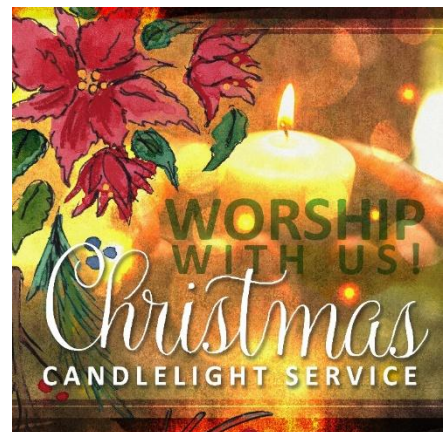

Nurturing Faith Ideas 2025, based on the Revised Common Lectionary

December 7: Second Sunday of Advent *Read Matthew 3:1-2*

As John the Baptist was sent to prepare the way for Jesus, so must we prepare ourselves for Jesus. This is a time of hope and preparation. During Advent, reflect on what preparations you are making in your life and in your heart for the coming of Jesus.

December 14: Third Sunday of Advent *Read Luke 1:46b-55*

When the angel Gabriel visited Mary to tell her that God had chosen her to be the mother of God's son, Gabriel also told Mary that her relative Elizabeth, who was up in years, was also pregnant. After Mary greeted Elizabeth, she sang praise to God for what God was doing in her and in the world. In her words she proclaimed that God was turning the world upside down. What do you see that God is doing in the world today that is changing the world? Share with a friend or family member.

December 21: Fourth Sunday of Advent *Read Matthew 1:18-25*

Luke's gospel tells Mary's story; Matthew's gospel focused on Joseph. When Joseph found out that his fiancée, Mary, was pregnant and he wasn't the father, legally, he could have sent her away in humiliation and shame or even had her killed. As he considered his options, he had a visit by an angel who told him in a dream that Mary had been chosen to bear God's son. Trusting God, he went ahead with his marriage to Mary. What's a hard decision you've had to trust God as you've made it? What did you do?

December 28: First Sunday of Christmas Read Matthew 2:13-15

King Herod wanted to hear back from the magi after they'd found the child they sought. He said he wanted to worship him as they did. But he was lying; he really wanted to get rid of him. Jesus was warned in a dream to take his family and flee to Egypt to keep Jesus safe. Many others have also had to flee from their home because it was no longer safe there. Pray for those who look for a safe place to live and raise a family in our time.

ROSEMARY

The rosemary plant became connected with the Virgin Mary, and folklore developed that it was Mary's favorite plant. Along with its popularity and connection to Mary was the belief that it could protect you from evil spirits. Perhaps this association is not far off as rosemary has antioxidant properties and can help boost the immune system, making us more able to fight off harmful substances in our bodies, perhaps an apt metaphor

for also fortifying us to work to eliminate harmful things in our world.

It is also sometimes called the friendship plant and it was the most common garnish at Christmas meals in the Middle ages. It is also known as the remembrance herb, used at Christmas to remember the birth of Jesus.

In the late 1700's, a special Christmas Rosemary Service was started in Ripon Cathedral School where a red apple, with a sprig of Rosemary in the top of it, was sold by the school boys to the members of the congregation.

Throughout the week, take some time to enter into “quiet joy” and contemplate these questions in Prayer:

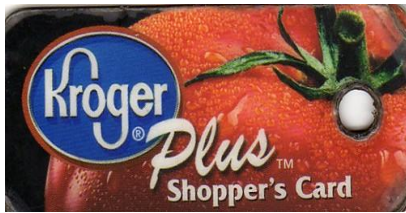
How can we personally tap into the strength of ever-present, God-given joy, especially in the midst of difficulty?

**IMPORTANT NOTICE!**

Donors must deliver checks on or by midnight December 31, 2025 in order to claim a charitable contribution deduction for 2025. Checks that are in the offering during the first worship service in 2026 will not qualify for a charitable contribution deduction in 2025, even if the check was actually written in 2025. However, under the so-called "mailbox exception," checks that are mailed and postmarked in 2025 will be deductible in 2025 though they are not received by the church until 2026. You may give checks or cash directly to the treasurer, place it in the treasurer's box in the office or place in the church's mailbox (Village Drive side of the church). All boxes will be checked after midnight, December 31.

ADMINISTRATION & FINANCE (A&F): The October Budget vs. Actual, is about \$1,700 negative for the month; but YTD, RLPC is almost \$17,000 positive. On the Balance Sheet, the City National Bank account has about \$4,000, while the general account has about \$78,000.

The nominating committee has filled the class of 2028 slate of two session nominees and one nominating committee nominee.

PROPERTY (P): Several repairs have been made, restoring heating to the sanctuary and office areas.

CONGREGATIONAL CARE (CC): The next second Sunday potluck will be December 14.

OTHER(O): a. In 2026, Taylor Bailey will replace Mary Wagner as Treasurer. Thank you, Mary, for your many years of dedication to this work! b. Pollen8 has asked RLPC to furnish a lease proposal for the next 5 years of ABHC operation. The Administration & Finance Committee has submitted that proposal, increasing the monthly lease payment from \$1,000 to about \$1,300.
