## I have Zebra Mussels Now What Do I Do?

- **Prevent** the introduction or spread of invasive mussels to our lakes. It is important for water users to **Clean+ Drain+ Dry** their watercraft and/or equipment (Boat, kayak, etc.) when leaving **any** waterbody, *particularly* an infested waterbody.
- **Inform** other cottagers on the lake and visitors to the lake aware of the invasion.

\*\*Knowledge is key\*\*

• **Eradicate:** Scrape the mussels off your docks, boats, rocks, shoreline walls, etc. Soak the mussels in buckets of at least 2% chlorinated water overnight to kill them; put them in a garbage can and dispose of them away from any sewer or waterway.

FACT: Zebra mussels can survive out of water for up to 18 days in high humidity.

- Add a filter to your water intake lines and foot valves to avoid blockages by mussels inside your pipes.
- Wear water shoes when in water, as the mussels are very sharp and can cut skin.
