

<u>BLUE CHRISTMAS SERVICE</u> – Thursday, December 18 at noon – for many people, the approaching Christmas holiday does not bring with it the joy and happiness that is advertised on television or in greeting cards, you may be facing a holiday after the death of a loved one or after a divorce. Perhaps you have been unable to have a child or have suffered through an emotional trauma or illness or perhaps you feel pressured and overwhelmed by holiday preparations. This service is for you. Christmas Joy Offering JOYFUL SHARING

Did you know? The Christmas Joy Offering has been a cherished Presbyterian tradition since the 1930s.

The Offering distributes gifts equally to the Assistance Program of the Board of Pensions and to Presbyterian-related schools and colleges equipping communities of color.

The Assistance Program provides critical financial support to church workers and their families.

Presbyterian-related schools and colleges provide education and leadership development while nurturing racial and ethnic heritage. This has been a Presbyterian commitment for nearly 140 years.

Envelopes are in the pews for you to make an offering.

This special offering concludes on Sunday, December 21.

IMPORTANT NOTICE!

Donors must deliver checks on or by midnight December 31, 2025 in order to claim a charitable contribution deduction for 2025. Checks that are in the offering during the first worship service in 2026 will not qualify for a charitable contribution deduction in 2025, even if the check was actually written in 2025. However, under the so-called "mailbox exception," checks that are mailed and postmarked in 2025 will be deductible in 2025 though they are not received by the church until 2026. You may give checks or cash directly to the treasurer, place it in the treasurer's box in the office or place in the church's mailbox (Village Drive side of the church). All boxes will be checked after midnight, December 31.

If you are over 75, please consider making a direct transfer for a portion of your Required Minimum Distribution for the year to Rock Lake. This has great tax implications for you. Giving securities (stocks, mutual funds, etc.) that have appreciated in value can be very helpful from a tax standpoint. If you give appreciated securities directly to Rock Lake, you will not have to pay capital gains taxes on them and you will still be able to take a charitable deduction on your income tax return. These are a wonderful way of channeling some of your resources into a work in which you believe. Please contact your financial advisor and church treasurer for further information regarding this form of giving.

2026 STEWARDSHIP UPDATE

As of this writing (December 9, 2025), with 19 families responding, the 2026 total commitment is \$108,680.

Of these families, 13 have increased their commitments from 2025!
