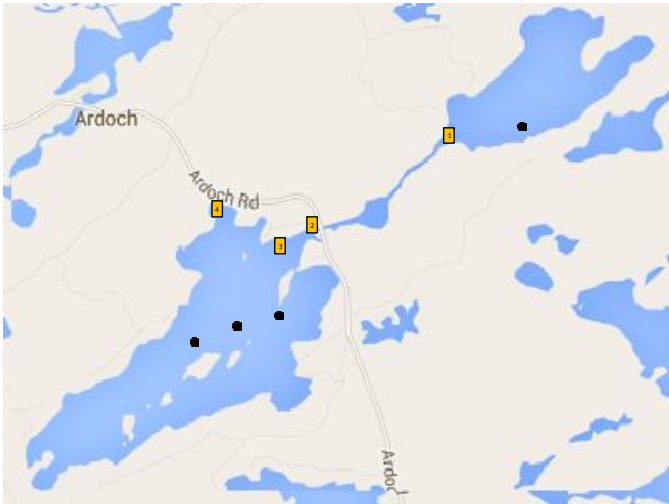

The Malcolm Ardoch Lake Association Fishing Committee has placed navigational buoys to mark shoals where water levels may restrict the use of outboard motors. In boating season four buoys are placed in three key areas on Malcolm Lake and one key shoal on Ardoch Lake.

Other areas of concern are the “no wake zones” on each side of the public landing and through the channel connecting the two lakes. Water flow through the culvert is less than a 1 meter and contains beaver branches and requires boaters to use caution. Each fall we clean the culvert as part of lake clean up focus.

The channel between the two lakes contains many hidden obstacles such as underwater logs; dead heads etc. and require boaters to carefully maneuver and to use extreme caution. It is best to stay in the middle of the channel for the greatest safety.

MALA assumes no risk for boater safety and the responsibility for boater safety is your responsibility

Key Legal Responsibilities

- No wake zone inside 30 m of shorelines
- Don't drink and boat
- Wake damage is your responsibility
- Spotters required for tubing, skiing etc.
- Fish in legal seasons only
- Obey slot sizes and catch limits
- We encourage catch and release

Caution and Courtesy Requirements

- Watch for swimmers anywhere in the lakes
- Respect small boats, kayaks, canoes, etc.
- Avoid high speeds – our lakes are small
- Know the lakes we have many shallow shoals
- Avoid disruption of wildlife
- Avoid disruption of the peace and tranquility
- Respect the diversified needs of our landowners
