

EVERYWHERE IS JERUSALEM

During the season of Lent we will be offering a study of the book <u>Everywhere is Jerusalem</u> by James Howell. In describing the book, the Amazon website says that it "takes you on a spiritual pilgrimage to significant places in the ongoing story of the Christian faith. You'll go from Bethlehem to Jerusalem, from the Jordan River to Assisi, and from the Sea of Galilee to Montgomery, Alabama. Along the way, you'll discover the profound connections between biblical stories and the places they happened.

You'll see how Christians throughout history have brought their faith to life worldwide, in their own cities and communities. And you'll find God calling you to bring your own faith to life right where you are, right now. Part travelogue, part Bible study, this book will take you on a spiritual journey to the places that are most important in our faith, and you'll discover that the most important place of all is the place where you are, right now."

The book study, led by Ed Thompson, will start on Wednesday, March 12 at 7:00 PM and continue for the next 5 Wednesdays, meeting for about an hour every week and discussing a chapter of the book each time. Copies of the book will be available for purchase through the church before the study begins. There is a sign-up sheet in the hallway outside the sanctuary. The class will be limited to 12 people and if more than would want to attend, we'll add a second time slot.

Ash Wednesday is on March 5th this year.

CANDLEMAS SERVICE CELEBRATED ON FEBRUARY 2



Candlemas has been observed by the Christan Church since the 4th century A.D. It concludes the seasons of Christmastide and Epiphany, and prepares believers to enter into the season of Lent. Biblically (Luke 2:22-40) it marks the Jewish ritual of purification of Mary, required by Jewish Law following childbirth.

Traditionally, church members bring candles from their home to be blessed, and to receive a blessing for themselves and their households. The candles represent Jesus as the Light of the World, and remind us that we, too, are to be a light to the world.

While not widely used, some Roman Catholic and Protestant churches observe Candlemas, including our neighboring congregation downtown, Christ Church United Methodist. And this year Rock Lake Presbyterian Church was also among those congregations that mark this day.

Nurturing Faith Ideas 2025, based on the Revised Common Lectionary

March 2: Transfiguration of the Lord Read Luke 9:28-36

Peter, James, and John had a "mountaintop experience" as they witnessed Jesus' transfiguration, or transformation, and heard a voice from a cloud, God, say, "This is my Son, my Chosen; listen to him!" How do we listen to Jesus today? What might Jesus be saying to you?

March 9: First Sunday in Lent Read Luke 4:1-12

The Gospel reading for the First Sunday in Lent always tells the story of Jesus' temptation in the wilderness. We, too, are tempted like Jesus was, and we have to choose what we are going to do, whether we are going to follow God or follow another. With others around your table or email, share a decision you have made that you think pleased God.

March 16: Second Sunday in Lent Psalm 27

Life isn't always easy. People can be mean. Circumstances can be challenging. We struggle with work or school. We feel like we don't belong, or we aren't important, or we're insignificant. But God is there for us. The psalmist reminds us that God is our light when life seems dark, and God provides us protection, so we don't need to be afraid.

March 23: Third Sunday in Lent Read Isaiah 55:6-9

The season of Lent is a time to reflect on our lives as we prepare for Jesus' death and resurrection. This is a good time to consider where we have failed to be faithful and obedient to God's ways. When we confess our sins, admit our wrongs, we do so without fear for God is gracious and quick to forgive. Is there anything you need to ask forgiveness for? God is ready to hear your prayer.

March 30: Fourth Sunday in Lent Read Luke 15:11b-32

Lost and found. A story of two sons and their father. A story about God who celebrates with joy when the lost are found and seeks out those who've never left to join in the celebration. Who are you most like in the story? Give thanks to God for welcoming all because I suspect we're like both sons at different times.

February Session Digest

WORSHIP (W): On February 2, an estimated 41 home and in-person communicants celebrated communion. The next communion will be on

March 2. If you are joining worship at home that day, please remember to prepare your elements in advance.

Preparations are underway for Ash Wednesday (March 5), Lent, Passion Week, and Easter. **On Ash Wednesday, March 5, there will be a noon service, with ashes being distributed.**

We hope you will make in-person worship a regular part of the start of each week.

ADMINISTRATION & FINANCE (A&F): The balance sheet has about \$74,000 in the general account. In the budget vs. actual, the first quarter insurance payment of over \$4,155 put us in the hole about \$3,000 for January.

In the annual congregational meeting, the 2025 commitment income was reported as \$93,397. Several subsequent commitments raised that number to \$102,237. The anticipated 'Extra Mile' shortfall of \$7,487 has not changed, as the commitment growth caused a reduction in uncommitted giving by the same amount.

CHRISTIAN NURTURE (CN): is trying get the women's circle to start meeting again, and is looking for a project for Easter that the circle could help with.

MISSION & SERVICE (M&S):

PROPERTY (P): There was some flooding in the old preschool during recent rains. The breezeway sump pump was working well, and helped to minimize the water in the basement.

CONGREGATIONAL CARE (CC): The next second Sunday potluck will be March 9 following worship. See you there!

OTHER(O): Session approved a project to install solar panels on the church roof. The vendor will be Solar Holler. The project cost before rebates will be \$113,600, at a 7% interest rate. The amount to finance after Solar Renewable Energy Credits (SRECs) are sold back to Solar Holler will be \$93,950. After various federal rebates are applied in the spring of 2026, the net system cost will drop to \$39,200. RLPC anticipates the payback period will be 5 to 7 years. Solar panels will be installed on roofing facing the courtyard. Solar Holler has inspected the church electrical installation, and foresees no issues connecting the solar panel array. We anticipate that energy cost savings could also be diverted to paying down the loan.
