### Nurturing Faith Ideas 2025, based on the Revised Common Lectionary

### October 5: Seventeenth Sunday after Pentecost/World Communion Sunday Read Lamentations 3:9-16

Life isn't always easy. There are times that we struggle and watch those around us struggle. Yet, even in the midst of the struggles we have reason to hope – God's love is always with us; God's grace never comes to an end. Sure as the sun rises, God is with us.

### October 12: Eighteenth Sunday after Pentecost Read Jeremiah 29:4-7

Jeremiah insists that God's people living in exile look around, get to know the people and place where they are living, and contribute to its well-being. This week, look around and notice what is going on with other people in your family, neighbors, class, team... Pray for these people and do something this week that might make someone's life better.

### October 19: Nineteenth Sunday after Pentecost Read 2 Timothy 3:14-17

Consider your Bible, the sacred writings of Christians and the Church. Does your Bible look well-used or brand new? How has it become a part of you? If the book itself fell completely apart, would you have some of it hidden inside you? This week read Psalm 91, verses 1-6 and 14-16 three times each day and memorize it to hide it inside you.

### October 26: Twentieth Sunday after Pentecost Read Joel 2:23-32

Dreams are possibilities and ideas about what could be. Martin Luther King's "I Have a Dream" speech illustrates the importance of a dream in shaping life for both individuals and communities. According to Joel, such dreams are gifts from God and therefore should be worked with and valued. What is a dream that you have for your own life and for the life of the world?

The great surprise of the Hebrew scriptures is revealed in Isaiah 35:1-2:

### **September Session Digest**

**WORSHIP (W):** On September 7, the total estimated communicants was 76 (31 in-person & 45 estimated on-line). The next communion will be on October 5. **If you are worshiping from home that day,** 

please remember to prepare your elements in advance.

The committee are working on the final quarter of 2025 worship, and the first quarter of 2026.

The next worship committee event is the Blessing of the Animals on October 4. Posters have been snail-mailed to local veterinarians, pet hospitals, pet supply stores, and large stores with pet departments. Shayn Davis and Taylor Bailey will help setup and tear-down for that service. 36 copies of a booklet, 'The Spiritual Wisdom of Pets', have been purchased to be handed out at the service.

We hope you will make in-person worship a priority at the start of each week.

**ADMINISTRATION & FINANCE (A&F):** The balance sheet shows a general account balance of \$78,723; the budget vs. actual was positive for August by about \$8,200; The YTD positive balance is about \$19,300.

The A&F met on September 16, covering the following items:

- a. With the larger balance in the general fund, we are considering transferring \$25,000-30,000 to a better interest-generating account.
- b. We are considering changing banks, from Chase to City National Bank. In recent years, Chase seems to have refocused on large scale businesses.
- c. The current treasurer, Mary Wagner, will be retiring at year-end, and has been working with a person to replace her.
- d. We hope to transition financials from Quickbooks to PowerChurch Plus (PCP) by the end of 2025. Quickbooks is becoming a very expensive subscription-only option, and the PCP finance module is fully integrated into the software we already use.

This year's stewardship campaign, 'Journey to Generosity, the Way of Jesus', will begin on November 2, with Ken Schmidt's message. The campaign will conclude on November 23, with a commitment card collection liturgy. A campaign letter, commitment card, and return envelope will be snail-mailed early in the third week of October.

The Nominating Committee is still seeking a session nominee to complete the slate of two session nominees and one nominating committee nominee.

**CHRISTIAN NURTURE (CN):** The women's circle will be collecting pet supplies in November for donation.

In December, the group will be assembling gifts for shut-ins.

The circle is trying each month to collect cookies to give to the NA and AA groups, with invitations to worship.

Finally, the Bridgeview Bag Project has started back up for the fall school season.

**MISSION & SERVICE (M&S):** The Peace & Global Witness offering will be on World Communion Sunday, October 5.

**PROPERTY (P):** The solar panels are producing electricity for our use, with excess being sold back to the grid.

A broken fan switch on the preschool furnace has been repaired. Church yard shrubbery has been trimmed.

**CONGREGATIONAL CARE (CC):** The next second Sunday potluck will be October 12. About 21 were at the last 'sweet' potluck. Even if you cannot bring a dish on the 12<sup>th</sup>, please remember, the most important ingredient is YOU!

**OTHER(O):** a. The session is considering proposed anti-racism and anti-harassment policies. The final review and vote on these policies will be scheduled for the October meeting.

- b. The clerk notes that the pastor search committee will interview potential pastoral leaders as they are identified. Sallie Daugherty has declined such invitation, but has agreed to preach at the first Sundays in January, February, and March, 2026. Her name will be submitted along with others filling the pulpit in the first quarter of 2026.
- c. The session, as the corporation trustees, signed a warranty deed conveying RLPC properties from the unincorporated entity to the corporation on September 11. Copies of the deed will be placed in the clerk's file and in the office vault.
- d. The church financial general account audit is complete. The remaining accounts are yet to be scheduled before year-end.
- e. The session approved the Presbytery of West Virginia 2026 shared mission request of \$2,700, and the per capita request of \$2,772.
