There are glad songs of victory in the tents of the righteous: "The right hand of the Lord does valiantly; 16the right hand of the Lord is exalted; the right hand of the Lord does valiantly." 17I shall not die, but I shall live, and recount the deeds of the Lord. 18The Lord has punished me severely, but he did not give me over to death. 19Open to me the gates of righteousness, that I may enter through them and give thanks to the Lord. (Psalm 118: 9—19, NRSV)

**I can do all things through him who strengthens me.** (Philippians 4: 13, NRSV)

Strength is not only about physical strength, it can also be found in people who are mentally and emotionally strong or also spiritually strong. The Hebrew people sang about God's strength after they crossed through the Red Sea with its waters on their right and left sides and the Psalmist echoes that strength in his prayer. When Paul writes to the church at Philippi, he reminds us of where strength comes in those times of weakness and despair. It is Christ who is willing to strengthen us and carry us if needed. Why do we need strength? The journey of life is filled with joys and challenges and we seem to grow very weary when we are weakened and troubled and those are the times when we need God's strength the most. Our churches are evolving in a society and culture that challenges how we react and rely on God. We are bombarded with messages of individualism, exclusivity and power. A Christian relationship requires a far different approach to life and to the people all around us. God does not desire to conquer our lives, God desires to accompany us and to provide the strength we need to overcome and serve in love and compassion.

There are many people who have a strong faith. People who walk in the darkness of mental illness, exclusion, hatred and fear. They rely on a loving God and Savior for their strength. We have been conditioned to rely on no one except ourselves. This will ultimately cause us to fail if we do not call on God for strength and endurance for the journey that is still in front of each one of us. God loves all of us, maybe not all that we do, but God does offer forgiveness if we are strong enough to admit our

We have sent funds and tabs to the Philadelphia Ronald McDonald House and to the Hershey Ronald McDonald House in the past years. This is a small way to make a huge difference in these families' lives. Collection containers are located in the Narthex for your tabs. Thank you!

## **Financial Update**

As we have now received financial information **through July** of this year, we are very comfortable with our current financial situation, even though we are still in an overall deficit position in our General Fund. Here are some of the highlights of our financial year so far. Thank you to everyone for your continued generosity for the ministry and mission of St. Paul's church!

For the year, through July, we have spent **\$7,254 more** than we have received. Our overall deficit is **\$1,035** better than this time last year. There are a few significant factors that are contributing to this as well as expense timing and seasonal challenges we face. **Last year**, at this time, **our deficit was \$8,289. Fuel oil purchases and snow removal costs** are a large portion of the winter season and are weather dependent. **Generosity and receipts through July are \$4,968 less than they were at this time in 2018.**

**We offer our thanks to all of you for your generosity and support for the ministry of Jesus Christ** in our midst, in our community and in the world. Blessings and peace to all as we celebrate God's love for us in Jesus Christ. We are looking forward to getting back to our full schedule and activity levels and for your participation with us. Blessings!

# OUR MISSIONS

Noisy Offering for September is: The Northampton Area Food Bank

## **Our Mission**

The organization is committed to distributing wholesome food, free of charge, to individuals and families who are in need and unable to adequately obtain nourishment with their own resources.

## **Our History**

The Northampton Area Food Bank (NAFB) is a nonprofit, volunteer-driven organization serving residents of the Northampton Area School District and adjacent areas. Formed in 1992 by a group of local churches, NAFB initially helped about 50 families, and functioned out of a very small borrowed building. As years passed, the needs of the community increased, and the Food Bank continued answering the clarion call to assist our neighbors. A new facility was opened in 2007, constructed entirely with funds made possible by the generosity of donors, the contributions of local businesses, and the time and talents of hardworking, dedicated volunteers.

