The recently approved bond measure means significant changes including disturbing the Japanese Garden that had graced the entrance for the last 25 years.

Hoichi Kurisu, Sherwood, OR, grew up in Hiroshima and saw the Enola Gay fly overhead for the bombing of Hiroshima.

Part of the Garden are propagations of trees that survived the blast so many years ago.

Tricia shared that Interact raised \$3,000 to sponsor ten Kenyan students' education as part of their International Project.

The group arranged a video call with the Kenyan students during the project and got to share culture experiences from across multiple continents.

The students promote Interact within Newberg High with club fairs, launching of Instagram and Facebook presences, word of mouth, and morning announcements.

Meetings are at lunch time every other Tuesday covering what's next and how to help their local and global communities.
