Nurturing Faith Ideas 2025, based on the Revised Common Lectionary

August 3: Eighth Sunday after Pentecost Read Luke 12:13-21

"Take care! Be on your guard against all kinds of greed; for one's life does not consist in the abundance of possessions." Choose some of your money or a possession and give it away to someone who needs it this week. Praise God that you are able to give away some of what you have.

August 10: Ninth Sunday after Pentecost Read Hebrews 11:1-3

Hebrew 11:1 defines faith as the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen. The rest of Hebrews 11 lifts up how faith can be seen in the lives of some of our ancestors in faith. What in our lives lets other know of our faith in God?

August 17: Tenth Sunday after Pentecost Read Hebrews 11:29-12:2

A great cloud of witnesses, people of faith from the time of Abraham to the present surround us, cheering us on as we live our lives of faith. Some of them include parents, grandparents, friends, and neighbors who have nurtured and guided us in our faith. We are not alone on our life's journey. Give thanks for some of the people who have shared the story of Jesus with you. Share their names with a friend of family member.

August 24: Eleventh Sunday after Pentecost Read Luke 13:10-17

How wonderful it was that a woman who had been bent over, unable to stand up straight for eighteen years, at the words of Jesus, could stand again. It's easy to understand why she began praising God! What has God done in your life that you would praise him for? Share with someone and say a prayer of thanks to God.

August 31: Twelfth Sunday after Pentecost Read Luke 14:1, 7-11

Jesus warns his disciples about thinking too highly of themselves and assuming the best places at the party table are for them. He also told them that when they threw a party to invite those who are poor, blind, lame, not their friends and relatives who would invite them in return. What would happen if we followed these instructions? How would your party be different?

July Session Digest

WORSHIP (W): On July 6, the total estimated communicants was 53 (29 in-person & 24 estimated on-line). The next communion will be on August 3. **If you are joining worship**

at home that day, please remember to prepare your elements in advance.

Pam and Marilyn are on vacation August 17 & 24. Patricia will be filling in for Pam on piano those Sundays. Jim Robinson will preach on August 17; Ed Thompson will be preaching on August 24.

We hope you will make in-person worship a priority at the start of each week.

ADMINISTRATION & FINANCE (A&F): The July balance sheet has about \$69,900 in the general account. The budget vs. actual shows a \$2,080 positive balance for June, and a positive June YTD balance of \$20,300.

MISSION & SERVICE (M&S):

PROPERTY (P): Solar Holler is completing the solar panel electrical connection by the end of the month. On July 25, the installers told the clerk that, after the connection is complete, a third-party company will inspect the connection in the following week. Then, in the next 4-6 weeks, the power company will install a two-way meter to allow unneeded power to flow to the electrical grid. During that 4-6 week period, a process called 'zero export' will allow the panels to offset that actual metered usage. On July 28, Solar Holler completed the electrical connection, and put the solar panel system into zero export mode. This operating mode will remain active until the power company installs a two-way meter.

CONGREGATIONAL CARE (CC): The next second Sunday potluck will be August 10. Even if you cannot bring a dish, please remember, the most important ingredient is YOU!

OTHER(O): a. The lease re-negotiation committee (Scott Hamilton, David Broyles, Ken Schmidt) met on June 30 with Pollen8 CEO Cheryl Laws and Hollie McCraw of Appalachian Behavioral Health Care (ABHC) to discuss an ABHC lease extension for the next 5 years. The current lease is \$1,000 per month. Cheryl and Hollie are concerned that, given the change in the federal administration, the financial future of ABHC is very much in question. (This does not endanger Pollen8.) They have approached several larger businesses, only one of whom expressed any interest in having even preliminary discussions. The upshot of the meeting is that the current payment schedule will be continued month-to-month until the future clears. Session needs to be considering what happens if ABHC vacates the Rock Lake Community Life Center.