The Northampton Area Food Bank (NAFB) is a nonprofit, volunteer-driven organization serving residents of the Northampton Area School District and adjacent areas. Formed in 1992 by a group of local churches, NAFB initially helped about 50 families, and functioned out of a very small borrowed building. As years passed, the needs of the community increased, and the Food Bank continued answering the clarion call to assist our neighbors. A new facility was opened in 2007, constructed entirely with funds made possible by the generosity of donors, the contributions of local businesses, and the time and talents of hardworking, dedicated volunteers.

The Food Bank presently has over 500 families registered and serves an average of 400-450 families per month – a number that continues to rise. We now offer the Commodity Supplemental Food Program (CSFP) for clients age 60 and older with proof of an income level of 130% of the federal poverty level or below. If they qualify, they receive a monthly box of food which is provided through Second Harvest, in addition to their distribution through our food bank.

To sustain our efforts, to meet the growing needs and to develop innovative programs and additional services, we welcome the community's compassion and ongoing financial support, as well as donations of food throughout the year. The Food Bank is a 501-c-3 charitable organization and all monetary contributions are tax deductible as allowed by the law.

The Northampton Area Food Bank is affiliated with the Northampton Ecumenical Clergy Association, and is also a participating member agency of the Second Harvest Food Bank of Lehigh Valley and Northeast Pennsylvania.

## **Volunteering**

Thank you for your interest in volunteering at the Northampton Area Food Bank. We generally operate our distributions on the first three Thursday evenings from 6-8 pm and on the 2nd and 3rd Saturdays from 9:30 - noon. Our volunteers are asked to report 30-60 minutes earlier than the start of distribution in order to make final preparations. We also pack the orders on the Wednesday or Friday preceding the distribution from 9:30 - noon or until finished.

We are an entirely volunteer driven organization. To volunteer, simply show up - using the back door by the loading dock. 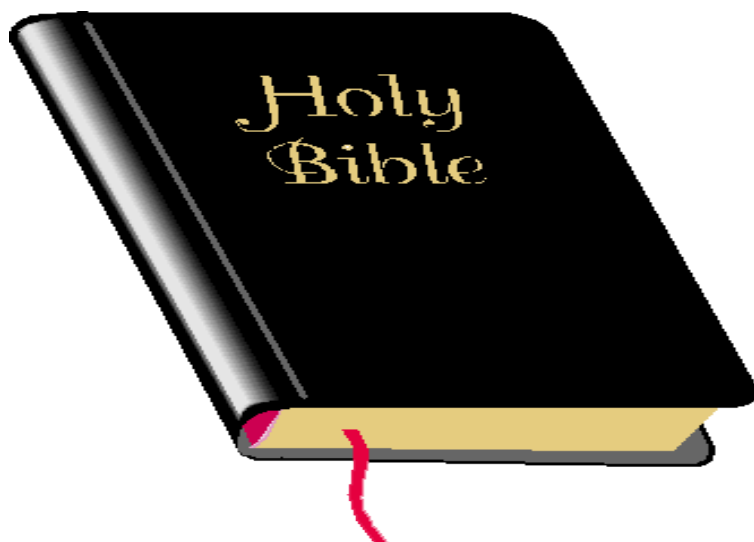

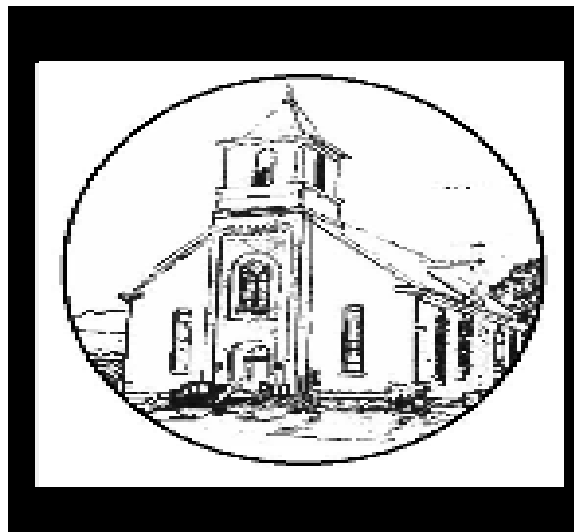
