CANDLEMAS

I have an interest in both world and church history, so I found it very fortuitous I would be performing the liturgy on Sunday, February 2 on Candlemas.

Not as often observed these days, Candlemas has a rich history in Christian tradition. 40 days after Christmas, if celebrates Mary and Joseph's trek to Jerusalem, in accordance to old Jewish law, to have Jesus confirmed in the Temple.

Many of us in West Virginia have Scotch-Irish ancestry. Our Celtic pre-Christian ancestors observed a festival this same time of year, the midway point between the Winter Solstice and the Spring Equinox, called Imbolc which translates to something like "milk in the belly", likely referring to when sheep begin to produce milk for their lambs, a vital food source during the lean times in the winter. A time to take stock of provisions, tighten our belts, and wait until spring arrives. 40 Days after Christmas.

Biblically, 40 often symbolizes times of patience or waiting, the 40 years of Moses wandering the deserts, the 40 days and nights of the Great Flood. It is a time to have patience as we wait and look forward to Lententide.

In accordance to the old laws, parents were to bring the offering of a lamb to The Temple, or if they were of meager means, 2 turtledoves. But just as the milk of the lamb sustained our ancestors in this time, Mary brought the ultimate offering to The Temple that first Candlemas, she offered up THE LAMB for the world, our Redeemer and our Sustainer. I just find that connection so profoundly beautiful.

And what else is it today? Another day where we look forward to the light of spring? That's right, Groundhog Day! Even though some Christians no longer observe Candlemas, almost all Americans still wait to hear about old Puxatawny Phil's prediction about winter. So even though it has been transformed, secularized and infused with Americana folklore, the spirit of gathering our stores and waiting for the thaw of spring endures.

As Christmas becomes more secularized, we are often reminded "Jesus is the Reason for the Season", well, he's the reason for this season too! He's the reason for ALL seasons! So I'm glad we're able to gather here today and celebrate together the light from the candle to the sun, the Light of the World.

Nurturing Faith Ideas 2025, based on the Revised Common Lectionary

February 2: Fourth Sunday after Epiphany Read Jeremiah 1:4-10

God chose Jeremiah to be God's messenger, to speak God's word. Though Jeremiah insisted that he was too young and didn't know how, God promised to go with him and give him the words to speak. What has God called you to say about God to others? What excuses keep you from speaking with others about God?

February 9: Fifth Sunday after Epiphany Read Luke 5:1-11

When Jesus called his first disciples, they were washing their nets after a long night of fishing when they caught nothing. Jesus invited them to follow him, and they did so, leaving everything behind them. We, too, have been called to follow Jesus. What did you, might you, have to leave behind to follow?

February 16: Sixth Sunday after Epiphany Read Luke 6:17-19

Crowds of people came to hear Jesus, hoping that he would heal them, and Jesus did so. How has Jesus healed you? How might you help share Jesus' healing ministry this week?

February 23: Seventh Sunday after Epiphany Read Luke 6:27-38

January Session Digest

WORSHIP (W): On January 5, an estimated 61 home and in-person communicants celebrated communion. The next communion will be on February 2. **If you are joining worship at home that day, please**

remember to prepare your elements in advance.

On February 2, at the end of worship, the congregation is invited to celebrate Candlemas. Candlemas is about 40 days after Christmastide. While rooted in Catholicism, it has been used in Reformed worship also. The focus of worship is that congregants bring candles from their homes for blessing, and are blessed as well. We invite the congregation to bring your candles to the front of the Sanctuary for blessing during this part of worship. Candles will be available for all who wish to participate, but do not have candles with them.

As we start 2025, we hope you will make in-person worship a regular part of the start of each week.

ADMINISTRATION & FINANCE (A&F): Rock Lake finished 2024 with a general fund balance of \$73,207. With regard to actual income and spending, you donated about \$9,328 more than was spent in 2024. To date, the Stewardship Task Force reports just over \$96,000 of congregational financial support for 2025. Thank you for your generosity!
